## Letter from the Editor

### Tell us your favorite or most special Illinois birding spot: Here's mine

Sitting here looking out my window at the snow watching the common winter birds such as American Tree Sparrows and Dark-eyed Juncos, I began to think about my favorite birding spot in Illinois. Of course, I've been to lots of places in Illinois and birding spots in southern Illinois surely have to be at the top of my list.

But it all comes down to the first time I heard a Blue-winged Warbler sing at least 30, if not longer, years ago. I had taken a birdwatching class through the College of Lake County and we met at Ryerson Woods in Lake County. When I heard that unique, "Bee bzzz" sound as if it were in a fourth dimension, a whole new world opened to me. Someone knew that a Blue-winged Warbler was singing, and I couldn't see it, but I heard it. I felt like Alice in Wonderland.

Being a beginning birder, I didn't quite realize all the wonderful places to bird in the state, so I made most of my early forays to Ryerson Woods, truly a magical place for migration. As a flutist and pianist, I immersed myself in the songs and calls, listening to tapes over and over trying to memorize the various utterances of the warblers.

One day I was listening to the Hooded Warbler song in the car as I pulled into the lot at Ryerson Woods. I turned off the tape, got out of car and heard – a Hooded Warbler. "That's a Hooded Warbler!" I said to no one there. Indeed it was, and I had discovered the gem by song first, then admired the gorgeous yellow and black colors of this bird, which is fairly rare at Ryerson.

It happened that way over and over at Ryerson Woods. For some reason, I was entranced by the "I am so lazeeeee" song of the Black-throated Blue Warbler. While hiking Ryerson Woods down a trail toward the farm, I heard it – a Black-throated Blue Warbler singing, and I found it, and it was the most beautiful bird I had seen. Yes, I know. Blackburnian Warblers are far much prettier, but this was a bird I had again found with a song and I was there alone with the bird. As many of you may know, Black-throated Blue Warbler is one of my favorite birds of all time. Indeed, I went to their breeding grounds in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, and heard them singing on a hot, bug-infested July day. On another autumn day while hiking one of the longer trails at Ryerson Woods, I spotted a beautiful male Black-throated Blue Warbler. So entranced was I watching the bird with binoculars that I didn't realize that five white-tailed deer had gathered around me in a circle. I was startled when I lowered my binoculars and saw them. Were they watching the bird? Well, of course not. But it was one of those rare times when I felt completely and utterly part of the fourth dimension of the natural world.

I found several more of my firsts – to add to my life list – at Ryerson – by hearing the song first. I had longed to hear a Connecticut Warbler and one day on the short trail behind the program cabins, I heard it – that loud, vociferous, unmistakable sound that I had listened to over and over on my tape. To see the bird, I had to slush in some mud, then lean far back against a tree, strain my neck, search through the leaves and finally, glimpse the elusive creature.

I will never forget where I saw my first Black-throated Blue and Connecticut Warblers. It's never the same, is it, the next time you see the birds you covet as lifers. But it was so much more enhanced for me because I had learned the songs before I went looking for them.

## President's Message

### Blackbird Blitz

All those who enjoy sorting through blackbird flocks, raise your hand. We all probably remember a teacher or speaker using that rhetorical hook to get our attention, though the subject was certainly not blackbirds. But as I write this, I look around and don't see very many hands in the air! Who wants to count blackbirds if there's more interesting birds to be seen?

I encourage us all – who are, metaphorically speaking 'sitting on our hands' when it comes to blackbirds – to reconsider that position, beginning this March.

The International Rusty Blackbird Working Group (IRBWG) has been studying this species for a number of years, trying to determine why Rustys have declined 85-95% since the mid 1900's, according to the best available estimates! Quoting from their website <http://rustyblackbird.org/> "The Rusty Blackbird (*Euphagus carolinus*) is a widespread North American species that has shown chronic long-term and acute short-term population declines, based both on breeding season and wintering ground surveys."

Though our state does not provide important wintering habitat for Rustys, the IRBWG believes Illinois is a key stopover corridor for the species as they travel north to their breeding grounds in the coniferous forests far to our north. The IRBWG reached out to IOS, asking us to organize, recruit birders and lead a three-year long effort, aka the Rusty Blackbird Blitz, to find out where and in what numbers Rustys are found here in Illinois, as they pass through during spring migration.

The first year of the Blitz will begin on March 1, 2014, and extend through mid April. I suspect this first season the major challenge to birders will be scouting locations where Rustys are likely to be. As we all know, they like wet woodlands, but are often mixed in with larger multi-species blackbird flocks during the spring.

IOS seeks one or two birders to coordinate the Blitz statewide; an alternate possibility: Dividing the state into three or more regions, with a corresponding number of birders acting as regional coordinators. If you're interested in being a coordinator on any level, please get in touch with me by email [bfisher928@aol.com](mailto:bfisher928@aol.com). We plan additional outreach, to make sure all Illinois birders are clued into the Blitz, and its importance in finding answers and solutions to halt/reverse the decline of this fascinating species. Check the IRBWG website for complete details on how the Blitz works.

Karen and I are planning to get out there this March. From past early spring birding expeditions around the headwaters of the Illinois River, we think we know a few likely spots. I'll bet you do as well. So please, raise your hand and shout, "I want to find and count Rustys!"

## The 2012 Illinois and Mississippi River Fall Waterbird and Wetland Habitat Report

### INTRODUCTION

The Illinois and Mississippi River Valleys (IRV and CMRV, respectively) are major migration and wintering areas for nearly 30 species of waterfowl in the Mississippi Flyway (Havera 1999). Additionally, these regions provide significant recreational opportunities (e.g., hunting and bird watching). Data from aerial inventories are used to direct waterfowl management, habitat acquisition, ecological research, and for public outreach. There are many important private, state and federal waterfowl areas and refuges within these river floodplains, such as the Mark Twain National Wildlife Refuge (NWR), the Illinois River National Wildlife and Fish Refuges, and Keokuk Pool. The Illinois Natural History Survey (INHS) with support from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) and the Federal Aid to Wildlife Restoration Fund through the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) has conducted aerial inventories of waterfowl along the Illinois and Mississippi rivers since 1948 (flown each year but 2001). This undertaking represents the longest known inventory of waterfowl, preceding even the USFWS breeding waterfowl counts and mid-winter inventories.

Wetland conditions in backwater lakes along the Mississippi and Illinois rivers influence migration patterns of dabbling ducks – better conditions result in longer stop-over durations (O’Neal et al. 2012). Habitat conditions are dependent on many factors, but likely are heavily influenced by abundance of high-quality foods. In the IRV and CMRV, natural moist-soil vegetation composed of mostly annual grasses and broad-leafed plants, submersed and floating-leafed aquatic vegetation, and cereal crops (e.g., corn, sorghum and Japanese millet) are the principle food sources of ducks during fall (Havera et al. 1999:133). Wide-scale production of moist-soil plants is dependent on timing and extent of spring and summer flooding along the river systems; receding water levels during late spring and summer expose mudflats and encourage plant growth. Additionally, temperature, rainfall, and other factors affect farming practices (e.g., fall tillage of corn fields) which influences availability of waste grain for field-feeding ducks. Although submersed and floating-leafed aquatic plants have been largely eliminated from many backwater lakes along the major rivers, some isolated lakes and reservoirs harbor these plant communities as long as

sedimentation and eutrophication are not severe.

During aerial inventories each fall, we estimated waterfowl habitat quality based on food abundance. Herein, we describe wetland, lake, and river water levels; apparent food production by aquatic plant communities; and the response by waterbirds during fall 2012.

### METHODS

We have estimated the quality of waterfowl foraging habitats (e.g., moist-soil plants and submersed aquatic vegetation) in the IRV and CMRV since the late 1970s using a simple, qualitative index (1–5; 1 – no or poor food production, 2 – fair, 3 – good, 4 – very good, 5 – excellent; O’Neal et al. 2012). During summer/fall, we assessed the extent and maturity of waterfowl plant foods both aerially and from the ground at several backwater wetlands in these rivers and ranked overall food production in the region according to the index.




**Figure 1.** Locations in the Illinois and central Mississippi river valleys aerially inventoried for waterfowl by the Illinois Natural History Survey, fall 2012 (INHS 2013, <http://www.bellrose.org>).

During fall 2012, we aerially inventoried waterbirds (Table 1) 16 times at 23 locations in the IRV and 16 locations in the CMRV (Fig. 1; INHS 2013). One observer conducted all inventories from a single-engine, fixed-wing aircraft flying at an alti-

tude of <450 ft and 150–160 mph (Havera 1999). We defined waterfowl abundance in both river systems as peak numbers observed during approximately weekly surveys during fall and used running averages to extrapolate weekly bird abundance to cumulative use-days for the season (Stafford et al. 2007). For example, 100 birds using a wetland for 10 days equates to 1,000 use-days (Stafford et al. 2007, 2010).

## RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Persistent drought and exceptionally warm temperatures occurred throughout most of the central United States, including the IRV and CMRV, during 2012. As a result, water levels receded early in the growing season creating excellent conditions for moist-soil plant development in many wetlands and lake margins. Specifically, water levels in the Illinois River fell below 8 ft. (14 ft. flood stage) in Havana on 25 May and remained low in both Peoria and La Grange pools of the IRV throughout the growing season (Fig. 2). This drawdown was considered early to mid-season in terms of moist-soil management (Fredrickson and Taylor 1982). Many (19 of 27 wetlands; 70%) of the monitored IRV wetlands had above average to excellent waterfowl food resources at the onset of fall migration. Like the IRV, waterfowl foraging habitat in the CMRV was considered above average during fall 2012. Most (15 of 18 locations; 83%) surveyed wetlands had above average to excellent duck foraging habitat. Extensive beds of submersed aquatic vegetation were visible in Pool 19 of the Mississippi River during September 2012 surveys. Accordingly, diving duck foraging habitat appeared better in fall 2012 than fall 2011.

Peak abundance of total ducks was greater in the IRV and CMRV in 2012 than 2011. Additionally, duck abundance in the IRV exceeded long-term averages during all weekly surveys. In the IRV, peak abundance of total ducks occurred on 12 December 2012 (617,565); this estimate was 115% greater than the 2011 peak, and 157% above the most recent 5-yr average (2007–2011; Table 1; Fig. 3). Total duck abundance in the CMRV peaked on 12 December at 531,040 and was 40% greater than 2011 and 38% above the 5-yr average (Table 1; Fig. 4). Peak abundance of total ducks for the two river systems combined (1,148,605) was 88% greater than in 2011 and 90% above the 5-yr average (Table 1).

In the IRV, peak abundance estimates for northern pintail (-15%),




American green-winged teal (-12%), and American wigeon (-78%) were less in 2012 than 2011, whereas estimates for mallard (+207%), American black duck (+51%), blue-winged teal (+101%), gadwall (+66%), and northern shoveler (+25%) were greater in 2012 than 2011. The peak estimate of total dabbling ducks (583,370) was 123% greater than the 2011 estimate and 169% above the 5-yr average (Table 1).

In the CMRV, 2012 peak abundance estimates for American green-winged teal (-19%) and American wigeon (-24%) were less than in 2011. Peak estimates for all other dabbling duck species in the CMRV were greater in 2012 than 2011 (Mallard [+46%], American Black Duck [+320%], Northern Pintail [+24%], Blue-winged Teal [+397%], Gadwall [+21%] and Northern Shoveler [+21%]). Peak abundance of all dabbling duck species in the CMRV was 40% greater in 2012 (424,905) than 2011 and 46% above the 5-yr average (Table 1; Fig. 4).


Diving duck abundance in the IRV peaked on 6 December in 2012 at 48,285; this was 93% greater than 2011 and 85% above the 5-yr average. Peak abundance estimates for Lesser Scaup (+75%), Ring-necked Duck (+65%), Canvasback (+193), Ruddy Duck (+83%), Common Goldeneye (+1,288%) and Bufflehead (+70%) were greater in 2012 than 2011, whereas estimates for Redhead (-100%) were less in 2012 than 2011 (Table 1).

In the CMRV, diving duck abundance peaked on 27 December in 2012 at 179,585; this was 69% greater than 2011 and 73% greater than the 5-yr average (Table 1; Fig. 4). Excepting Redhead (-53%) and Common Goldeneye (-17%), peak estimates for all diving duck species inventoried in the CMRV were greater in 2012 than 2011 (Lesser Scaup [+58%], Ring-necked Duck [+102%], Canvasback [+94%], Ruddy Duck [+6%] and Bufflehead [2%]; Table 1).


Use-day estimates for total ducks were greater in the IRV and CMRV in 2012 than 2011 (+31% and +34%, respectively; Table 1). In the IRV, estimated use-days for 5 of 8 dabbling duck species were greater in 2012


than 2011. In the CMRV, estimated use-days for all dabbling duck species were greater in 2012 than 2011. Total diving duck use-days in the IRV were 89% greater in 2012 than 2011 (Table 1). Excepting Redhead, estimated use-days for all diving duck species in the IRV were greater in 2012 than 2011. In the CMRV, excepting Canvasback, Redhead and Bufflehead, use-days for all diving ducks species inventoried were greater in 2012 than 2011. Total diving duck use-days in the CMRV increased by 40% from 2012 to 2011.

Peak abundances and use-days for Canada, Snow and Greater white-fronted Geese in the IRV were greater during 2012 than 2011 (Table 1). Despite some lesser peak abundances for these geese species in the CMRV, use-days in the region were above 2011 and long-term averages (+19–417%). Similarly, American Coot abundances and use-days were less than in 2011 (-34% and -7%, respectively) in the IRV, but American Coots exceeded both 2011 numbers and the long-term average in the CMRV for peak abundances (+59% and +107%, respectively) and use-days (+195 and 181%, respectively).

Abundant waterfowl food resources at many refuges and wetlands in both river systems likely enhanced waterfowl stopover duration (O'Neal et al. 2012) during fall 2012 which perhaps contributed to the large numbers of ducks observed during fall inventories and use-day estimates. Additionally, waterfowl forage was available well past the average freeze-up date of 8 December for central Illinois. Despite brief periods of extensive ice coverage, above normal temperatures and relatively mild weather persisted until 22 December when significant portions of the IRV wetlands froze. Significant ice coverage was not observed in the CMRV until 27 December when most of the side and main channel areas of Pool 19 froze. Ample food resources and ice-free wetlands provided ideal waterfowl migration habitat during fall 2012. Waterfowl inventories revealed that migrating ducks responded to the available wetland habitats when large numbers of ducks occupied both river systems creating a spectacular duck migration during fall 2012 in central Illinois.





## First Illinois Record ...

## The Wandering Tattler

On 8 August 2012, online news showed the weather and wind pattern being conducive to good birding the next day along the Chicago lakefront. Because of the weather discussion on the Illinois Birders Forum, I spent most of the morning of 9 August at the Montrose dunes hoping to observe jaegers or rare gulls. Not seeing anything interesting at all, I walked back to my car and was getting ready to leave; then, I saw a flyover Bonaparte's Gull (*Chroicocephalus philadelphia*), the first I had seen for early fall at Montrose. I decided to walk back to the beach and dunes to see if I could re-find the Bonaparte's Gull. That's when I ran into Steve Spitzer who was also birding the beach.

Spitzer's first words to me were something like, "It's amazingly slow," since all he had seen were the more common gulls and a few Sanderlings (*Calidris alba*). I told him I had just seen a Bonaparte's Gull so I was going to stick around a while. Steve continued to scan through the gulls and I watched out over the lake. That's when I saw a dark bird fly low along the beach and land on the Montrose fish hook pier. I went over to where Steve was and pointed out the bird. We both started taking pictures. The bird hung out on the west edge of the pier for a minute and then flew to the east edge before flying away. We lost sight of the bird as it flew off. We observed the bird for fewer than two minutes.

Steve and I talked about the bird and looked at our cameras but we weren't sure what we had seen. We considered Red Knot (*Calidris canutus*) but thought that it was more like a Willet (*Tringa semipalmata*). We decided to view the photos on a computer, thinking we'd see nothing more than a Willet.

Steve got home and posted some pictures to the Illinois Birders Forum-looking for identification help. Greg Neise immediately responded that it looked like a Wandering Tattler (*Tringa incana*) and word spread from there. Many birders checked the northeast Illinois lakefront the next couple of days but the Wandering Tattler was never seen again.

### Identification

A few birders mentioned that identification of this bird would need to rule out Gray-tailed Tattler (*Tringa brevipes*). Luckily, the tattler Steve and I photographed was in breeding plumage which made separation from Gray-tailed relatively straightforward. The Montrose tattler had heavy barring on the underside which included the undertail coverts. On Gray-tailed, the barring would be fine and not include the undertail. The Montrose tattler's white "eyebrow" ended at the eye whereas a Gray-tailed would have a more prominent rear supercilium. We were confident this was a Wandering Tattler and not Gray-tailed. I knew nothing of this at the time but have since studied both species in *The Shorebird Guide*

by O'Brien et al. (2006), confirming the identification with diagnostic field marks from our photos. Our photos are on file with the Illinois Ornithological Records committee who have confirmed and accepted this record by photographic evidence (see article in this issue.)

### Fall/winter distribution and other records

The normal fall and winter distribution for Wandering Tattler is along the Pacific coast of North America largely determined by presence of suitable rocky habitat with the tattler occurring from southern British Columbia south to Peru. The tattler is rather common on Clipperton Island, Cocos Island, Malpelo Island and the Galápagos Islands. There are uncommon records from eastern Australia and rare records for Japan (Gill et al. 2002). There are only about 15 records away from the Pacific. The most notable of these are Massachusetts (May 1968), Ontario (August 1948, July 1960 and June 1977), Manitoba (June 1981), Texas (April 1992), Arizona (September 1971) and Utah (September 2005) (Neise 2012). There are apparently also records for Alberta and eastern Washington and eastern Oregon (Gill 2002). This sighting represents the first record of this species for Illinois.

# Eighteenth Report of the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee

Evaluations by the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (IORC or “the Committee”) are reported here for a total of 31 records, including 29 accepted records of 20 species, one unaccepted record of one species, and one unaccepted historical record, resubmitted after two observers examined the specimen. A total of 51 observers contributed reports, including descriptions and photographs documenting these records. We continue to follow the conventions used in the first seventeen reports of the Committee (Stotz 2012). The records below are divided into two groups: Accepted and Unaccepted. The Accepted group is further divided into First State Records, Review List Records and Other Records. Nomenclature, English names and sequence of species conform to that of the seventh edition of the American Ornithologist's Union checklist, (1998) and its supplements, through the 53rd (Chesser et al. 2012).

Accepted records are entered with the locality, including county, the date, the IORC record number (in parentheses, the year of initial observation followed by a serial number), and the initials of the primary observer(s) who contributed specimens, descriptions, and/or photographs. Similar

information is provided for unaccepted records, except the observers remain anonymous, and a brief explanation of why the record was not accepted is given. The initials of a contributor without any further modification indicate that they contributed solely written documentation. When additional information was provided, a colon follows the observer's initials with the following codes: ph for photographic evidence, v for video, s for sound recording, and sp for a specimen. Many contributing photographers also submitted written documentation, a practice that the Committee strongly encourages. If the observer who first discovered the bird is known to the committee, their initials are set off from the initials of other contributors by a semicolon. Initial observers who did not submit documentation are not always listed. For specimen records, a # follows an abbreviation for the institution holding the specimen, along with that institution's catalog number of the specimen if available.

The Committee continues to encourage all observers of rare birds to submit documentation, even when multiple observers are involved in a sighting. Some records are deemed unacceptable due to incomplete information, which can often be resolved

by additional documentation. Photos are of course invaluable resources for the Committee, but there are times when a tricky ID can be resolved from written details not depicted in photos. Additionally, submitting documentation directly to the Committee, even if it involves strictly photos, resolves some ambiguity regarding copyright issues, etc. and is appreciated. It only takes a few moments to attach photos to an e-mail, and is greatly appreciated. Photos won't be republished without express permission, although there is hope to have any evidence submitted available in a searchable format eventually. Please see the field notes section of this issue for more photos of some of the entries below.


The Committee does not always take a position on the age or sex of a bird, and any such information given may be the observer's opinion, rather than the Committee's. All other remarks are the author's, although most of the information comes from the Committee files, which are now stored in Chicago, Illinois, in the Bird Division of the Field Museum.

In those cases where there are discrepancies between the details presented here and other published records, the data provided here represent the Committee's best assessment of all

### New State Records (two records of two species)

**Wandering Tattler** (*Tringa incana*) One well-photographed at Montrose Harbor in Chicago, Cook Co. on 9 Aug. 2012. (2012.026; ML:ph; SS:ph). This is the first accepted record for Illinois. See a detailed account in this issue.

**White-crested/Small-billed Elaenia** (*Elaenia albiceps/parvirostris*) One very well-photographed at Douglas Park, Chicago, Cook Co. 17-22 April (2012.007; AG:ph, EtG:ph; JL:ph, MF:ph, NG:ph, MB:ph, NL:ph, RS:ph, BT:ph, SI:v, CB:ph, JG:ph, KK:ph, JH:ph, LR:ph). The Committee voted unanimously to accept this bird as an *Elaenia* sp., while seeking additional advice on the identification to species. Regardless of species, this is the first accepted record of any *elaenia* in Illinois. See Meadowlark 22: for a detailed account.







Documentation of out of season records and first state nesting records should be sent to the seasonal editor of the Field Notes in the Meadowlark. These may be considered by the Committee, as well as those submitted for the Christmas Bird Count and Spring Bird Count.

### Acknowledgements

The author would like to make a special acknowledgement of Doug Stotz, whose work as secretary of the Committee for many years has made this report possible. Those observers who provide the Committee with records to consider are also worth mention. Their tireless devotion adds immeasurably to our knowledge of the birds of Illinois. The members of the Committee should be commended for their intelligent, careful reviews, including Bob Hughes (former member), Josh Engel, Dan Kassebaum, Travis Mahan, Keith McMullen, and Vice-Secretary Geoff Williamson. 

# Field Notes:

## The 2012 Fall Migration

Douglas F. Stotz for a decade, fall 2002 through fall 2011, compiled the fall field notes for the *Meadowlark*. His insightful notes on the distributional trends during the fall migration of birds throughout the state were received by so many new birders, seasoned birders, and professional ornithologists alike. His sifting out of significant data points during each of the those seasons simply made for a better journal. From noting rarities like Sooty Tern, Grace's Warbler, Green-tailed Towhee, and so many other avian waifs which occurred during his tenure to issues like West Nile Virus, conservation concerns, effects of weather on migrants like hurricane-borne species, birds ahead of or behind a weather front, numerical spikes or irruptions of certain species, and more--Doug always gave us great reflective and scientific notes. Thank you Doug—very much for all your hard work and professionalism—it has been sincerely appreciated.

Extreme hot and dry conditions can best describe the beginning of the autumnal field season. Chicago and Rockford recorded their warmest summers on record. The 2012 year was the fifth driest year on record and second warmest for Illinois and the state was in a significant drought right up to the beginning of fall migration. Groundwater levels were 2 feet below normal and streamflow and water surface levels were below normal. However, by the end of August temperatures were near normal, plus an enormous amount of rainfall occurred in the central and southern parts of state due to Hurricane Isaac thus ending Illinois's drought in most areas of the state by September and October and putting the state—at least—in a recovery stage from the drought (Illinois State Water Survey, Aug-Oct 2012, Illinois State Climatologist). A positive effect of the early unseasonably hot weather and drought was the dry shorelines of the Mississippi and Illinois rivers providing an ample amount of exposed mudflats to hold hundreds if not thousands of migrating shorebirds.

The most outstanding rarity to be found this fall was the state's first **WANDERING TATTLER** discovered at Montrose's fish hook pier by Matthew Ligas. (See IORC report in this issue). Both Matthew Ligas and Steve Spitzer photographed this amazing interior North American record. See a more complete account in this journal. Other notable rarities included a **BRANT** at IBSP, **REDDISH EGRET** at Rend Lake, **WHITE IBISes** at Burkesville Lakes and Carlyle Lake, **SWALLOW-TAILED KITES** at three locations, a **FERRUGINOUS HAWK** at GVHW, a **RUFF** at Rice Lake State CA, **LITTLE GULL** at Lake Springfield, **WHITE-WINGED DOVE** at IBSP, **BURROWING OWL** at Montrose, two **RUFIOUS HUMMINGBIRDS**, **PRAIRIE**

**FALCON** in Douglas Co, a **SAY'S PHOEBE** at IBSP, two **ASH-THROATED FLYCATCHERS** at separate locations, several reports of **CAVE SWALLOWS** in northern Illinois, a **BEWICK'S WREN** in Sangamon Co, a **VARIED THRUSH** at MArb, a banded **SAGE THRASHER** in Winnebago Co, three **BOHEMIAN WAXWING** reports, a first southern Illinois **GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW** in Wayne Co, two **HOARY REDPOLL** reports, and finally--multiple **EVENING GROSBEAK** reports. As always it should be noted that several of the above rarities are still subject to a final review by IORC.

### Ducks through Hawks

Many observers lamented the tardy arrival of arctic geese. Nevertheless, the 30,000 Snow Geese and 12 Ross's Geese at Carlyle Lake and 2,250 Cackling Geese at Rocelle in Ogle Co were noteworthy. A rare flyby Brant was noted at IBSP. Shovelers, Northern Pintail, Green-winged and Blue-winged Teal were noted in good numbers along the Illinois River Valley. Most remarkable were the 50,000 Lesser Scaup at Carlyle Lake in November. The only Harlequin Duck was a one day wonder at Montrose. All three scoters made good showing with a particularly good day at GillsonP on 28 Oct with seven Surf, 85 White-winged, and 28 Black Scoters seen by multiple observers. Common Mergansers barely made it into the state with a maximum count of only 12 in Kendall Co on 18 Nov.

Conspicuous by their near absence were low numbers of game birds except for, perhaps, Wild Turkey reported in 43 counties. There were only two Pacific Loons reports: one in Tazewell Co and another (the same bird?) in Woodford Co. The early arrival of a Red-necked Grebe on LSpfld on 10 Oct was noteworthy as one of 4-5 reports. Only three Eared Grebes were noted and at least 4 Western Grebes were noted this season with a Jo Daviess Co bird being a bit extraordinary. Two Neotropical Cormorants were noted: one at IBPS and the other downstate at Carlyle Lake both in Sep. The "whiteness" of 7,400 American White Pelicans at HennepinL must have been extraordinary. The post-breeding dispersals of Snowy Egrets and Little Blue Herons during the dry August was very substantial and 88 Cattle Egrets noted at Emiquon was a good tally. The **REDDISH EGRET** at Rend Lake, a first well documented occurrence (by photograph) for southern Illinois certainly was one of the finest finds in the waterbirds department. There were too few reports of Yellow-crowned Night-Herons perhaps more difficult to detect in fall. A report of three adult White Ibis at Burkesville Lakes (Monroe Co)

and another at Carlyle Lake were excellent finds. The fall hawk migration at IBHW and GVHW was rather mediocre, however, there were some very interesting observations including Greene Valley's first (imm.) FERRUGINOUS Hawk plus a Swainson's Hawk at GVHW and IBHW plus four other locations. IBHW noted its first SWALLOW-TAILED KITE, another SWALLOW-TAILED KITE was noted at Middlefork Savanna, and still another at Homer Lake in Champaign Co. Up to four Mississippi Kites were noted at IBHW early in the season. Thirty-three Bald Eagles noted at HennepinL was an excellent number for August. The 2,564 Broad-winged Hawks at GVHW was the maximum. Six Golden Eagles were reported state-wide with the southernmost being at Carlyle Lake.

## Rails through Woodpeckers

There were only two Yellow Rail reports both at Prairie Ridge State Natural Area (Jasper Co).

A remarkable Sandhill Crane flight occurred when over 20,000+ cranes passed through northeastern Illinois on 23 Nov. Five sightings of Whooping Cranes presumed to be from the "flight schools" and the re-introduction program were noteworthy as mostly fly-overs.

Shorebirds were noted in good to excellent numbers this season perhaps largely due to the extensive drought and draw-downs of lakes and shorelines. Emiquon now appears to be the center for Black-necked Stilts with a maximum of 15 there in early August. A maximum count of 36 American Avocets at Turtle Lake Adams Co were noteworthy as well as the late departing date of two at Emiquon on 25 Nov. Three Piping Plovers were noted this fall. It bares repeating but the WANDERING TATTLER at Montrose on 9 August was the standout rarity report of this fall season. The 29 Willets at Montrose was the maximum count. A shorebird species of special concern is the Upland Sandpiper; thus the six at Rockford Intl Airport was noteworthy this fall. Inland Whimbrels were at Lake Decatur and LaSalle Lake FWA. A RUFF at Rice Lake CA was a rarity for the Illinois River Valley. Both godwits were noted throughout the state but the 50 Hudsonian Godwits at Carlyle Lake, Fayette Co on 13 Aug must have flabbergasted the observers! Ruddy Turnstone and Red Knot fall counts seem to be on the decline—the max count for turnstones was 14 at Montrose and there were only two knot reports. The 150 Stilt Sandpipers certainly was an outstanding number tallied for early October. The maximum count of Sanderlings was 44 at Montrose. Buff-breasted Sandpiper certainly made an outstanding showing this season with at least 22 county reports with a maximum count of 33 at Rend Lake. Least Sandpipers and Pectoral Sandpipers were in excellent numbers along the Illinois River Valleys. The 25 Western Sandpipers at Carlyle Lake on 22 Jul was an excellent tally for a difficult to detect fall migratory shorebird in Illinois. The 300 Long-billed Dowitchers at Chautauqua NWR was a very good tally. American Woodcocks were stressed by the drought conditions and many birds were seen in unusual locations including backyard sprinkling systems.

All three phalaropes put on a good showing this fall with Red-necked Phalaropes being reported in 18 counties with a maximum of 31 at Sawmill Lake (Putnam Co) along the Illinois River Valley.

Only one identifiable jaeger was noted: an apparent

Parasitic Jaeger at GillsonP. The only kittiwake report was an individual at Montrose in early November. There were five Sabine's Gull reports from the Mississippi River, Illinois River and Lake Springfield. The 10,000 Bonapartes Gulls at Lake Carlyle must have been a spectacular sight. The only LITTLE GULL sighting was of an adult at Lake Springfield in late Nov. Seven Laughing Gulls were reported and Franklin's Gulls were noted in 19 counties with a maximum of 100 at Carlyle Lake. An adult California Gull was noted at Carlyle Lake. Lesser Black-backed Gulls certainly are on the rise with eight reported at the Lake County Fairgrounds. The only Glaucous Gull report was of an adult at Loyola Park on the Chicago lakefront. The first cycle Great Black-backed Gull at Carlyle Lake was noteworthy. A Least Tern was in Madison Co. A widespread Black Tern movement was noted this fall with reports in 21 counties with a maximum count of 200 at Carlyle Lake. Eurasian Collared-Doves are still on the rise with reports in 43 counties. A WHITE-WINGED DOVE was at IBSP. Cuckoos exited the state barely being noticed. There was only one report of a Snowy Owl that of an injured imm. male in DeKalb Co. A BURROWING OWL made a two day appearance at Montrose remarkably widely separated by more than a week. Northern Saw-whet Owls staged an excellent movement into our state with a maximum total of 28 at Sand Bluff Observatory. Common Nighthawks were not so common this fall. 2,500 Chimney Swifts staging at Bloomington must have been a swirling sight to behold! Staging numbers of Ruby-throated Hummingbirds in southern Illinois can be staggering; so, 158 in Monroe County was remarkable. There were two confirmed RUFIOUS HUMMINGBIRDS in Illinois both of which were banded by Vernon M. Kleen with an additional *Selasphorus* sp. being reported. A welcoming note were that Red-headed Woodpeckers were reported in 66 counties.. Noteworthy also were Pileated Woodpecker observations in 55 counties. A PRAIRIE FALCON was a rare falcon noted in Douglas Co. Forty-four Merlins was the maximum count this fall for the IBHW and a very early Merlin was noted on 12 Aug in Sangamon Co. DuPage and Cook Co are the hold out counties for Monk Parakeet with a maximum count of 50 parakeets at JacksonP, a major population center for this introduced species.

## Passerines

Flycatchers are difficult to detect during fall migration; so the 21 Eastern Wood-Pewees at HennepinL were noteworthy as well as the Olive-sided Flycatchers noted in 19 counties this fall. This was a season of unusual flycatchers, too, with a SAY'S PHOEBE noted at IBSP, two ASH-THROATED FLYCATCHERS, two Scissor-tailed Flycatchers, and two Western Kingbirds. There were just six reports of Loggerhead Shrike. An early 23 Aug Blue-headed Vireo was noted in Carroll Co and a straggler on 1 Nov in Kane County was late. Crow and Blue Jay numbers seemed low this season. Purple Martin's numbers seem low with just 412 reported at Lake Springfield. Tree Swallow numbers in contrast were staggering with 20,000 – 25,000 at Carlyle Lake. There were three CAVE SWALLOW reports along Lake Michigan with one diagnostic photo at IBSP-N Unit during the IBHW. A very tardy Northern Rough-winged Swallow was still in Kankakee Co till the end of the period. While many passerine numbers seemed to be low due to drought conditions or an early migration the 27 Sedge Wrens at Northerly Island was a remarkable number

in mid September. The BEWICK'S WREN in Sangamon Co on 12 & 27 Oct was a first fall record since 1981 and the latest fall date for that county. The thrush migration seemed better than normal. A late date for Swainson's Thrush was 26 Nov in Kankakee Co. A VARIED THRUSH stayed for about a week at MARB in early November. Northern Mockingbirds were noted in 36 counties. On 29 Sep a SAGE THRASHER was netted and banded at Sand Bluff Observatory, Winnebago Co. Longspur and Snow Bunting numbers seemed lower than normal and there was only one report of a Smith's Longspur.

Warblers seemed to be on the move early. Early dates noted were Northern Waterthrush: 2 Aug; Golden-winged Warbler: 11 Aug; Blue-winged Warbler: 2 Aug; Black-and White Warbler: 23 Jul; Tennessee Warbler: 2 Aug; Nashville Warbler: 11 Aug; Connecticut Warbler: 20 Aug; Mourning Warbler: 10 Aug; American Redstart: 5 Aug; Cape May Warbler: 12 Aug; Cerulean Warbler: 3 Aug; Northern Parula: 2 Aug; Magnolia Warbler: 12 Aug; Bay-breasted Warbler: 17 Aug; Blackburnian Warbler: 5 Aug; Chestnut-sided Warbler: 11 Aug; Black-throated Blue Warbler: 21 Aug; Palm Warbler: 22 Aug; Pine Warbler: 18 Aug; Yellow-rumped Warbler: 6 Aug; Black-throated Green Warbler: 5 Aug; Canada Warbler: 12 Aug; Wilson's Warbler: 12 Aug. A noteworthy late date for departure was 16-20 Oct for a Blue-winged Warbler at Montrose. Other tardy warblers included: Tennessee, 8 Nov; Nashville, 17 Nov; Black-and-white, 20 Oct; Common Yellowthroat, 24 Nov; Cape May, 7 Nov; Northern Parula, 20 Oct; Yellow Warbler, 10 Oct. Only one Spotted Towhee was noted in Mason Co. A Vesper Sparrow was tardy in Sangamon Co on 28 Nov. Henslow's Sparrows were reported in 16 counties this fall with a maximum count of 12 at Rollins Sav on 23 Sep. Very good numbers of both LeConte's and Nelson's Sparrows

were reported this fall with a maximum count of 16 Nelson's at Rollins Sav. Harris's Sparrow were well noted this fall. The first southern Illinois record of GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW was an imm. in Wayne Co. A Summer Tanager at Montrose on 13 Nov certainly was tardy. A Rose-breasted Grosbeak at Nauvoo on 24 Nov was very tardy. A Yellow-headed Blackbird lingered until 10 Nov in Adams Co. 200 Brewer's Blackbirds at Carlyle Lake was noteworthy and seemingly Rusty Blackbirds were detected more often this fall. Orioles seemed to clear out quickly this fall with most orioles gone by late August. Eurasian Tree Sparrows are entrenched in the Central Illinois River valley with very good numbers reported there this fall.

### Irruption Species

In spite of the drought and early hot fall weather—winter finches made an excellent showing this fall! After nearly a decade of winter finch paucity (except for an excellent White-winged Crossbill irruption and siskin/redpoll invasion during the Winter of 2008/2009) many observers noted a "spectacular" irruption which seemed to develop rather early—as early as August-- particularly with Purple Finch, Red Crossbills, and siskins. White-winged Crossbills and Evening Grosbeaks came in early Nov and redpolls as early as the end of October with the finch irruption continuing into November and winter. The crossbills: both Red and White-winged, and Evening Grosbeaks, however, did not linger long. Along with the winter finches Red-breasted Nuthatches were ubiquitous, observers often noting them commonly in deciduous woods and often in record numbers for their observation sites; they, too, came early--during the first two weeks of August. Bohemian Waxwings--always noteworthy--were detected at

Northern Shrikes staged an excellent migration in 11 counties with two reports in southern Illinois: one imm. at PrRdg-M and another photographed at Forbes SP by Leroy Harrison. Rough-legged Hawks staged a good movement into Illinois with a maximum count of 19 at IBHW in late November.

This summary of the fall or autumnal season would not be possible without the submission of sightings, field notes, and commentary by observers throughout the state. 


























