may have happened to those two birds? 6) In DuPage County, Bob Fisher indicated that this was the lowest total ever for crows since participation in the Spring Bird Count began (back in 1973), and that there were only 8 observers then in contrast to 108 this year. In regards to the entire state, and noted earlier in this report, the species' current status statewide, at least according to Spring Bird Count numbers, is about 45% of the peak count (set back in 1991), and, that 2005 numbers suggest a once-again increasing population. 7) It's great to welcome the Swainson's Warbler back to the count totals after a lengthy absence (although it was most likely present on the count two years ago in Jackson County): this year it was found in Wabash County - as an "overmigrant", overshooting its best-known nesting locations. 8) The banded male Painted Bunting at East St. Louis had returned to the nesting

site again, but, alas, could not be found on count day. 9) The hoped-for Scissor-tailed Flycatchers that have been nesting near the Big Muddy River on the Union/Jackson County line were not located this year; however, an isolated individual was found in Johnson County. 10) And finally, since no new species were added to the statewide accumulative total this year, that total remains at 324.

Species Missed As mentioned above, two known misses were the Gray Partridge and Painted Bunting. A few other "would-have", "could-have" or "should-have" beens include a scoter, the White-faced Ibis (which was apparently present in St. Clair County), Black-necked Stilt, American Avocet, and Shorteared Owl. Of course, the list could go on-and-on if we considered all the species that have ever been reported on past counts.

Table 8 provides all the County Statistics. The columns are: 1) the county name; 2) the AREA (1, 2, 3 or 4) of the state in which the county occurs; 3) the number of confirmed species identified; 4) the number of countable birds reported; 5) the number of participating birders in the county; 6) the number of parties counting birds; 7) the earliest and latest birding times (in the 24hour system with owling hours before and/or after daylight hours marked with an asterisk "\*"); 8) the number of party miles walked (W) and driven (D); 9) the number of party hours walked (W) and driven (D); and 10) the 2005 county compiler/coordinator [or, if in brackets, the person last known to be responsible for being the county compiler/coordinator].

For a handful of counties, the number of species listed in Table 8 may be one or two fewer than originally submitted because the docu-
