able to keep everyone organized. avoid duplication of coverage, and have the results compiled in a short turn-around time. It was really unusual to see Schuyler County missing from the list this year. [Obviously, those counties with 4 or fewer observers would not appear in this table. As an ongoing plea, I encourage some of you from the wellpopulated counties to participate in one of the more distant counties that could, obviously, benefit from your assistance. (Special thanks to those of you who continue to help in one of these counties and to those of you who made the transition this year.)]

Table 3 provides the usual comparisons of birding efforts in each quarter of the state (south to north identified as AREAS 1 through 4 in Figure 1). In 2004, the average number of party hours was 48.07, about 1 party hour per county less than last year, nearly 4 party hours less than those recorded in 2002, and 6.6 fewer than the record set in 1977.

Table 4 lists the 48 species reported from 90 or more counties. Thirteen (27%) of these were reported in all 101 counties; another 4 (Great Blue Heron, Red-bellied Woodpecker, Brown Thrasher, and Song Sparrow) were found in all but one county. The European Starling, American Crow, Killdeer, Rock Pigeon, Red-headed Woodpecker, Chimney Swift, House Finch, and Purple Martin were missed in 2, 3, 3, 5, 6, 7, 11 and 11 counties, respectively.

Table 5 shows, in descending order, the 20 most commonly reported species. The top ten are pretty much the same year after year with the Red-winged Blackbird nearly always in the top position and the Common Grackle in second. The next eight positions often change, however, this year the starling and robin remained number 3 and 4, respectively, and the Ringbilled Gull dropped from position 5 to number 7; this allowed the House Sparrow and Canada Goose to move up a notch to positions 5 and 6, respectively. The Canada Goose continues to be almost as common
