Observers reported staggering numbers of shorebirds at the traditional Illinois River spots. Lake Chautauqua National Wildlife Refuge, in particular, was teeming with shorebirds. Unfortunately, the physical characteristics of the lake (very soft silt) and high vegetation made shorebirding challenging; many birds were hidden in weeds or seen at a great distance. Nevertheless, most expected species were found, often in high numbers.
