to be present wherever wetlands occurred. Bald Eagles have staged a major comeback; the first Spring Bird Count report was of a single bird in Williamson County in 1980. Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers were reported in isolated instances much farther south this year than usually expected. And finally, with the first Spring Bird Count record for the Cassin's Vireo and the formal addition of the Trumpeter Swan to the list of countable species, the statewide cumulative Count total now stands at 326. **Species Missed.** As always, several would-have, could-have or should-have been species were missed this year. This is the second consecutive year in which there were no reports of Gray Partridge. Where were the Swainson's Hawks? Neither the Painted Bunting nor Scissor-tailed Flycatcher were findable for the Count this year. Other species that would have enhanced our list include American Avocet, either godwit, several other shorebirds, the KFC Laughing Gull, one or more of the winter gulls, another owl or two, Yellow-bellied and Alder flycatchers (although not expected this year), Nelson's Sharp-tailed Sparrow and Red Crossbill. Of course, on a county by county basis, I'm sure there were species definitely known to be present that were missed — in Union County, for example, I am aware of at least 12 misses including Broad-winged Hawk, Sora, Loggerhead Shrike and Cerulean Warbler.
