

Jackson Park: worst migration ever?

During the spring 2006 migration, I heard occasional grumbings about the poor numbers and diversity of birds at Chicago's Jackson Park, including epithets like "worst migration ever." It seemed worth investigating how much truth lay in such visceral assessments, so I compared the 2006 season with the data I had compiled for the preceding 12 springs at this site. The comparisons revealed that 2006 really and truly was the worst spring migration here within this time frame.

As of 31 May 2006, I had record of 182 species for the year in Jackson Park. This is 20 species short of the average year-to-date total and nine species short of the worst previous year. Indeed, the 12-year average date for attaining 182 species happens early in the peak of migration, on 9 May. Moreover, no dates showed the wondrous influxes in diversity that make spring migration so fun; the greatest one-day tally of first-of-year birds, 28 April, yielded only nine new species, marking the first spring that did not include double-digit first-of-year arrivals on at least one date.

If there were any great days or avian fall-outs during the 2006 season, I missed them (as did everyone else from whom I gathered local data). Jackson Park is one of those magical small sites (barely one square mile) where one might reasonably expect to encounter more than 100 species in a single day in spring without ever getting in a car. On four dates over the past 12 years, composite counts have exceeded

120 species in a day, with a record high of 128 species on 4 May 1996. The 100-species mark was missed in two preceding years (2001 and 2002), by three species in both years. But 2006 showed lower one-day species totals than any other spring, peaking at only 91 species on 3 May. The average one-day high count for the preceding 12 years is 110 species.

It will sometimes happen that a less common species is missed entirely in a given year, but this spring a total of eight species (American Wigeon, Ring-necked Duck, Wilson's Snipe, Forster's Tern, Philadelphia Vireo, Sedge Wren, Hooded Warbler, and Grasshopper Sparrow) went undetected that had been recorded in each of the preceding 12 years. In addition, Black-billed Cuckoo went unrecorded until 16 June. Four additional species (Ruddy Turnstone, Sanderling, Red-bellied Woodpecker, and Cerulean Warbler) that had been found in all but one or two years were also wanting the spring of 2006.



This spring a total of eight species (American Wigeon, Ring-necked Duck, Wilson's Snipe, Forster's Tern, Philadelphia Vireo, Sedge Wren, Hooded Warbler, and Grasshopper Sparrow) went undetected.

Since Jackson Park is primarily a showcase for migrant passerines, I assembled data on high counts for migratory passerine species that had been recorded in all of the preceding 12 years and compared these data with the 2006 season. Among the 97 species of migrant passerines of annual occurrence, 84% showed below-average high counts in 2006; 55% had high counts that fared no better than half their 12-year average highs; and 42% set or tied their worst-ever high counts. The worst showings were for Palm Warbler and Blue Jay, both of which are conspicuous species that normally peak at a few score birds or more, but this spring logged in at 88% and 87%, respectively, below average. Other passerines appearing at 75% or below their average numbers were Gray-cheeked Thrush, Bay-breasted Warbler, Common Grackle, Least Flycatcher, Swamp Sparrow, and Red-winged Blackbird.

No species attained new Jackson Park high counts in the spring of 2006, but Purple Martin set a new

spring high. This, however, was not due to a strong migratory movement, but rather to a growing breeding population following the erection of martin houses in 2002. Overall, only 16 of the 97 species of annual passerines met or bettered their 12-year average high counts.

Despite the weak turnout of birds, migration dates were fairly typical for the season overall, although late stragglers were notably few. I had previously calculated the 25-year average arrival and departure dates for the 97 annual passerines for the years 1979-2004. The composite 2006 average arrival works out to precisely the same date as the 25-year average, while the 2006 departure falls three days short of average.

Just why the 2006 spring migration was so terrible at Jackson Park is open to speculation, but it does not appear that weather patterns were much at fault (see Travis Mahan's overview in this issue's Field Notes). I wrote in my daily log of 12 April, "A disturbingly disap-

pointing day under blustery SSW winds to 28 mph; no arrivals; no passage worth mentioning of robins or blackbirds." Similarly, on 24 April, I noted, "Continued painfully dull for late April, despite light WSW winds;" and I boldfaced comments in my log for 24 May: "...inexplicable dearth of thrushes and warblers under mild weather and SW winds." Let us hope that 2006 remains the worst spring here for years to come.

MacGillivray's Warbler in Kane County: second state record

Sometimes having no plan is the best plan. I had spent numerous mornings during May of 2006 birding local migrant traps with limited success. My personal sightings consisted of both low migrant numbers and relatively little species diversity. I wasn't sure if this was due to weather patterns or my bad luck, but I knew time for this spring migration was running out.

On the morning of 21 May 2006, I decided to poke around the northern part of Kane County. At the very least, I felt I had a chance to see a Swainson's Hawk in that area. On the way, I ran into a very good pocket of warblers during a few hours at Burnidge Forest Preserve. After a fruitless search for the Swainson's Hawk, I headed out to look for Western Meadowlarks at the local sod farms. Only as I was driving by Hampshire Forest Preserve did I decide to stop for a quick walk.

Hampshire Forest Preserve was loaded with birds that morning. Thrushes and flycatchers were particularly numerous. After an hour I had completed a circle and was headed back to my car. At the last trail intersection I stopped to look through a pocket of warblers moving through the low shrubs along the path. After a couple of minutes, a small *Oporornis* warbler popped up onto the branch of a pine tree about 15 feet away. It was initially viewed head on and I thought I was looking at another Mourning Warbler (*Oporornis philadelphia*). Then the bird turned and showed off its prominent white eye arcs. I immediately began to register all the field marks I could on the bird.

Thinking that I was possibly looking at a MacGillivray's Warbler (*O. tolmei*), I was careful in my observation. The most obvious feature was the white eye arcs. These were thick white crescents above and below the eye. They did not connect in a continuous ring. The bird possessed very dark lores between the eye and bill. A gray hood encircled the head of the bird and a black bib was present on the front. The rest of the plumage was yellow below and olive/yellow on the back. The tail appeared relatively long. After about 10 minutes, the bird flew across the path and I lost it.

Upon reaching the car, I took field notes and consulted the field guides I had with me. I also did further research when I arrived home. Though separating a MacGillivray's from an aberrant Mourning Warbler can be tricky, I had no doubt that the bird I had seen was a male MacGillivray's Warbler.

I posted the bird to the Illinois birding list that night. The next day, several people were able to relocate the bird. Though elusive, it was observed throughout the course of the day. By 23 May, the bird was gone.

After researching MacGillivray's Warbler records for Illinois, it appears that this may be the only live bird recorded for the state. The only previous record for Illinois was a specimen from Lewiston in Fulton County in May of 1915, originally misidentified as a Mourning Warbler (See Binford and DeSante 1993 and IORC 1915:001). I was not able to find any other accepted records for Illinois. There are also very few mentions of any other possible sightings in any literature that I could find.

This species breeds throughout much of western North America and winters from northern Mexico south to Panama. It migrates east casually to Minnesota, Missouri and Louisiana (DeSante and Pyle 1986).

Ironically, the weather feature that may have been responsible for a slow migration could also have contributed to the presence of the MacGillivray's Warbler. For most of May 2006, a low pressure system was anchored on top of the Chicago region (WGN Web site). West winds which were in place south of northeastern Illinois could have deflected numerous migrants further east than normal. The winds could also have dragged a vagabond western migrant, such as the MacGillivray's, eastward. It is also interesting to note that several MacGillivray's Warblers were seen further east than normal along the Texas coast (personal observation, TX listserve) during the 2006 migration. It's possible that a bird in this situation could have been deposited in northern Illinois with the southwest winds of 20 May.



Yellow-throated Warbler: at Vermilion County Feeder

I witnessed a Yellow-throated Warbler (*Dendroica dominica*) at a backyard feeder on 10 April 2006. This species is the earliest of wood warblers to return to my yard each year, and it usually nests in one of several large sycamore trees along the river on the property.

On that day, I went out to fill feeders and heard the warbler singing directly overhead in a sycamore. As I was putting seed into one of the tube feeders, the warbler landed just a few feet from me on another feeder, which contained sunflower hearts. The bird reached and grabbed a seed, then flew off. I finished filling the other feeders and retreated to the house, where I watched from a window for several minutes. During that time, the warbler did not return. I made a note in my journal thinking it would be a one-time occurrence.

Exactly one week later, on 17 April, this “unique” event was repeated. Once again, the warbler was singing directly overhead, then landed on the same feeder and took a sunflower heart and flew away. I did not see it return for subsequent seeds.

I have lived at this location along the Little Vermilion River at the south edge of Georgetown, Illinois (Vermilion County) since 1977, and have fed birds all those years. The Yellow-throated Warbler has been a backyard bird each spring and summer, but these were the first observations I’ve had of one taking seeds at my feeding station in 20 years.

Selected instances of Yellow-throated Warblers at feeders

Marilyn Campbell’s report on a Yellow-throated Warbler (*Dendroica dominica*) visiting her sunflower feeder in April 2006 led me to do a quick search of other similar reports. In Bent (1953), Alexander Sprunt, Jr. wrote: “Food of the yellow-throated warbler has apparently not been well investigated. Little appears in the literature, an illustration of the need to learn more of the diet of small, woodland birds. Records of the examination of seven stomachs reveal that insects compose most of its diet ... beetles, moths and their larvae, flies, bugs, grasshoppers, grouse locusts, crick-

ets, scale insects, and spiders are included in the food.” No mention was made of this bird eating seeds. In addition, Hall (1996) makes no mention of the Yellow-throated Warbler eating seeds or visiting feeders. Yellow-throated Warblers will come to feeders in winter, especially for suet, when north of their normal wintering range (pers. comm. S. Bailey), but Campbell’s report above and one below are from the regular spring/breeding range.

Here are several incidences indicating Yellow-throated Warblers do visit feeders and may eat sunflower seeds.

- June Osborne (2006) who leads birding walks at Neal’s Lodges and sets up bird-feeding stations along the spring-fed Frio River in Concan, Texas, made this observation 15 April 2006: “At the Cattle Guard this morning, a Yellow-throated Warbler surprised us by going to the sunflower feeder. It looked as if it were getting seeds! But warblers are not supposed to eat seeds, right? If it wasn’t eating them, it surely fooled us! Perhaps it was finding insects there, or maybe it had not read the book.”

Note that in fall and winter, some warblers including Yellow-

rumped and Pine Warblers do eat seeds as well as berries. Osborne's statement that warblers are not supposed to eat seeds is not accurate. (See Rodewald et al. 1999, Bent 1953).

- J. Epler (1994) observed a Yellow-throated Warbler feeding on unhulled sunflower seeds at a Wakulla feeder throughout January 1994 in Florida.

- Vincent Schippa (2000) observed a Yellow-throated Warbler at a feeder 3 December 2000 at East Northport, Suffolk County, N.Y. The warbler was last seen 27 December 2000; it is unknown what type of feeder the warbler visited.

In Memory: Juvenile Whooping Cranes

Birders were saddened to learn of the loss of the 17 juvenile Whooping Cranes from Whooping Crane Eastern Partnership (WCEP) 2006 Ultra-light led migration. The young birds died at their pen on the Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge as a result of the violent storms that swept through Florida during the evening and early morning of 1 February and 2 Feb 2007.

Fortunately, one of the 18 birds in that group escaped the storm and is now doing well in habitats inland. Other survivors from the 2006 release group include three young whooping cranes that were part of WCEP's methods of direct autumn release (DAR). DAR birds are released to adult cranes on the breeding grounds in early fall; the older birds lead the chicks south on migration.

Illinois birders have been witnessing migration of banded adult Whooping Cranes the past several years due to federal and other efforts to keep this species from becoming extinct.

Gary Cole was able to photograph two cranes in spring in Illinois last season. Here's his story:




“On 15 April 2006 I learned that a pair of Whooping Cranes had been seen southwest of Lake Charleston near the Embarras River in Coles County.

I visited the site meeting other birders and sure enough they were there. It began to rain so we left, but the next morning (Easter Sunday) I returned and they were still there. I had the good luck to photograph them and also hear their loud bugling calls.”

Yard Birds

Reflections on backyard birding throughout Illinois

Ornithologists and avian ecologists are developing an ever-increasing body of evidence that demonstrates many migratory bird species are superior navigators, able to fly back to exactly the same patch in the spring to nest and raise their young, then travel back to the identical location in the tropics in the fall, to winter over and rest up for their next journey north.

As I write this column, Karen, my wife, is looking out our dining room window, making notes, counting our winter bird visitors for Cornell's Feederwatch program. During our lunchtime conversation, we speculate about site fidelity among all these birds. How do these winter feeder birds first find our yard? Where did they come from? And how do migratory visitors like juncos find us from one year to the next – if in fact they actually do return?

We believe many of the same birds come back year after year, surviving the rigors of migration and returning to our yard and feeders. We certainly provide a reliable food source (you just need to look at our annual bird seed bills to know that!). We're fortunate to have a yard that provides shelter and a source of water, from a heated birdbath and the tiny creek meandering along the back edge of our yard. That still

doesn't answer the question of how they found us in the first place. Is there a bird grapevine that spreads the word? Or perhaps a marker somewhere on our property, signaling to avian flyovers that it's safe to stop here (like those who rode the rails during the Great Depression used chalk marks to identify homes where the owners were friendly, providing food and shelter in return for work)? Probably not. More likely it's just the noise and activity of our local, resident birds that gets the attention of the more nomadic winter migrants.

Ornithologists and avian ecologists are developing an ever-increasing body of evidence that demonstrates many migratory bird species are superior navigators, able to fly back to exactly the same patch in the spring to nest and raise their young, then travel back to the identical location in the tropics in the fall, to winter over and rest up for their next

journey north. Adding to their navigation skills, some species are also proving to have considerable adaptability and flexibility in their choice of a destination. Consider the steadily increasing number of Western hummingbirds who now choose to winter where feeders and blossoming plants are being provided in some of the Southeastern states. That adaptability, coupled with those navigation skills, may be a key element in a species' long-term survival, as man's works continue to massively alter our natural landscape.

We ourselves experienced what we believe were examples of winter-feeding site fidelity and adaptability, a couple of years ago. A Hermit Thrush appeared and began eating the sunflower chips below one of our feeders in mid-November. This was a first! We had never before had this thrush species as a regular feeder bird. After eating the chips,

he/she would hop up on our heated birdbath and take a few sips of water.

We kept expecting the bird to disappear, but the days passed, and the thrush came every day. The weather grew colder, and the thrush's daily visits increased. Karen, knowing thrushes eat berries, decided to provide another food source. She soaked raisins in warm water to plump them. First she just spread the soaked raisins among the chips on the ground, but our resident squirrels quickly scarfed them up, bullying the thrush out of the way. So she began spreading them on top of the squirrel baffle protecting the feeder above. The thrush caught on immediately and would fly directly to the baffle and eat the raisins. If the baffle was empty, the bird would land and look up at our dining room window, as if to ask, "Where the heck are my raisins?"

This continued all winter, the bird disappearing in late March as

the first signs of spring began to show. You might ask: This is a good example of adaptability, but what does it have to do with site fidelity? Well, the following November, on a cold day when we were both watching the feeders from our dining room window, a Hermit Thrush flew in and landed directly on the squirrel baffle. Some might say coincidence – we prefer to believe the same bird had returned. But the thrush either had lost its taste for raisins or found a better food source, as it only appeared that one time.


When considering the juncos that visit our yard and feeders every winter, we don't notice atypical behavior, as we had in that one particular thrush. Research, however, on juncos and other sparrow species who breed much farther north, then winter around us, shows them to loyally return to a specific nesting location in the spring, much the same as the longer distance neotropical migrants. But little data exists on winter site fidelity of these nomads. Perhaps they don't need a

site-specific winter home, except in the worst winter weather?

All who feed birds have experienced those warm, sunny midwinter days, when as the snow cover retreats, juncos and other feeder sparrows vanish. They're out in the fields and edges, feeding in a more familiar (to them) environment. Then when the cold returns, they're back, scratching at the ground to unearth bits and pieces of the seed we spread. Their winter patch preference may be those very fields and edges where native seeds are abundant, but they still know how to get to the less desirable, but predictable, feeder seed we provide. A winter banding study conducted over several years might be just what's needed to determine whether that junco busily scratching for seed under a feeder – coming back to a proven food source – is the same bird as last year. Any volunteers from our banders?

The 2006 Illinois Spring Bird Count

The 35th annual statewide Spring Bird Count was conducted on Saturday, 6 May. Weatherwise it was a great day – at least for most of the state; the only known exception was the light showers after 6:30 p.m. in the extreme southern counties. In regards to the day, Arlene Brei (Boone County) provided a fitting comment: “Let’s say an avid birder knows it’s his last day on earth and asks for only one thing before he goes – a perfect birding day. Boone County was gifted with just such a day.” However, she indicated that there was a “down side” to the day as well: “...many of us were literally whining about the lack of warbler species and the fact that, strangely enough, those that were plentiful, particularly Palms, were contrarily 40-50 feet up in the trees, with no wind factor.” And the “down side” was repeated by Jack Armstrong (Winnebago County): “...we had a tough count this year. Very few warblers, thrushes, flycatchers and shorebirds. They either were not here or had flown over us...” and

summed up nicely by Doug Stotz (Bureau County): “...migrant land birds were few and far between during the Spring Bird Count. Later migrating species were poorly represented of course, but in reality so were early migrants. It was clear that migration was delayed, but that early things had mostly gone through—the worst of both worlds.” Despite all this, an excellent number of birds was reported and several new records were set.

With the help of Mike Ward and the Illinois Natural History Survey, we were fully prepared for participation in all 102 counties this year – marking only the third time this goal would have been achieved; as it turned out, the final count was an even 100. [The projected compilers for the two other counties participated elsewhere.] As regularly mentioned, and at least for the present time, the participation goal of all 102 counties is only possible with the support and assistance of several individuals willing to be the “sole” participants in their counties.

This year the seven counties represented by single observers averaged 104 species.

Count day began with early morning temperatures in the low to mid 30s in the northwest (actually freezing in Jo Daviess County) to the upper 40s and low 50s in the south); interestingly, the 55-degree dawn temperatures in Lake & DuPage counties were amongst the highest in the state. Temperatures then peaked in the upper 60s (or barely broke 70) in the north to the upper 60s and lower 70s in the south. Winds were light (mostly less than 10 mph with occasional gusts up to 15 mph) and variable (with no predominate direction, but more reports from the northeast than any other direction). [A northeasterly flow of air would certainly account for the lack of an influx of new migrants.] The sky was overwhelmingly free of clouds (63 counties) for most of the day, and, in some instances, changed to partly cloudy in the afternoon. Only a few counties reported total overcast by late

afternoon or evening and five southern counties reported light drizzles (after 6:30 p.m., but, enough to dampen birding there).

Counters in Clinton, DeKalb, Franklin and Jo Daviess counties began their counts at midnight; counting had begun by 3:00 a.m. in twelve more counties and by 5 a.m. in another 38. Overall, 65 counties recorded at least some pre-dawn owling hours (before 5:30 a.m.). Of the remaining 35 counties, most began at dawn or shortly thereafter; only 14 began as late as 6 a.m. or later and two of these at 8 and 9:30 a.m., respectively. At least 25 counties recorded owling hours after dusk (after 8:30 p.m.) with four continuing as late as 11 p.m. The final tally of statewide owling time was 156 hours.

Table 1 compares the overall Count results with those of the past two years and the record year. This year was not a record-setting year for any of the sixteen listed categories. Even though there was a paucity of migrant land birds on count day, there were only 20,000 fewer birds this year than last year; and with 66 fewer observers this year, the former figure translates into a mere 303 fewer birds for each of those 66 participants. (Aren't you glad to know that?) Another interesting observation, the number of parties on this year's count is precisely one half the number of

Figure 1 is a visual reference to how well we did. The upper number in each county is the number of species reported in the county; the lower number (in parentheses) is the number of observers. Figure 1 makes it easy to compare county results and to identify those counties where more assistance would be welcomed – especially those with four or fewer observers (note Greene and Saline in particular) and fewer than 100 species.



observers. The one high in this table, which ties two previous years, indicates that 80 (80%) of the 100 reporting counties were able to achieve the second goal of the Count—the confirmation of 100 or more species in the county. Looking at the other numbers, some of the gains since last year include the number of participating counties, the number of party miles and hours “walked” (as might be expected with good weather), the number of species in 90 or more counties and the average number of species for all 102 counties (which should be expected with six more participating counties than last year). The modest number of only 261 confirmed species reflects the absence of (or at least the inability to find) several species that are often reported such as rare gulls along Lake Michigan, late-arriving spring migrants (especially flycatchers and shorebirds), and rarer breeding species (Gray Partridge, Swainson’s Hawk, Purple Gallinule, Barn and Short-eared owls, Painted Bunting, and Scissor-tailed Flycatcher). [Please note the “Species Missed” account near the end of this report for more details.]

Table 2 identifies those counties with 150 or more species. Cook County retained the premier position with 186 species (which is 5 fewer than last year); the Black Duck, Merlin, and Le Conte’s Sparrow were the only species attributed solely to Cook County. Lake County, which usually challenges Cook, reported only 172

species, way low for this traditional high-count county; the two Lake County-only species were the Greater Scaup and “white-winged” gull (countable since there were no other white-winged gulls reported). In the other AREA 4 counties DuPage was third with 162 species and followed by Will, LaSalle, Kane, Winnebago and McHenry. Clinton County led the AREA 2 & 3 counties with 165 species; Macon was a very close second with 163. Others included Champaign, Knox, Madison, Brown and Coles. Williamson County led the AREA 1 counties with 164 species and was followed by St. Clair, Union and Massac. Massac’s impressive tally was achieved by a single observer. For the record, another 11 counties provided a confirmed list of 140 to 149 species. The highest species count for a single county remains at 205 (set in 1983).

Table 3 identifies, in descending order, the counties with 20 or more participants. In years past this table included 20 or more counties; however, only 17 qualified in 2006. Cook and DuPage counties continue to field 100 or more participants. After those high counts the number of participants in each county declines sharply. [And, as indicated every year, observers in all of these well-endowed counties are encouraged to become regular participants in one of the less-endowed counties. As the results in the various tables are reviewed, it seems natural that several more records could be established if there were more observers in some of the less-endowed counties. Figure 1 provides an easy reference to determine where more assistance would be useful and there’s been a specific plea for regular assistance in Grundy County. Of course, special thanks to those of you who have already made the transition and stayed true to your new county.]

Table 4 provides the comparisons of birding efforts in each quarter of the state—identified as AREAS 1 through 4 (south to north) in Figure 1. In 2006, the average number of party hours per county was 48.89 (down from 51.81 in 2005).

Table 5 identifies the 51 species reported from 90 (90%) or more of the reporting counties. Only 17 of these species (33%) were reported from all 100 counties; another 8 species (16%) were reported from all but one county. As has become typical, some species such as the Mallard, Rock Pigeon, Chimney Swift, flicker, Purple Martin, Tufted Titmouse, House Wren, Eastern Bluebird, White-throated Sparrow and House Finch escape detection in some of the counties.

Table 6 shows, in descending order, the 20 most commonly reported species. Traditionally, perhaps because it is a conspicuous and easily identifiable species by everyone who counts birds, the Red-winged Blackbird tops this list. The top 10 continue to be pretty much the same year after year; however, in 2006, the American Robin jumped into second place ahead of both the Common Grackle and European Starling. The Canada Goose remains solid in fifth position and was only two birds shy of the record number reported in 2005 (and, this year, is 3400+ more common than the sixth place House Sparrow. Some species that missed the list are the Blue Jay (which failed for the first time—the Mallard beat it out by 57 birds); the crow, now missing for its third consecutive year; and, the Double-crested Cormorant, which came on strong the last 6 years but finished a distant 30th this year. During the Count's 35-year history, 43 species have appeared in the top twenty list. Nine species have made the list only one time.

Table 7 provides the maximum species details for the number of counties reporting the species; the total number of birds of each species reported; and the highest number of each species recorded in a single county (including the county in which that number was recorded.) The 19 species reported from a

single county appear in bold face. Some of the notable single-county records were the Eared Grebe, Glossy Ibis, Piping Plover, Black-necked Stilt, CASSIN'S VIREO, Swainson's Warbler, Spotted Towhee, and Smith's Longspur. Some of the better records for the 10 species reported from only two

counties were Trumpeter Swan (the first year in which this species is fully countable) and Northern Goshawk. Also included in the Table (at the end) are those species that are not officially countable as Illinois species; for this report those species have been identified as "exotics" and, this year, include the Ringed Turtle-Dove and European Goldfinch (the third consecutive year for the latter species).

New Species Records. Table 7 also identifies all new and tied count records for each species. As expected, new records are more difficult to achieve each year and when achieved, they most often surpass the previous record by only a small margin. The 53 new records have been identified by an asterisk (*) in the Table; the 21 tied records, by a pound (#) sign. Had there been participants in all 102 counties the

number of new records would have been even greater. There were 19 new records for the Number of counties reporting the species. Some of the largest or most interesting increases in the number of counties were for: Hooded Merganser (up 9), Wild Turkey (up 6 – not bad for a species that was once extirpated in Illinois), Bald Eagle (up 6), Red-shouldered Hawk (up 3), Eurasian Collared-Dove (up 10 –

how long will it be before it is reported from all 102 counties?), Pileated Woodpecker (up 2 – only 3-4 counties short of 2/3 of the counties), CASSIN'S VIREO (first record), Sedge Wren (up 7), Northern Parula (up 3), and Orchard Oriole (up 6). There were 25 new records for the Total count of birds reported for those species in a single count year. Some of the largest or most interesting new high counts were for: Mute Swan (up 59 birds), Trumpeter Swan (up 2 birds),

Gadwall (up 31 birds), Hooded Merganser (up 58 birds), Wild Turkey (up 132 birds), American White Pelican (up 598 birds, nearly twice as many as the previous high), Great Blue Heron (up 66 birds), Black Vulture (up 46 birds), Bald Eagle (up 60 birds), Red-shouldered Hawk (up 16 birds), King Rail (up 4 birds), Barred Owl (up 34 birds), Eastern Phoebe (up 102 birds), Bell's Vireo (up 17 birds), CASSIN'S VIREO (first record), Fish Crow (up 51 birds), House

Wren (up 187 birds—a considerable jump over the previous 1992 record), Marsh Wren (up 12 birds), Eastern Bluebird (up 617 birds), and Blue-winged Warbler (up 71 birds). There were 9 new records for the Total number of birds reported for those species in a single county. Some of the largest or most interesting records were for: Mute Swan (up 30 birds), American White Pelican (up 240 birds), Black Vulture (up 80 birds – more than tripling the previous high), King

Rail (up 3 birds), Belted Kingfisher (up 6 birds), CASSIN'S VIREO (first record), and Fish Crow (up 60 birds)

Canada Goose numbers have been similar the last two years, and the species is still more common than the Hosue Sparrow. Both the American Crow and Blue Jay numbers remain low – and after what appeared to be the beginning of a comeback from West Nile Virus, perhaps, in 2005 (at least for the Blue Jay). Three numbers declined

once again this year. The number of Red-headed Woodpeckers reported in 2006 is down to only one third the number reported on the Count 30 years ago. Welcome back to the Swainson's Warbler – this time in Alexander County (Ida Domazlicky). Yellow-headed Blackbirds are taking advantage of new opportunities; an excellent example is the 11 birds present in the Putnam County wetlands (Doug Stotz). Peregrine Falcons are now nesting in Peoria (Mike Miller).

Excellent documentary photos were provided for the two Piping Plovers in Clinton County (Dan Kassebaum) and the two Glossy Ibises in St. Clair County (Shawn Clubb). Black Vultures may be expanding their range – they were reported as far north as southern Monroe County this year (Mary Regan). Jackson County nosed out Union County this year (by one bird) for the high count of Mississippi Kites (Rhonda Monroe). Blue-winged Teal seemed

to be present wherever wetlands occurred. Bald Eagles have staged a major comeback; the first Spring Bird Count report was of a single bird in Williamson County in 1980. Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers were reported in isolated instances much farther south this year than usually expected. And finally, with the first Spring Bird Count record for the Cassin's Vireo and the formal addition of the Trumpeter Swan to the list of countable species, the statewide cumulative Count total now stands at 326.

Species Missed. As always, several would-have, could-have or should-have been species were missed this year. This is the second consecutive year in which there were no reports of Gray Partridge. Where were the Swainson's Hawks? Neither the Painted Bunting nor Scissor-tailed Flycatcher were findable for the Count this year. Other species that would have enhanced our list include American Avocet, either godwit, several other shorebirds, the KFC Laughing Gull, one or more of the winter gulls, another

owl or two, Yellow-bellied and Alder flycatchers (although not expected this year), Nelson's Sharp-tailed Sparrow and Red Crossbill. Of course, on a county by county basis, I'm sure there were species definitely known to be present that were missed – in Union County, for example, I am aware of at least 12 misses including Broad-winged Hawk, Sora, Loggerhead Shrike and Cerulean Warbler.

Economic considerations

Birders spend a great deal of time and money in their pursuit of birds. Sports experts now refer to birding as a sport and have recently proclaimed that birding has more active participants than any other sport. With this in mind, I wondered what the Spring Bird Count as a sport might mean in economic terms. I realize it's impossible to get (or give) exact figures, however, I thought it would be fun to at least provide some thought on the matter. In formulating possible economic considerations I felt there were at least three arbitrary standards and designated "values" (and, I'm sure, all are debatable): an "average" value for a person's time — \$18/hour; the price of gasoline (which was nearly \$3 per gallon at the time

of the 2006 Count) or the mileage reimbursement rate for using a vehicle (40 cents per mile); and the cost of food and drink for one day (average of \$16 per person). So, using the above standards and values:

- *1356 participants times an average of \$16 for food/drink consumption = \$21,969
- * an average of 7.3 participation hours per person (1356) times \$18 per hour [7.3 is based 4889 daylight party hours x 2.0 persons per party + 156 nocturnal party hours] = \$178,180
- * 21,248 daylight miles driven times \$0.40 per mile = \$8,500 (or, alternative: about 22,000 miles at 20 miles per gallon times \$3.00 per gallon = \$3,300)

Therefore, based on the above computations, plus the added time and mileage required for everyone to drive to and from the count site, the nocturnal miles (which were not included in the mileage above), compilers time and expenses in preparing for and following up after the count, and other unlisted, but real expenses, the estimated economic input into the 2006 Spring Bird Count may well exceed \$250,000. Now that an economic value has been attempted, perhaps someone can devise a viable system to enhance this concept and provide some bonafide standards and guidelines.

Acknowledgments

It's difficult to think of new ways to acknowledge the dedicated efforts of Spring Count compilers and loyal participants; however, please know that, on behalf of the entire state of Illinois, all of your efforts and dedication are very much appreciated and that the count would not be possible without you. Please accept my most sincere

thanks. Of course, extra thanks to all the county compilers/coordinators (identified in Table 8) for your advance preparations and post count compilations. The results of the 35th Spring Bird Count are now in the record books — thanks, ALL for making this possible. And, let's plan now for a 100% county participation rate in 2007.

Field Notes

The 2006 Spring Migration

Extremely cold temperatures early in December caused much of Illinois' waterways to freeze, but the latter part of the month was much warmer than normal. Unseasonably warm temperatures continued into January, yielding average highs ranging from the low 40s to the mid 50s statewide. While it seems odd to discuss winter weather in a spring report, the abnormal January conditions offered some early migratory movement. Five species of waterfowl were noted as spring migrants beginning mid-January; see Trumpeter Swan, Tundra Swan, Northern Shoveler, Redhead, and Red-breasted Merganser.

Weather throughout February was fairly static, with a few deviations above and below the norm. Strong south winds and above-average temperatures at the beginning of the month initiated migration for several species of waterfowl, Killdeer, American Woodcock, and Horned Lark. Of the 50 species noted as spring arrivals in February, most were encountered during the middle or end of the month, when sustained south winds from a series of low pressure systems provided efficient travel for northbound migrants. These favorable migratory conditions were separated by a severe cold front that passed through from 16-18 February, causing statewide temperatures to plummet into the single digits. Precipitation levels were below normal throughout February, but precipitation in March would compensate for the meager winter hydration.

March temperature fluctuations essentially mirrored those in February. A significant warm front welcomed in the month, producing high temperatures nearing 80°F in southern Illinois. Temperatures then leveled off to about average until another waft of unseasonably warm air pushed through from 8-13 March. Precipitation during this period was high statewide; some locales in southern Illinois received more than 6 inches of rain while spots in northern Illinois recorded nearly 3 inches. These rains were responsible for pushing monthly precipitation totals to about twice the average. A fairly minor warm front passed through the state 15-17 March but yielded little precipitation. The next significant surge of balmy air came through on 30-31 March, again pushing temperatures to well above average. Given the extent of above-average temperatures, it's not surprising that more than 80 species were reported as migrant arrivals in March, including record early arrivals for seven species: Snowy Egret (12 March), Yellow Rail (22 March), Baird's Sandpiper (8 March), Dunlin (18 March), Caspian Tern (27 March), Great Crested Flycatcher (31 March), and Northern Parula (17 March). A significant number of additional early migrant dates in March merited bold-

facing in this summary. The most unusual species noted during the month were Eurasian Wigeon and Burrowing Owl.

April provided more periods of unseasonably warm temperatures. Substantial influxes of warm southerly air occurred on 2 April and 6-7 April. Moderate levels of precipitation accompanied these fronts, with more than an inch being reported in central Illinois during the latter front. Sustained strong winds from the south during mid-April provided the highest temperatures noted for the month. From 13-14 April, temperatures peaked at over 80°F in northern Illinois and near 90°F in the south. For the most part, above-average temperatures continued through to the end of April, and precipitation levels remained rather meager. These prolonged conditions supplied the greatest flow of migrants during April and provided record early arrivals for the following species: Whimbrel (16 April), Common Nighthawk (13 April), Bell's Vireo (21 April), and Painted Bunting (17 April). Many migrants arrived significantly early throughout the month, as indicated by the large number of boldfaced notations in the April data. Other significant reports included several species requiring review by the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (IORC), including Fulvous Whistling-Duck, White Ibis, Crested Caracara, Black Rail, Whooping Crane, and Painted Bunting (as above).

Given the sparseness of south winds during the first half of May, statewide temperatures remained about average through this period; however, a small bout of south winds at the beginning of the month did provide some movement just prior to the statewide Spring Bird Count on 6 May. The first decent smattering of rain came through on 10-11 May during the passage of a minor low pressure system. Days following this event were marked with northwest winds, scattered rain, and cooler temperatures that stalled movement during a historically heavy migratory period. Migration recommenced with the entry of sustained south winds 23-31 May, resultant from a broad warm front that sent temperatures soaring to more than 90°F statewide. Rarities found in May included seven reports requiring IORC review: White-winged Dove (23 May), Cassin's Vireo (6 May), Bewick's Wren (19 May), Kirtland's Warbler (23 May), MacGillivray's Warbler (21-22 May), Lazuli Bunting (14 May), and Great-tailed Grackle (13 May).

At least 72 species were noted as migrants into June, mostly at various sites along Lake Michigan. The most noteworthy June departures included a White-faced Ibis (3-4 June), 11 southbound Sandhill Cranes (3 June), a record late Solitary Sandpiper (11 June), two Baird's Sandpipers (1 June), a male Yellow-bellied Flycatcher (15 June), a Blue-gray Gnatcatcher

(5 June), an American Pipit (1 June), a male Nashville Warbler (16 June), two male Magnolia Warblers (14 and 16 June), a male Yellow-rumped Warbler (15 June), a male Blackburnian Warbler (11 June), a female Prairie Warbler (1 June), a female Hooded Warbler (2 June), a Grasshopper Sparrow (4 June), a White-throated Sparrow (16 June), a Bobolink (13 June), and a Brown-headed Cowbird (8 June).

Records not contained in original submissions by any of the cited observers for a given record were contributed by local subcompilers for Coles County (fide LBH) and Chicago's Jackson Park (fide PRC). Several reports included in this compilation were extracted from text within correspondence to an electronic mailing list named Illinois Birders Exchanging Thoughts (IBET). Dan Kassebaum provided useful historical summaries of Illinois data on warblers in particular, and Paul Clyne supplied additional remarks on the historical significance of records in this summary. Many of the remarks regarding specific weather patterns as well as historical references to such were guided by data at www.wunderground.com.





