

Springs of a different feather: Watching Mother Nature

We humans love organization. We love identifying patterns and rules, themes and motifs, and understanding the cycles that envelop us. We like order and consistency, for example, consider taxonomy. Humanity has spent centuries (and continues today) refining and correcting rules and categories to be applied to nature. But very often--enough to keep scientists at the grindstone--we find nature doing something that has scrambled our brains. She breaks the rules.

This spring of 2013, we saw nature break down our organization of migration. We have determined an established order in which species are supposed to come through, a way birds are supposed to move with the weather, but thanks to a rather late-staying winter, all this was thrown to the wind. Wilson's Warblers influxed with waterthrushes, Mourning Warblers with redstarts, parulas with Blackpoll Warblers. And minds were indeed scrambled. Spring Bird Counts, normally catching a massive brunt of the migratory load, were relatively quiet in much of our state. April Big Days came up mysteriously short of what they had been in years past. Species variety in general fluctuated widely. Our systems of categorization broke down completely.

But it gets even better when compared with the spring of 2012. Even on an annual scale, this past spring of 2013 broke any sort of streak or pattern we could have dreamed up. With early heat in 2012 (exceptional on its own), birds migrated north far ahead of schedule, whereas in 2013, any birds that could have headed north a little early were barricaded by a line of cold, insect-suppressing air that covered northern and central Illinois. While species variety was great in some warmer parts of Illinois, even into May, many places in the prairie state had little more than Yellowrumped Warblers and kinglets. That, my friends, is weird.

And all it took was some strange weather patterns. Kenn Kaufman once said, "Nature defies our every attempt to define and categorize it," and he was right. But this phenomenon shouldn't be looked at with irritation; nature gives us the power and opportunity to discover new mechanisms, perspectives and understandings ad infinitum. She compels us to keep learning by constantly defying our expectations. And let's not forget the birds specifically. This is the best part of the story. The birds adapted. They went with it. Birds genetically programmed to migrate at specific times to specific places changed to survive the challenges they faced this spring. Millions of years of adaptation, and here we see the beautiful intersection and balancing of nature's systems. The complexity of it all is mind-boggling. We are but tiny observers of one of the grandest cycles to ever exist.

The spring of 2013 didn't just teach me which birds moved when, or how to read radar and weather patterns, it also taught me a little bit about why I'm a birdwatcher. Moving forward, I appreciate a little bit more the kind of people who are birdwatchers. It's about the perpetual discovery that birds, and ultimately nature, empower us to make, and that, my friends, is priceless.

After telling his mom that he wanted to be an ornithologist at age 3, Nick Minor has been actively seeking new knowledge and experiences related to birds. He spent the summer of 2013 interning at the Field Museum and teaching about nature at Makajawan Scout Reservation.

Elaeniamania

The sun was shining, birds were singing, and the sky was a bright blue. It seemed like a great day for an afternoon stroll through the local park. I was with my dad, Eric, and my brother, Ethan, and we were doing just that in mid-April 2012. We were looking for birds at the park I monitor, right after school got out for the day. This park, Douglas Park, is in the middle of a rough neighborhood on the west side of Chicago, so nobody gives it a chance. Douglas Park is in fact a great birding place. The one thing that sets it aside is the marsh, which is a rare thing in this part of Chicago. We were looking for an American Bittern, which had been hanging around the marsh for the past couple days. After a short search, we flushed it from the same area as before and snapped a couple pictures, appreciating its presence.

When we started to walk around the edge of the marsh, Ethan noticed a bird flitting around in the willows. We thought it was an Empidonax-type flycatcher. Empidonax flycatchers are a group of flycatchers containing five species regularly seen in Illinois, and are notorious for being difficult to identify. They tend to arrive in early May, except for Least Flycatcher, which arrives one or two weeks before the others. This fact

made this bird most likely a Least Flycatcher. After our first good look, something seemed off. The behavior, molt pattern and overall coloration of this bird confused us. We slowly eliminated the species of Empidonax flycatchers one by one. Yellow-bellied Flycatchers are much more yellow. Acadian Flycatchers are greenish and they have a completely different body shape. Willow Flycatchers have a fairly close resemblance to our bird, but have an orange tip to the lower mandible, and so do Alder Flycatchers. After effectively eliminating other Empids, the bird flew away. We left it in peace and moved on, somewhat content with the answer of Least Flycatcher.

We finished birding Douglas Park and went home. I posted pictures of the flycatcher onto a forum for Illinois birding. One of my young birder friends, Nathan Goldberg, weighed in saying that the flycatcher looked like it could be an elaenia, a bird that would be thousands of miles away from its homeland of South or Central America. This reinstated my suspicions and caused me to look at my photos again. This time I noticed a white crown stripe in one of my photos. I responded to Nathan and asked for the opinion of others. Nothing. I was in suspense the whole next day during school. After getting no responses for a whole day, I created a separate thread. This one focused on the ID of the flycatcher. Ethan posted his photos to this thread which included another photo of the crown stripe. Ethan posted the thread to Facebook. This caused the thread to spread like wildfire. One of the first responders was Greg Neise, the founder of the forum who was conveniently at an ABA meeting so he was surrounded by experts on this subject. He stated that it looked to be an elaenia. Some of the best birders in the country, Kenn Kaufman, Doug Stotz and Alvaro Jaramillo, independently responded by concurring that this bird was in fact an elaenia. Now, the debate was between Small-billed Elaenia and the Chilean subspecies of White-crested Elaenia. Small-billed would be a first ABA record, while White-crested would be a second as it was previously found in south Texas 9-10 February 2008. After experts seemed to agree on the fact better photos were needed to reach an absolute consensus, I went to bed.

We left early the next morning, just before sunrise, in hopes of finding the elaenia. My dad let me cut the first half of the school day, so I had about five hours to search for it. Birders descended on the park from all over

the Chicago area and beyond. Despite all of the eyes looking, we had no luck for the first five hours, but other birds were everywhere. A LeConte's Sparrow was the best find with a singing Sora taking second. Also seen were Wilson's Snipe, Sharp-shinned Hawk, and flocks of Double-crested Cormorants. Five hours after our arrival, I had some great new park birds but was convinced we would not refind the elaenia.

The second we got back to our car, ready to head back to school, I saw Joe Lill running across the front of the fieldhouse. I followed him and learned that Doug Stotz has just refound the elaenia! After a moment of relief, I searched ravenously for the elaenia, along with the few dozen birders remaining. It was found again in half an hour and we all saw it. The views were not anything conclusive beyond what we had previously seen. The elaenia flew into a large tree and sight was lost. It disappeared for a while, but other great birds popped up. Osprey and Merlin were the highlights.

Three hours later, the elaenia was refound northeast of where it had been. After everybody got it, it wandered north throughout the park. Great photos were obtained and I hoped that it could be identified to species. In

the evening, I watched as the thread erupted with various opinions from observers. This continued for another day. Even though my dad had to leave town, my mom was able to take us to Douglas Park on Saturday.

Saturday was not nearly as good of a birding day as Thursday. The only positive was the elaenia was less challenging to find. Other birds were almost non-existent. There was a crowd of birders from many states including California, Texas, Colorado, and North Carolina. The elaenia was seen the whole day on Saturday and Sunday, but when Monday came, it was nowhere to be found. With that, Elaeniamania drew to an end, as did the most memorable birding experience I have ever had.

No matter how many people tried, no absolute conclusion could be met between Small-billed and White-crested Elaenia. This bird's plumage was so worn, that it caused problems when trying to identify it. For example, Small-billed Elaenias have three wingbars while White-crested usually have two. Wear erased half of the wingbar on one side and faded it on the other, making this fieldmark inconclusive, as White-Crested can have a faded third wingbar. The white crest was either big for Small-billed

or small for White-crested. Most importantly, the bird never called. Calls are extremely important to flycatcher identification as they are almost always conclusive to species.

As a young birder, this is the type of find that you would only dream about. The fact that it was found in the park I monitor made the experience even more special.

The story of this bird was so compelling that CBS Evening News, National Public Radio, Chicago newspapers, and websites across the world all picked up this story.

Editor's Note: Both White-crested and Small-billed Elaenias have very large South American ranges with the White-crested breeding throughout much of the Andes in both the northern and southern portions of these mountains in South America, with some races wintering over a large portion of the rest of South America during the austral winter. Small-billed breeds in the southern portion of South America and also disperses widely, northward over much of northern South American during the austral winter.

Illinois's first winter record of the Black-throated Blue Warbler at sapsucker wells with notes on other Midwest and Mid-Canada winter records

On the morning of 27 December 2011, I was on my way to work in downtown Chicago, Illinois. I had taken an alternate route just east of the Jay Pritzker Pavilion in Millennium Park at the north end of Grant Park, Cook County. I took this route to search for the Harris's Sparrow (Zonotrichia querula) that Robert Hughes had observed on 23 December 2011 in front of the Aon Building on Randolph Street east of Michigan Avenue. On my way I heard several White-throated Sparrows (Zonotrichia albicollis) and while at the sidewalk next to the McDonald's Cyclery Center at 239 E. Randolph Drive I heard another White-throated Sparrow under a juniper along with some House Sparrows (*Passer domesticus*). I pished toward the juniper and amazingly out flew a male Blackthroated Blue Warbler (Setophaga caerulescens), feeding on the ground with the sparrows. Later the warbler flew to one of three trees next to the sidewalk where I noticed sapsucker drill holes were being used by the warbler to obtain food from sap. Soon I also saw an immature male Yellowbellied Sapsucker (Sphyrapicus varius) on the other side of the tree. I couldn't believe it! I studied the Black-throated Blue Warbler for 10 minutes and, after taking some field notes, I posted the sighting on IBET (email list: IL Birders Exchanging Thoughts) with my Iphone. Then, I rushed across Randolph Drive where, almost immediately, I ran into Robert Hughes and told him of the news. Most importantly Robert had a camera! We raced back across Randolph Street whereupon Bob began to capture images of the warbler on one of the trees. We, then, had photographic documentation of this extremely rare winter warbler sighting just two days after Christmas.

Subsequently, for just over two weeks, at least 50 observers were able to see this rare wintering warbler. Bob Andrini took photographs of both the warbler and sapsucker on 5 January 2012; the photographs are published in Illinois Audubon (Andrini 2012). During one of my early afternoon visits on 6 January 2012, I witnessed at least 22 birders and photographers at the 239 East Randolph Drive site watching and photographing the warbler. The next day the warbler's presence made a bit of media frenzy when both a link to a video (Bzdak 2012) of the warbler at Millennium Park and an article (DeVore 2012) appeared in the Chicago Tribune's Saturday paper. More birders, photographers and passers-by came to view the rare warbler. To my knowledge, Lisa Rest and I were the last to observe the warbler just before and during the beginning of a snowstorm on 12 January 2012. Despite extensive searching for several days the warbler was never found again though the sapsucker lingered until 16 January 2012.

Prior to this winter record the latest fall date for Illinois was 27 November 2009, a male photographed by Gail L. Sadock in Grant Park, Chicago, Cook Co. (Paul Clyne pers. comm.). Bohlen (1989) has listed 14 November, a male in Champaign Co., for the latest departure date for the state.

Identification

Upon first observing the warbler I was immediately struck by cobalt blue dorsal surfaces of the warbler's back, nape and crown feathers; the long black flanks extending up to the black chin and throat; black in the face contrasting with the very white ventral breast, belly, vent and undertail coverts. The distinctive white square on the black wings

was noted along with a white edge to the folded wing. The warbler's soft parts included a black eye, thin pointed blackish bill and darkishfleshy colored legs and feet. Later photographs would reveal a greenish tinge to the cobalt blue back feathers that first year males have (Dunn and Garrett 1997, Pyle et.al. 1997). This feature is shown well on the Chicago Tribune video (Bzdak 2012) and other photographs.

Feeding and Interaction with an Immature male Yellow-bellied Sapsucker

During the Black-throated Blue Warbler's stay at Millennium Park from 27 December 2011 through 12 January 2012, the warbler was most often seen in association with an immature Yellow-bellied Sapsucker at drill holes, feeding on the rows of fresh oozing sap at a hybrid 'Homestead' elm tree, though often the warbler would get chased off by the sapsucker. Holmes (2005) makes no specific mention of Black-throated Blue Warblers feeding on/at sapsucker wells, though this species feeding habits have been studied extensively during the breeding season. However, as noticed with the Millenium Park bird, Black-throated Blue Warblers routinely feed (on insects) by hovergleaning, and will do so, especially on their wintering grounds while occasionally feeding on small fruits and flower nectar, as well as sugarwater at hummingbird feeders and frequently on honeydew excreted by scale insects on Bursera simaruba (gumbo-limbo) trees in Hispaniola (Latta et al. 2001). Mousley (1917) does mention an instance of a female Black-throated Blue Warbler that he watched, apparently in Quebec, on 16 October 1916 (his latest record for the species there), hover gleaning

at sapsucker wells in an American beech tree (Fagus grandifolia) for the sap and possibly insects attracted to it.

This commensalism or symbiotic relationship where the warbler benefited without harming the sapsucker was noted by Bob Andrini (2012) and other observers of the warbler and sapsucker. Other times the warbler was

observed feeding on insects or other food items under leaf litter, sunflower and millet seeds put out for the sparrows and the warbler, mealworms, and suet plugged into some of the sap-sucker drill rows and knots of the deciduous trees in front of the McDonald's Cycle Center. The warbler also associated with several Black-capped Chickadees (Poecile atricapillus) in the park and seemed also loosely associated and fed with White-throated and House sparrows. The warbler was often seen hovergleaning like a kinglet over the drill holes looking for fresh sap ooze. I had seen warblers at these sapsucker drill holes earlier in the fall at Bicentennial Plaza and Millennium Park in North Grant Park - particularly Yellowrumped (Dendroica coronata), Cape May (Dendroica trigrina), and Orange-crowned Warblers (Vermivora celata), and Ruby-crowned Kinglets (Regulus calendula), watching them getting sap nutrients from these holes and not just insects though they could be at these holes, too, when insects were still prevalent.

Winter Range

For purposes of this paper winter is defined as meteorological from 1 Dec – 29 February. The normal winter range of the Black-throated Blue Warbler is in the Greater Antilles, from Puerto Rico, Hispaniola, Cuba to Jamaica; also in the Bahamas. It occurs occasionally in the Lesser Antilles as far south as Trinidad and along the Caribbean coast of the Yucatan, Belize, Honduras, becoming rarer or casual on the Caribbean coasts of Costa Rica, Panama, Columbia and Venezuela. Small numbers do winter

in extreme southern Florida with very few wintering farther north. Eastern seaboard wintering records north of Florida are extremely rare (Holmes et al. 2005). During early winter the last 30 years of Christmas Bird Counts, numbers of Black-throated Blue Warblers reported have ranged from 3 to 29 individuals every year in Florida. In California, where they are casual in winter, reports have ranged from one to three birds in 10 years of the last 30 years of CBCs

(Audubon website: www.audubon. org/cbcobservation/Historical/ SpeciesData). Winter vagrants seem to be more regular in far western states with 3 records in Oregon, two in western Washington, one from British Columbia, 4 in Arizona and a January specimen from Idaho (Dunn and Garrett 1997). Within the United States or Canada an observation of a Black-throated Blue Warbler, except for Florida, is an extreme rarity in winter with most birds departing by mid-November - if not earlier. Early winter stragglers are extremely rare though they have occurred in northern inhospitable climes.

Other Midwest and Mid-Canada winter records

There are twelve Midwest winter records for Black-throated Blue Warbler plus a remarkable 10 in southernmost Ontario, Canada – near-



ly all in early winter (Alan Wormington pers. comm.). All Midwest records have occurred mostly in early December through January with no sightings in February. However, there is one Ontario, Canadian record for February. There are four records for Ohio, all in Cuyahoga Co., except for one, as follows: 4-5 Dec. 1993: one at Garfield Heights; 3 and 10 Dec. 2000: one at Lakewood; 10 Dec 2003: one in Elmwood Park, Rocky River, and 10-13 Dec 2008: one near Salem, Mahoning Co. (photographed). Indiana, too, has four records: 8 Dec 1949: one at Goshen College in Elkhart Co. (a bird flew into a classroom; was caught and released); 30 Dec 1988 - 5 Jan 1989: one in Delaware Co.; 8 Dec 1986 - 9 Jan 1987: one in Vigo Co.; and 16 Dec 1979 - 30 Jan 1980: one in Boone Co. Michigan has but one record: 15-24 Dec 1974: one at feeder in Berrien Co., photo in University of Michigan Museum of Zoology (Mlodinow 1984, Payne 1983). Wisconsin has two winter records: 27 Nov – 25 Dec 1996: one, Ozaukee Co. (likey Mequon, Bob Domagalski pers. comm.); and 23 Dec 2011 - 14 Jan 2012: one, Glendale, Milwaukee Co. photographed by Dan Panetti (this was during nearly the same time period as this article's bird). Minnesota has one record: 13 Nov 1983 - 2 Dec 1983: one male, Washington Co., just north of Hastings. This bird lingered just into winter at a suet feeder and survived two snow storms, a wonderful color photograph graces the cover of "The Loon" (56:65). Ontario has ten records most of which occurred in early December except for two lingering into January, and amazingly one into February. These records (pers. comm. Alan Wormington) are as follows: 23 Nov 2008 – 1 Jan 2009: one female, Aldershot, Halton County (Rohan A. van Twest et al.); 1 December 1995: one at Mallory Beach, Bruce County (Shawn Giilck); I Dec 2008 – 6 Jan 2009: one male, Toronto, Metropolitan Toronto (Steven Rowe et al.); 3-19 Dec 2008: one male, Toronto, Metropolitan Toronto (Donald Baxter et al.); 5 Dec 1979: one male, Point Pelee National Park, Essex County (R. Douglas McRae); 5-8 Dec 1993: one female, Toronto, Metropolitan Toronto (Patrick Stepien-Scanlon et al.); 10 Dec 2011: one, Huntsville, Muskoka District (Trisha Healy, Paula Jackson); 14-16 Dec 1992: one male, Port Stanley, Elgin County (Robert A. Hubert et al.); 14-26 Dec 1993: one female, Port Stanley, Elgin County (Robert A. Hubert et al.); 13 Jan -19 Feb 1989: one female, Toronto, Metropolitan Toronto (Naomi LeVay, Don Peuramaki et al.).

As of this writing there are no winter records for North and South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa, Missouri or Manitoba, Canada.

Author's Note

As this article goes to press I have again found Black-throated Blue Warblers (up to $2\vec{\circlearrowleft},1\vec{\circlearrowleft}$) regularly visiting sapsucker wells in late September 2012, solely for the sap, this time at another Chicago lakefront park, Bicentennial Park.

New Approach (2 DAYS)

In 2013, we tried something new. Several goals are associated with the Spring Bird Count and one is to sample the bird communities throughout Illinois. While we generally accomplish this goal in many counties, a few counties are infrequently covered during the count and some counties with very few censusers; thus the decision to add one more day to the Spring Bird Count in 2013. It provided for greater coverage of the state and in general more data, however it did create a greater burden on compilers. Results on Spring Bird Count 2013 with two days are forthcoming.

Spring Bird Count days will now be on the Saturday or the Sunday that falls between the 4th and the 10th of May. The 2013 dates were May 4 and May 5. The goal is not to have censusers go to the same location in consecutive days, but rather to do different counties on each day.

2012 Results

A total of 471,597 birds of 222 species were detected. The spring of 2012 in Illinois set many records associated with an extremely warm March. This early warmth resulted in a much earlier phenology for many plants, and begged the question of whether birds would also arrive early. The SBC data suggest that either birds did not arrive early. If anything, they arrived late or simply did not stop in the area. Many participants commented on the low numbers of warblers and thrushes. While there are many possible reasons for the low numbers, one possibility is the early warmth created a situation where plants and insects emerged earlier, and once certain migrants arrived, their food resources were missing so they did not stop in Illinois.

The extremely warm spring created a very odd situation in which the only two new species for the count were species more likely to be observed at 6° as opposed to 76° degrees. The historic 2012-2013 winter irruption of Snowy Owls resulted in one being present in DeKalb County.

In addition Common Redpolls were reported from Will County. Some other interesting observations to note from this past year are listed below. While the all-time high counts are interesting, it is also important to note the species that were recorded in very low numbers.

- A Purple Gallinule was found in Putnam County.
- More Mute Swans were recorded this year than ever before.
- Only 12 Upland Sandpipers were located.
- Black-necked Stilts were detected in 13 counties a new county high record.
- A record number of counties (4) found Scissortailed Flycatchers.
- Acadian Flycatchers were widespread with the most ever counties detecting them and at record levels.
- Eurasian Collared-Doves continue their invasion with detections in 65 counties.
- Bald Eagles were detected in 67 counties, a new record high.
- Bell's Vireos were found in the most counties ever (32) and at record numbers.
- Henslow's Sparrows were in 43 counties, the most ever and a record number were found (263).
- Warblers and thrushes were again low this year in many counties throughout the state. For example, more Swainson's Thrushes were found in Union County in 1999, than were found in the entire state this year.
- A Swainson's Warbler was detected in Franklin County.
- It was the "year" of the Dickcissel in the Midwest and a record number of counties found a record number of individuals.
- Eurasian Tree Sparrows continue to expand slowly; 30 counties reported them this year.

Exotic Bird Species

There is a long history of exotic species in Illinois from Rock Pigeons to Gray Partridge to Eurasian Collared-Dove. These are often oddities for bird watchers but in some circumstances can pose significant challenges to native species. The data from the Spring Bird Count can help track the spread of these species. While some species appear to have fixed ranges, remember that many invasive plant species often reside in an area for decades before their populations explode. We choose to highlight four species.




Figure 1: Eurasian Tree Sparrow 1975-1985 & 1986-2012.

Although Eurasian Tree Sparrows were released in St. Louis in 1870 they have not spread at the rate of other species, notably their congener House Sparrow. While they are not spreading quickly, they appear to be steadily spreading northward along the Illinois and Mississippi Rivers.



Mute Swan

The stronghold of this invasive species is in northeast an central Illinois along the Illinois River.






Figure 3: House Finch 1975 –1985 & 1986 -2012.

House Finches are native to western North America, but were transported to New York as a caged bird. With the passing of the Migratory Bird Act pet stores in New York released the birds in 1918. The species quickly expanded west, as can be seen in the first map that shows the first arrivals in Illinois were on the eastern edge of the state.

One of the more interesting data sets is one that shows how common species are through time. Though this can be difficult to interpret due to differential effort through years, one approach is to simply rank how common a species is in a given year and compare that rank to previous years. Red-winged Blackbirds continue to retain the designation of being the most common along with American Robin, which continues to be the second most common species detected.

Figure 4. The number of species detected and participants (in parentheses) in Illinois Counties in 2012. The hatched counties were not censused.





Field Notes:

The 2012 Spring Migration

Many observers lamented that the 2012 spring season was a poor one characterized by very low numbers of migrants. Eric Walters remarked that this "was the worst spring passerine migration in 35 years." H. David Bohlen commented that high counts "were among the lowest for many species of any spring since 1998." He also stated, "Almost all counts of warblers were low, and the weather and the very dense vegetation made viewing extremely difficult." Yet this spring season provided an incredible number of early arrival dates, making it one of the more interesting one from the standpoint of the state's avian annals. The reason? Exceptionally hot and dry conditions.

The average statewide temperature for the period from March to May was in 2012 a whopping 8°F warmer than normal, providing for the hottest spring among the 118 years for which we have temperature records. March was particularly warm, with record setting average tempatures of 55.3°F, more than 15° hotter than the 40° norm. In Chicago between the 14th and 22nd of March, temperatures exceeded 80° on eight of those nine days and set records on each, peaking at 87° during a period when 60° would be considered unusually mild. The one day in that span when tempertures reached "only" to 78°, the record high for the date was still tied. These warm temperatures followed one of Illinois's mildest winters, which concluded with a February that was 5.5°F warmer than normal, though in June temperatures returned close to the usual level. Seasonal change in vegetation occurred some three to four weeks ahead of schedule, with the leafing out of deciduous trees being especially noticeable. Furthermore, precipitation levels were well below normal between February and June.

The impact of the season's warmth on bird migration was very apparent and drew the attention of many observers. Associated with the high temperatures early in the season was an early exodus of gulls and other winter residents along with early arrivals by many passerine migrants. Richard Bjorklund noted that migration at Chautauqua was a full month early. Bohlen commented that "many species left very early, especially the sparrows." At least 12 species bested or tied record early arrival dates in 2012. These were Virginia Rail, Spotted Sandpiper, Whimbrel, White-eyed Vireo, Warbling Vireo, Red-eyed Vireo, Blue-gray Gnatcatcher, Worm-eating Warbler, Prothonotary Warbler, Tennessee Warbler, Grasshopper Sparrow, and Henslow's Sparrow. Additionally, record early dates for American Woodcock, Marsh Wren, and Orange-crowned Warbler were also set, if the individuals involved were not in fact overwintering birds.

The dry conditions also had an impact. Water levels were very low in the Illinois River valley in Mason County, and Richard Bjorklund remarked that the Great Blue Heron and Great Egret colonies suffered widespread failure there. Water birds in other areas were sparse because of the dryness.

Below are discussed some of the more significant aspects and

Virginia Rails arrived very early. Previously, there had been 11 March records involving 14 birds. This spring added three March records to the mix: 15 Mar in Kankakee County, 16 Mar in Massac County, and 23 Mar in Jasper County. The first two bested the prior record-early date set 19 Mar 1987 in Springfield. This year's two record setting dates plus that of the 1987 Springfield bird are the only ones earlier than the 23 Mar date for this year's Jasper County bird.

Black-necked Stilts made significant incursions into the central and northern tiers of the state. Counties in the central portion of the state from which stilts were reported included Adams, Brown, Champaign, Coles, Fulton, Mason, McLean, Mercer, and Sangamon, while the northern counties hosting these birds were Lake, McHenry, Putnam, and Will. Lake County's first record of Black-necked Stilt occurred 22 Apr 1992, and was just the ninth record statewide (Johnson, 1992). The 1998 spring season, just 14 years prior to this, marked the first county records for Blacknecked Stilt in Champaign and Sangamon counties (Clyne, 1998). The total number of Black-necked Stilts reported statewide that season was 15, a significantly high total at that time. This spring, eBird (Sullivan et al., 2009) included reports totalling to 659 stilts. This total from eBird certainly includes duplicate sightings of some birds. Nonetheless, eliminating all potential duplicates still leaves at least 68 stilts from central Illinois and nine or more from northern Illinois in the total. The presence of Black-necked Stilt in Illinois has clearly changed in the last 15 to 20 years.

The Spotted Sandpiper spotted in early March by Mark Seiffert at Carlyle Lake (and possibly the same bird three days later by Dan Kassebaum) smashed the previous early arrival date by two and half weeks. This year's bird joins only three prior March records for the species.

Big shorebirds were in good supply. The Whimbrels seen 16 Apr at Mermet Lake tied the earliest arrival date, arriving a month ahead of normal. Sightings involving more than one Whimbrel are infrequent, as are those away from Lake Michgan, making the 15 at Spunky Bottoms doubly significant. Conservatively there were at least 25 Hudsonian Godwits noted this spring, which is a respectable season total. A mazingly, Nathan Goldberg photographed 24 Marbled Godwits in one group passing by Chicago's Montrose Point; this total is one shy of the state record high count. At least 13 others were seen during the season.

The flight of White-rumped Sandpipers this spring was very nice, with reports of 20+ coming from five different locations. The Purple Sandpiper 31 Mar in Waukegan is really rather unusual. There are just five prior spring records: one 23 Feb to 2 Mar

2002, another 14 Mar 1961, and records from June in 1979, 1951, and 1895. Dunlin made an early splash into the state. The bird seen 20 Mar in Marion County by Leroy Harrison provided the third earliest arrival ever and the two birds in Sangamon County found 26 Mar by Dave Bohlen were the fourth earliest for central Illinois. This spring's three March records involving 14 Dunlins join the prior 14 March records involving 22 birds. The Buffbreasted Sandpiper 24 May at Chicago's Montrose Point was just the ninth spring record for the state.

The American Woodcock on 20 Jan reported by Leroy Harrison in southeast Illinois was thought to be an early migrant. If so, this may be a record early date. Another contender for that distinction is a bird noted 19 Jan 1985 (Kleen, 1986). Though there are four records of American Woodcock from the first six days of January, the historic record shows a gap with no sightings from 7 Jan to 18 Jan of any year. The possibility of birds attempting or actually managing to winter is difficult to exclude, nonetheless. The one published record that suggests this may happen concerns reference to one to three woodcocks in Massac County reported by Frank's bird fits the pattern of many early arrivals, but also could reflect the impact of a mild winter.

The incredible invasion of Snowy Owls during the 2011/2012 winter including some late lingering birds. Among them were three individuals that stayed into May. The birds noted 14 May and 11 May are now the first and second latest on record, and the one on 5 May the fifth latest. There are only two prior May records for the species: 9 May 1964 and 8 May 2002. Also very late was a Northern Saw-whet Owl photographed in a Champaign County garage by Gene Campbell. Only two prior May records exist, and this year's is the latest.

Hands down, the bird of the season was the flycatcher discovered and photographed by Aaron and Ethan Gyllenhaal in Oak Park, Cook County, on 17 Apr. When photos were posted to the internet, Nathan Goldberg suggested the bird was an elaenia, setting off "Elaenia Mania" for the remainder of the bird's visit, which lasted to 22 Apr. While a conclusive identification to species has not yet been made, evidence is currently leaning toward Small-billed Elaenia, which would constitute a first record for the United States. The other possibility is White-crested Elaenia, in which case this would be a second United States record.

Of the six regularly occurring vireo species, five posted notably early arrivals this spring. An early White-eyed Vireo seen 19 Mar by Keith McMullen at Mermet Lake Conservation Area beat the previous record arrival date by one day and provided just the fifth March date for the species in Illinois, all of which have occurred in the southern portion of the state. Frank Bennett's sighting on 28 Mar, also at Mermet Lake, provided a sixth March record. Early as well was the Yellow-throated Vireo on 31 Mar, which is but the fifth March record. Furthermore, there are only nine dates for Bell's Vireo that are earlier than this year's sighting on 28 Apr. Seven of these occurred in the last six years, which lies in the period of the Southernmost Illinois Birding Blitz. That event may encourage more effort for locating early arrivals of this species. The Warbling Vireo found by Keith McMullen 31 Mar at Mermet Lake Conservation Area was record-early by two days, and McMullen's Red-eyed Vireo on 6 Apr at Pomona in Jackson County was record-early by three days.

Swallows arrived early as well. The only records earlier than the Purple Martins seen 2 Mar are of birds 24 Feb 1923 (see Bohlen (1989)) and 1 Mar 2008. The Northern Rough-winged Swallow seen this year on 18 Mar provided a sighting earlier than all others except for one 16 Mar 1996. Bank Swallows arrived six

days earlier than average. Providing the second earliest arrival date were five Cliff Swallows 19 Mar, and a Barn Swallow 5 Mar tied the 2nd earliest arrival date for the species.

Three very early House Wrens were noted 22 Mar, 29 Mar, 30 Mar. The only other March dates for the species are cited in Bohlen (1989): 16 Mar 1982, 26 Mar from early in the 20th century, and 31 Mar 1986. Two Marsh Wrens were seen in southern Illinois in early March. In the literature, the earliest date noted for migrant birds is 20 Mar, so these would be record early migrants unless they represent wintering individuals. However, there were no winter reports of Marsh Wren from the areas where these were reported.

The Blue-gray Gnatcatcher seen by Frank Bennett on 17 Mar set a new record arrival date. Furthermore, the two gnatcatchers seen 25 Mar apparently represent the 5th and 6th earliest records, but see below. Records earlier than 25 Mar include 23 Mar 2011 (2) from Montrose Point, 23 Mar 2011 in Johnson Count, 22 Mar 2009 in Urbana. The 22 Mar 2009 was noted in Mahan (2009) as the 2nd earliest arrival date, but the review of the literature done in preparation of this report did not turn up any earlier date.

The *Catharus* flight was considered by several reporters to be quite poor. Lower than usual high counts of Gray-cheeked Thrush and Swainson's Thrush appear to bear these observations out, but Hermit Thrush totals in contrast seemed strong.

The last Snow Buntings noted were seen 24 Feb. This departure is a month ahead of the average 21 Mar departure date.

Six of the 36 species or warblers seen this spring had notably early or record early dates. There are only four earlier records of Ovenbird (4 Apr 1969 and 14 Apr of 1986, 1992, and 2002) than this year's 15 Apr 2012 bird. The Worm-eating Warbler noted 6 Apr tied the record early date from 1977. The Louisiana Waterthrush 14 Mar was the state's third earliest, bested only by birds seen 11 Mar 1986 and 12 Mar 2011. The Black-and-white Warbler seen 21 Mar by Dave Bohlen in Springfield, the two seen 25 Mar at Ft. Massac State Park by Keith McMullen, and the ones 29 Mar in New Columbia in Massac County found by Frank Bennett and in Whiteside County by Dan Williams were all notably early. Prior to this season there were only nine March occurrences of Black-and-white Warbler. Of these, eight were during the range from 29 to 31 Mar, with the remaining one on the record early date of 16 Mar set in 2003 at Carlyle Lake. Birds seen 29 Mar 1981 and 1991 in Springfield by Dave Bohlen and 29 Mar 2003 in Waukegan by Joan Bruchman were the only March records outside the southern tier, so that Dave Bohlen's bird this year posted a new record-early date for central Illinois and Dan Williams's bird tied the record date for northern Illinois. The total number of March records for the species jumped from nine to 13 in just one year. Keith McMullen located two Prothonotary Warblers in the first third of April: 6 Apr in Johnson County and 9 Apr at Mermet Lake. Both these birds bested the prior recordearly date of 11 Apr for the species. The Tennessee Warbler found by Frank Bennett 6 Apr in Massac County joins last year's 9 Apr 2011 bird (also Massac County) as the two earliest on record and the only ones from the first third of April. There are a couple of dates from the first few days of April for Orange-crowned Warbler, and these are the earliest migrants of the species we have on record. The Orange-crowned seen 31 Mar at Ft. Massac State Park by Keith McMullen nudges this record arrival date back. However, Leroy Harrison noted as an early arrival an Orangecrowned Warbler 25 Feb in southeast Illinois. If not a wintering bird, or one that wintered nearby, this would be an exceptionally early date for a northbound bird.

Josh Engel noted a late lingering American Tree Sparrow in Chicago's Grant Park 10 May. There are few later records for the species, all from the northeast portion of the state. The latest was 27 May 2011 in Chicago's Lincoln Park, with another 21 May 1985 from Joliet (Will County), and the other later record 16 May 1996 in Palatine (Cook County).

Alex Bloss's Vesper Sparrow 11 Mar at Montrose tied the record early northern Illinois arrival date from 1985. There are only three Lark Sparrows known to have arrived in Illinois earlier than the two seen 9 Apr at Carlyle Lake (Dan Kassebaum) and in Fulton County (Larry Hood). The Grasshopper Sparrow photographed 14 Mar at Chicago's Montrose Point by Josh Engel, and presumably the same bird seen there three days later, provided record early arrival dates for the species. The previous record early date was set 22 Mar 1938, 74 years ago.

Before 2012, there had been 12 Henslow's Sparrows found in March in Illinois. Eleven of these were located in southern Illinois during the spring seasons from 2007 to 2010, so there has been a recent trend for earlier arrival of this species. However, the eight to 10 individuals found 21 Mar of this year at Prairie Ridge State Natural Area by Leroy Harrison was unprecented, both in terms of the number of individuals for that time of year and also for 21 Mar besting the old record early arrival by four days. The Henslow's Sparrow that Josh Engel photographed at Chicago's Northerly Island is the second earliest for the state and the earliest for northern Illinois. The only other March record from northern Illinois comes from a specimen taken in DuPage County on 28 Mar 1910. Also notable were Keith McMullen's three Henslow's Sparrows 25 Mar in Johnson County, though these "only tied" the prior record early date.

Leroy Harrison's Nelson's Sparrow 4 Jun at Prairie Ridge State Natural Area set a record late date for southern Illinois. All the previous eight June records were from northern Illinois (with seven of those in Chicago). Just three were later than Harrison's bird: one 5 Jun 1983 in Chicago noted by Jim Landing, one 6 Jun 1971 at Goose Lake Prairie seen by Larry Balch and Charlie Clark, and the latest 11 Jun 1997 seen by John Purcell in Chicago.

A Harris's Sparrow in Logan County was seen on the exceptionally early date of 5 Mar by Andy Sigler and Mike Madsen. The only earlier date for Harris's Sparrow in at least the last 27 years was a bird 14 Feb 2010.

The Yellow-headed Blackbird found 18 Mar at Emiquon Preserve was exceptionally early. It is the fifth earliest on record, and one of only 11 for March.

This summary of the spring season would not be possible without the reporting of sightings in various venues by observers throughout the state. The information used to create this report came from seasonal field notes and sightings submitted to the author, from documentation submitted to the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee, from reports to eBird (Sullivan et al., 2009), from reports to the several birding list serves in Illinois, and from posts to the Illinois Birders' Forum internet bulletin board. The author expresses special appreciation to those 37 individuals who submitted field notes and commentary directly to him, as those submissions always prove especially helpful in preparing the seasonal summary and add context that is frequently not available through other sources such as eBird and posts to internet bulletin boards and list serves. With more than about 220 cited observers, less than 20% of the individuals are providing information this way. Of course, the effort made by observers to make information about sightings available through other means is also appreciated. However, I strongly encourage individuals to submit their

sightings to eBird and to submit their most notable observations with commentary directly to the seasonal report editor. Information reported in other venues is easily overlooked, and some significant information in eBird can easily evade notice in the volume of data appearing there without attention being brought to it by observer notes. Perspectives on the season as a whole or on parts of the season are also quite valuable.

The observers for individual records in the report are credited by including their initials immediately following mention of the record. The individuals cited are listed below, with the order of the list alphabetic in relation to the observers' initials. Where more than one observer shares the same initials, a modified set of intiials is used to provide disambiguation, with this modification shown in the list of observers. In some cases, a citation pertains to an organization or institution. Abbreviations for these are listed separately.












