tors appear to be in good shape. In 2011, Red-shouldered Hawk, Bald Eagle, Osprey, and Merlin set all-time county highs. Dickcissel (Figure 3) populations have an interesting cyclic pattern. One reason for the fluctuation from year to year could be related to what's happening on the species' Venezuelan wintering grounds. The variation of the annual bird count date could also be a factor.

Results and observations

The total number of species documented during the 2011 count was 263 (See Table 3), with nearly all of the counties reporting at least 100 species (Figure 4). Statistics including number of miles driven, hours walked, and observers, are included in Table 2. These statistics are important because observer hours can affect the significance of the data gathered. An interesting data set is one that shows the commonality of species through time. Though these data can be difficult to interpret because of different effort each year, one approach is to simply rank how common a species is in a given year and compare that rank to previous years. Red-winged Blackbird (Table 1) was the most abundant species detected for the fifth consecutive year. The 2011 count also appeared to be a very good year for White-crowned Sparrow, which ranked 16 or below in the previous four years, but ranked at No. 8 this year.

No new species for the count were found in 2011. In general there were not many rare species detected. Some exceptions include two Whitewinged Scoters in Cook County. This is only the eighth year in which they


