billed Cuckoos present on count day (15 of 31) were tallied in Jackson County.

As in the past, observers have been requested to include all reports of Monk Parakeets (none reported this year), Ringed Turtle-Doves (8 reported from Will County), and Eurasian Collared-Doves (1 present in Du Page County) observed so that if and when they are elevated from "exotic" to countable species there will be a documented record of their increasing occurrence and distribution.
