Emil Martinec photographed the successful breeding of Redheaded Woodpeckers at Plum Creek Forest Preserve, Cook County. He was able to catch the young poking its head out of the hole, as well as a parent feeding the young. In a 2007 June report, the National Audubon Society named the Red-headed Woodpecker as one of the top five declining common birds of Illinois.
