Obvious in this flight photo of the 2000 Lake Chautauqua Parasitic Jaeger is the large amount of brown on the breast and belly, little contrast between secondaries and upper wing coverts (even weaker in Pomarine, much stronger in Long-tailed), at least three to four all-white outer primary shafts, and sharply pointed central tail feathers, which would appear more rounded in the other two jaeger species.
