The passerine migration was generally slow and late, with few surprises other than a large number of late departure dates. Indeed, the near-absence of vagrant songbirds was among the most disappointing aspects of the spring. The most noteworthy among the few documentations of passerines received was an uncooperative Western Tanager.

Most observers reported warblers in normal to low numbers, although Doug Stotz of Chicago's Field Museum tallied an impressive passage at Thatcher Woods in River Forest on 17 May. Sparrow highlights included another strong showing by Clay-coloreds and record numbers of Lincoln's Sparrows. It was not a flight-year for winter finches.

Other rarities include Illinois' third White-tailed Kite (see seasonal highlight), the first Purple Gallinule (see seasonal highlight) in a decade, and an extremely early **Black-necked Stilt** in the north.

The foundation of this summary is the detailed information on migration limits and populations as submitted directly to the compiler (or indirectly via the Illinois Department of Natural Resources) by field observers statewide. Information not submitted is not included. For example, reports communicated to local coordinators of taped bird-alerts, reports posted on e-mail, and reports transmitted by word of mouth to another observer are generally lacking here.

Our sincere thanks is extended to the following observers, who supplied all the data for the summary. These observers are credited by their initials following each record. For observers sharing the same initials, we have included either a middle initial or a distinctive second letter in the last name for each citation, thereby eliminating ambiguity. As in previous reports, the sequencing of observers below is based on alphabetization of initials or citation forms rather than on alphabetization of last names.
