A few species engaged in such poor passages as to draw attention. Among the worst shows of the season were Broadwinged Hawk, Philadelphia Vireo, Gray-cheeked Thrush, Golden-winged Warbler, Bay-breasted Warbler, and—most surprisingly—White-throated Sparrow. Within their limited range in Illinois, Blue Grosbeaks were also disturbingly low. Although this was not a flight year for winter finches, even the more reliable migrants—Purple Finch and Pine Siskin—were conspicuous in their near-absence.

The foundation of this summary is the detailed information on migration limits and populations as submitted directly to the compiler (or indirectly via the Illinois Department of Natural Resources) by field observers across the state. Information not submitted is not included. For example, reports communicated to local coordinators of taped bird-alerts, reports posted on email, and reports transmitted by word of mouth to another observer are generally wanting here. Migration limits and maximum counts are provided, where available, from each of the three subsections of Illinois—North, Central and South—as mapped out in Bohlen's (1978) Annotated Check-list of the Birds of Illinois. Additional data are sometimes noted for species and areas of special interest.
