President's Message

Dear Members:

It's late July as I write this message. The volume of posts on IBET is down to a trickle. Posters are down to a few birders who are out every weekend no matter the weather, sun, rain, hail or thunder storms. Quite a few of my birding circle are off to distant locales often mixing birding with other activities.

That is the great thing about birding. No matter where you go and whatever the primary reason for the trip, there are usually birding opportunities. In my case I have just returned from a trip to the Jersey Shore for a business meeting. On the last afternoon we headed out to sea on a fishing excursion. A little reluctantly I was persuaded to take up a fishing rod. There were a few Laughing Gulls and Great Blackbacks hanging round, but nothing else. So I accepted a rod. Imagine my delight sometime later when a small black bird danced over the waves in the wake of our boat just as I fought to land a sizable Bluefish. It was a Wilson's Storm-petrel, supposedly the world's most numerous species yet one I had not seen before. Before the end of the day nine more Wilson's passed by.

It is not easy balancing a fishing rod and binoculars in a pitching sea, but it was worth it even in the face of the vociferous displeasure of the boat's mate who wanted the focus on fish. Two Band-Rumped Stormies briefly joined the Wilson's as did a small flock of Cory's Shearwaters.

The excursion took me back to my teenage years and trips to and from the offshore island sanctuaries in northern New Zealand waters. On a typical trip we would see up to five species of shearwater, a pterodroma or two, Giant Petrel, Cape Pigeon, Diving Petrel, White-faced Storm-Petrel and, if we were lucky, an albatross.

Watching tubenoses effortlessly handle stormy weather is one of the great birding experiences. They skim first low over the water disappearing down a trough behind a wave and moments later emerging in soaring arcs high over the wave crests before disappearing once again into a sea of whitecaps. Some soar, some skim down the waves and yet others skip from crest to crest. Each species has its characteristic flight pattern.

I trust you all are getting much pleasure out of your birding activities this summer and look forward to seeing many of you on one or other of our upcoming field trips – the Carlyle Lake Pelagic on Sept. 20 and the Sprague's Pipit Walk on Oct. 25.

Good birding.

On the hunt for Sprague's Pipit:

a composite of Sprague's Pipit observations from Southern Illinois and Southwestern Missouri, with tips on locating the bird

The value of Bohlen's The Birds of Illinois (1989) and the various state birding publications since 1974 cannot be understated when it comes to knowing where and when a species is likely to occur in Illinois. Beginning with the spring migration of 1974, comprehensive seasonal data summaries have been available to Illinois birders through the Illinois Audubon Bulletin (numbers 170-210), Illinois Birds & Birding (volumes 1-7) and Meadowlark (volumes 1-16). With these publications, one can assemble a migratory window and plot the best time to look for the more unusual species of Illinois. This is especially true for Sprague's Pipit (Anthus spragueii). Although data for this species in Illinois are sparse, patterns for the spring and fall can be found.

My first encounter with this species was on 20 April 2000. I had located an Upland Sandpiper (Bartramia longicauda) in an agricultural field in Clinton County. While viewing the sandpiper, I heard a persistent flight song high overhead. Horned Lark (Eremophila alpestris) was the most likely candidate, but I soon realized I was hearing the flight song of a Sprague's Pipit. I attempted to locate the bird with my binoculars. Although I could clearly hear the bird calling overheard from what seemed like a fixed position, I could not find it in the sky. When I got home, I confirmed the song with several commercial recordings. I also checked Bohlen (1989) and was relieved to see that the record fell perfectly within the window of data for spring migrants. I know of no other Illinois reports that claim to have heard the Sprague's Pipit in full flight song during migration. This record was submitted with documentation

to the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (IORC), but the outcome is still pending.


In the summer of 2003, I traveled to North Dakota with Louise Augustine, specifically targeting Sprague's Pipit and Baird's Sparrow (Ammodramus bairdii). On their breeding grounds, both these species are easy to observe. During this trip, I watched several Sprague's Pipits perform their flight song. It is amazing to see the height at which this behavior occurs. The pipit can fly as high as 75 meters during its courtship ritual. These observations further strengthened my confidence that the report from 20 April 2000 in Clinton County was valid.

My next encounter was with Travis Mahan on 12 November 2006. We were at the Denmark Unit of Pyramid State Park (Perry County) looking for the previously reported Burrowing Owl (Athene cunicularia). Pyramid State Park is mostly composed of reclaimed strip mine, some of which is leased as cattle pasture. The area is huge and the grasses are sparse due to poor soil quality and grazing. While trying to locate hidden roosting burrows for the owl, we flushed a bird with an odd squeaky call. Because our concentration was to the ground, we were slow to react and could not locate the "squeaky" bird overhead. We quickly dismissed American Pipit (Anthus rubescens), Horned Lark, and any sparrow or longspur as the source of the sound and were excited at the prospect of Sprague's Pipit. We fanned out over the area but could not produce another bird. We compared our observation with the call notes recorded on the National Geographic Society - Guide to Bird Sounds (1985) and Flight Calls of Migratory Birds

– Eastern North American Landbirds (2002). The calls we heard in the field matched perfectly with those recordings. Both the Peterson (1990, 1992) and Stokes (1997, 1999) recordings include Sprague's Pipit, but only the flight song and not the call note. From my experience, knowing the call note will greatly increase your chances of identifying this bird in the field.

At this point, I pieced together the migratory windows from Bohlen (1989) and the subsequent issues of Illinois Birds and Birding and Meadowlark. I also found a few more obscure records from the Illinois Audubon Bulletin prior to the Seasonal Reports beginning in 1974 and a few recent IBET postings that have not been published. The spring migratory window, based on 18 records. extends from 16 March through 9 May, with most records concentrated around 20 April. The fall window, based on 12 records, extends from 1 October through 12 November, with a concentration of records during the last week of October. Table 1 summarizes the records and reports found for Sprague's Pipit in Illinois.

Based on the observation from 12 November 2006 and records of wintering Sprague's Pipits in southern Illinois, Travis Mahan planned a fall IOS field trip at Pyramid State Park on 10 November 2007 with Sprague's Pipit as the target species. Although the limited fall data suggested late October as the better window, we proceeded as planned. As expected, the turnout was low given that this species has no history of being found in Illinois on demand. A few local southern Illinois birders came, and only Craig Taylor and Tim Kuesel made the trip from up north.



We began our search in the pasture where Travis and I had located the bird in November 2006 and walked for quite a while without any luck. We were probably too spread out and had we flushed a pipit, we would not have been able to get the entire group on the bird. We moved to another nearby pasture, this time flushing two Sprague's Pipits. Quite luckily, as we advanced from the road into the pasture, we were funneled to a lane of fescue leading to a large dove hunting field within the park. The first bird flushed within a few feet of my position as I entered the lane. It called loudly and repeatedly, but not as loud as my attempt to get the group on the bird. Ideally, the sun was at our back, and we could plainly see the bold white outer tail feathers as the bird spiraled high into the sky. It climbed in a wide circling pattern as if it were looking for a good place to land. I continually called out its position to make sure the group was on the bird. I got a few positive responses and alerted them to anticipate the dramatic dive as this species falls from the sky to land. I had not yet observed this behavior, but knew well

enough what to expect. When you do see it, you are left with little doubt as to the identity of the bird. We marked the spot where the bird landed with intents on flushing it again. On a hunch, I continued down the grassy lane hoping for another pipit. I took only a few more steps and another Sprague's Pipit called as it flushed. We watched it as before, but this bird flushed in the opposite direction and was backlit. With the rolling contour of the strip mines, we were unable to view the dramatic descent as the pipit flew beyond our horizon. We went into the pasture to look for the first pipit, but were unable to relocate it. My next encounter with this species was on 21 March 2008. I returned to the Denmark Unit of Pyramid State Park. March may be the early window for this species, but a search on this date was justified by two other records - 16 March 1957 (Gallatin County) and 19 March 2006 (Fulton County). I entered the same field as the observations from the previous fall and flushed three Sprague's Pipits. Although all three birds were observed in the same field, they flushed separately and seemed to be in loose

association with several Savannah Sparrows (Passerculus sandwichensis). The birds sought the thicker tufts of grass to avoid the extremely windy conditions. When flushed, the first two birds did not call nor fly very far and resettled only a few yards opposite my position. I was able to observe them briefly in flight and then leisurely on the ground as they moved ahead of me keeping a safe distance. After several repeated flushes, the first two birds remained well hidden and could not be located. The third bird flushed at my feet and called loudly. Because of the wind, I had pulled my hood up over my head, which obscured my peripheral vision. Therefore, when the bird flushed, I was unable to locate it in flight. Keith McMullen and I returned to the pasture the following morning, but we could not find any pipits. On the return trip the winds were even stronger and from the opposite direction. The strong winds may have prompted the birds to select another field or to move on.

On 20 April 2008, Mark Seiffert and I went to look for a Sprague's Pipit in Clinton County. Mark Seiffert went to great lengths with a county plat book to seek out properties that would allow us access to their fields. We selected a huge field with an unusually large crown. It seemed ideal as it had corn stubble from the previous fall, some sections of clover and alfalfa, and best of all, vehicle-sized lanes of fescue to prevent erosion. We drove to the crest of the field and began walking through the clover and alfalfa. Large numbers of Savannah Sparrows were present, likely a good

indicator of adequate food and cover for other migrants. Eventually, we made our way back through one of the grassy lanes of fescue and flushed a Sprague's Pipit. It called loudly as it took off. We quickly got on the bird and watched it climb high into the sky. We called out its position to make sure we were both on the same bird. As expected, the pipit folded its wings and dropped to the ground like a rock. Just before landing, the bird made a lateral swing before touching down. As I had done the previous fall, I continued down the grassy lane hoping for another pipit, and sure enough, a second bird flushed. We watched it fly off calling loudly, climb high into the sky, and eventually land in the same dramatic fashion.

Observing and identifying this species in the field, in most cases, requires a planned search. Select either a spring or fall date near the median of the migratory window. Select a large area of pasture or farm field with appropriate cover. Grassy lanes within these areas seem to be especially ideal. Suitable areas are likely available in most Illinois counties. Gaining access to a pasture or field may be your limiting factor. From my experience, this is not a species likely to be observed on the ground or easily photographed. Looks will be fleeting at best, and one must be satisfied with a brief encounter. Knowing well the flight calls and flight behaviors of Horned Lark, American Pipit, Savannah Sparrow, Vesper Sparrow (Pooecetes gramineus), Lapland Longspur (Calcarius lapponicus), and Smith's Longspur (Calcarius pictus) are essential, as these species share similar open habitats and must be considered when a bird flushes at your feet.

Prior to the IOS fieldtrip to Pyramid State Park on 10 November 2007, Joe Eades of St. Louis, Missouri shared with us his most recent observations of Sprague's Pipit in southwestern Missouri. His details are provided below.

I had the distinct pleasure of seeing and hearing a total of eight Sprague's Pipits on the prairies of southwestern Missouri on Sunday, 4 November 2007. That is my personal high count and personal latest fall date for Missouri. The prairies of southwestern Missouri are a long way from my home in the St. Louis area, so I don't check them weekly. In a normal year, I would have thought 10 November (the date of the 2007 IOS trip seeking this species), might have been a little late to seek this species at this latitude.

I have seen this species each of the last five years in Missouri. Over the last three years, I have targeted this species around Halloween and have been successful each of those years. My first encounter with Sprague's Pipit in Missouri was 17 October 2003. That is my personal earliest fall date for this species in Missouri. Conventional wisdom indicates that the fall migratory window for this species in Missouri occurs from mid-October through the first ten days of November, though there are late September records. This year, I was unable to locate one on my traditional end of October search. I believed the peak passage was slightly delayed in 2007, and the timing of the IOS fieldtrip may have been very good, and as noted above, it was!

The Sprague's Pipit is considered a rare transient in western Missouri (Robbins and Easterla 1992), and can be very difficult to find. It is rarely reported outside of western Missouri and until recently was considered hypothetical for the eastern part of the state. In general, only those who make a serious effort at the proper locations and at the right time of year will encounter this species in Missouri. I am only aware of a few individuals who have seen this species in Missouri over the past five years. Most records are from the fall. One recent spring record from eastern Missouri has been accepted by the Missouri Bird Records Committee (MBRC). The sighting occurred 5 May 2005, St. Charles County (MBRC 18th Annual Report, record #2005:45). There is only one other accepted record for the well-birded Missouri section within the St. Louis Area (a circle radiating 50 miles from the St. Louis City limits) - 19 October 1992, St. Charles County (MBRC 6th Annual Report). The paucity of reports from this region is largely a result of geological factors: Most of east-central Missouri is forested and the wooded Ozarks act as an "island" that separates the prairies of western Missouri from those in Illinois. Another factor is that areas of appropriate habitat on public land near St. Louis are very few. Extensive walking is a requirement. It is almost always difficult to get a good look at one.

Behavioral and visual clues

There are several behavioral and visual clues that can be helpful in identifying a Sprague's Pipit. Usually, they flush nearby and appear long and slender as they fly away from you, like a very pale Horned Lark. When the white outer tail feathers flash, the white is very extensive, almost like that of a Dark-eyed Junco (*Junco hyemalis*) and much more than a Vesper Sparrow. This, plus their very pale coloration and slender shape, is distinctive. When on the ground, they are very pale blonde but may appear

pale grayish in flight. The bill can be very pale and appears thicker than that of an American Pipit. Because of this, if the bird is flying away from you (which it will be!), the bill can appear too big and conical to be this species. You may be tempted to write it off as a sparrow. Keep watching it! The flight is very undulating, with a very long, loping pattern of undulation. Shortly after take-off, you will likely hear a "jeet" or a "jeet, jeet, jeet", usually in sequence, which is strident and monotonal and very different from the up-and-down goldfinch-like flight call of the American Pipit. They continue to utter this call, but it becomes faint as the bird builds distance from you. They then begin to climb "giant steps" into the sky with this long undulating flight, gaining altitude rapidly in an exponentially accelerating curve. Once they reach a considerable height of 250-300 feet, they begin making broad circles. This may go on for a few minutes, and they sometimes appear to be looking back at where they were flushed. If you are still standing there, they usually turn away and fly off some distance further and then suddenly fold their wings to their side, point their head down, and drop at a very steep angle like a stone, practically all the way to the ground. They break their fall so close to the ground that it may actually be unusual to see it happen, especially if the grass is waist high. They appear to crash into the ground. It is an amazing sight.

If the bird in question breaks its fall 20-30 feet from the ground or higher, it is probably not this species. Smith's Longspurs sometimes drop from a considerable height, but they break their fall earlier with a couple of "stutter steps" from a height of about 30 feet. Keep in mind that this habit is shared by other birds of the open field, though none drop so dramatically and perpendicular to the ground in my experience. Even Horned Larks can drop suddenly and very steeply from a considerable height.

Directly overhead and at close range, the buffy underparts and necklace of streaks limited to the upper breast, as well as the relatively thin "pipit bill" and plain face, may be seen. It will probably be calling, a squeaky "jeet, jeet, jeet", which may help you with the identification. Chris Hobbs, an expert Kansas and Missouri birder, has described the flight call as "sounding like a robin on helium."

Improving your chances

If the entire group of birders drops to the ground quickly after flushing a good suspect, the bird may come back and land very close to where it flushed. Alternatively, if you leave that area and come back in 30 minutes, it is very likely that the bird will have returned to the same spot. This happened with three of the four Sprague's Pipits that I flushed at Prairie State Park in southwestern Missouri on 4 November 2007. The tendency for the bird to come back to the same area can make it difficult to determine how many birds are present. You may well flush the same bird more than once.

They will drop into tall grass, but definitely prefer short grass, about the height of that of a golf course fairway. I look for them in close-cropped native prairie grasses, such as on Greater Prairie-Chicken (*Tympanuchus cupido*) leks or hayed native grass fields. I usually walk about 10-15 feet from

an edge of taller grass and concentrate on hilltops and the slopes leading up to and down from these.

Sometimes, you will get lucky and a Sprague's Pipit will fly low for only about 50 feet. If this happens, mark the spot immediately and get to it quickly. Stop about 25 feet from the spot and watch for the bird to stick its head up. This may get you once-in-alifetime looks. They allow fairly close approach, but you must be restrained because they generally flush at about 15-20 feet. I watched one from a distance of 25 feet in perfect light for 15 minutes on the ground on November 4, 2007. That opportunity doesn't come every day. If you have a group, you should try encircling the area where the bird landed in a manner similar to that used for good looks at Le Conte's Sparrow (Ammodramus leconteii). The bird will attempt to mouse away and may well be successful if you do not act quickly and stealthily.

IOS awards five grants for important research projects

One of IOS's primary objectives is "to promote scientific research and education in order to improve knowledge and awareness of birds in Illinois."

This year, 2008, IOS, with the support of the DuPage Birding Club and a group of private donors, has awarded five research grants, each at \$500.

Mark Alessi of the University of Illinois in Champaign, in cooperation with the Illinois Natural History Survey, is studying the reproductive strategies of Yellowbreasted Chats (Icteria veerns), including how they behave after a nest loss, what cues they may use in deciding where to renest, and how much habitat they need during the breeding season. This research includes fitting up to 15 male and female chats with a harness-style

radio transmitter (weighing less than 1.2 grams). The study location is Kennekuk County Park, in Vermilion County near Danville.

To follow the tagged birds during the season, two 20-meter towers containing the automatic recording units (ARUs) are being built to allow line of sight

tracking of the tagged chats.

Little is known about the breeding strategies of chats: This research will be used to provide information to land managers

on how to better accommodate this declining species. Because shrublands are historically ephemeral, chats may not see habitat isolation in the same perspective as, for example, woodland birds. Crossing inhospitable habitat (roads, streams, woodlands) may not be as costly for birds using shrubland habitat.

Dr. Richard Essner and Dr. Peter Minchin of Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville are developing a multivariate habitat model for the Cerulean Warbler (Dendroica cerulea), along with other neotropical migrant songbirds in Southwestern Illinois.

Forested bluffs in southwestern Illinois attract

large numbers of migrating songbirds due to their location near the confluence of the Mississippi, Missouri, and Illinois Rivers. Agricultural use (and more recent urbanization) dramatically fragmented and reduced these once extensive forests, but they still support a diverse avifauna, including the Cerulean Warbler, which will be placed on the state-threatened list this year, and which in the late 1800s was the most abundant warbler in Illinois. Ceruleans are the most rapidly declining warbler species

in the United States. Despite this decline, Illinois holds four sites ranked in the top 20 for cerulean abundance in the United States.

The study will census bluff forest avifauna to generate baseline data for use in future sampling programs aimed at monitoring long term population trends. It will generate a predictive model, which uses vegetation data to identify suitable habitat for Ceruleans and other target species. This model will inform future land-use decisions and assist conservation efforts in southwestern Illinois. IOS grant funds will purchase a rangefinder for fixed-distance point count surveys.

Benjamin J. O'Neal of the University of Illinois is carrying out the second year of a research program aimed at studying American Golden-Plovers (Pluvialis dominica), to determine habitat preferences of this species during migration through our state. Illinois supports a substantial portion of the hemispheric population: Tens of thousands of American Golden-Plovers pass through east-central Illinois during their flight from their wintering to breeding grounds.

Volunteer student technicians from the University of Illinois chapter of The Wildlife Society conducted concurrent roadside surveys at the peak of migration

during spring 2008, the second year of the planned 3-year study (2007-2009). In addition to abundance estimates, the project documents and analyzes the characteristics of habitat used by plovers (crop type, tillage practice, relative moisture, and landscape position). The findings will support future conservation

efforts for this species by documenting population numbers and by identifying priority locations that reliably host large numbers of American Golden-Plovers. Identifying habitat associations will yield recommendations applicable to intense row-crop agriculture and

the growing presence of wind farms.

The first year of this project increased knowledge of plover abundance and habitat selection during spring migration. Surveying this mobile and widespread species proved to require intense sampling efforts, both spatially and temporally.

Adam Phillips

of Southern Illinois University at Carbondale is studying the impact of **exotic Mute Swans** (*Cygnus olor*) on natural wetlands, focusing on the swans' destructive feeding habits and aggressive behavior. Study areas include Banner Marsh and Spring Lake.

More than 85 percent of historic wetland habitat within Illinois has been

lost. Further impacting the remaining habitat available to native waterbird species has been the introduction of exotic species like the Mute Swan), which has been a part of Illinois' avifauna since at least 1971. Past research indicates these swans have the ability (from their feeding habits) to further reduce Illinois wetlands' ability to support native waterbirds. They eat large amounts of submerged aquatic vegetation, which may

in turn increase invasion rates of less desirable exotic vegetation species like Eurasian watermilfoil. This very aggressive species may

also exclude native waterbirds from quality foraging and breeding habitats.

The study's goals are to determine the swans' impact on native submerged aquatic vegetation communities and water quality, and to determine whether the presence of swans influences the distribution of both migrating and breeding native waterbirds.

Stephanie Plautz of Southern Illinois University at Carbondale is studying whether the lead shot ingestion rate by Mourning Doves is related to the density of shot on the ground. The study will provide evidence (pro or con) relating to the acute toxicosis hypothesis for this species – whether previous research showing ingestion of from 1% to 6.5% lead shot by doves collected in the field is correct, or whether this range underestimates actual ingestion rates because of rapid mortality of the doves after they ingest the lead shot.

This determination will provide important information in the debate over banning lead shot in Mourning Dove hunting. Two-hundred-fifty

doves will be captured using Kniffin traps, then housed on the wildlife lab property at the SIU Carbondale campus during the course of the experimental program. The grant money provided by IOS will be used to construct 10 cages for the doves, each cage to house 25 doves for the duration of the study. Blood chemistry, X-ray examination, and other techniques are to be

used to monitor lead concentration in dove tissue, blood and organ samples.

Editor's Note: All of the grant recipients will prepare a summary article for *Meadowlark* when their respective projects are completed. Eleven grant requests were received this year. All were worthwhile and the selection of the five finally chosen was difficult. Thanks to Steve Bailey and Jeff Walk for their work analyzing the requests and for their recommendations.

Funding donors and request for more monies



Yard Birds Reflections on backyard birding throughout Illinois

Rarities at the feeders:

Have you checked your feeder today for that unanticipated vagrant species? Or that out-of season stray? Stranger things have happened!



arrival of an unusual bird species, either way out of sync – a summer

in January 2002 trooped up to one of our feeders from the creek (in the midst of the hoard of Mallards who come to feed on the cracked corn we spread on the ground). She stood there, looking bemused, as if to say "OK, where's the fish?" I also remember a bedraggled, forlornlooking Northern Mockingbird who busily foraged for seed one frigid February day several winters ago. Karen was out grocery shopping and missed the Mocker. But she was

here and I was gone on a day in early

May almost 20 years ago when a gor-

geous male Yellow-headed Blackbird showed up for a few hours.

There's disappointment too, as we sadly contemplate the decline, then disappearance of one of our favorite birds – Evening Grosbeak – from our late fall feeders. Checking our records, the last Evening Grosbeak here in our yard was on 11 November 1999. Karen and I remember that day very well because a number of Chicago area birders joined us to see it.

In the pantheon of Illinois rare birds, Harris's Sparrow is not at the top of the list (they show up somewhere in the state just about every year). That didn't stop us from being ecstatic when one hung around our feeders for a month in the spring of 1991. It's the rarest bird on our yard list. But a Harris's is small potatoes as a rarity when you compare it with some of the other feeder birds which have made an appearance around the state. Checking the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee's (IORC) archive, I found an impressive list of mega-rarities that graced someone's yard and feeders in the recent past.

breeder that should be hundreds if not thousands of miles to the south when it appears at our feeder in January – or way out of place – like a Southwestern sparrow species busily scratching for seeds in the snow right under a platform feeder in late fall or winter. Sometimes we have very specific target birds in mind. We may maintain nectar feeders well into November

Many of us who feed the birds watch and hope for the unexpected:

or December hoping to attract one of the western hummingbird species that fly slightly off track while heading south. It doesn't have to be a mega-rarity to generate excitement, iust some species we've never, or very rarely, spotted in our yard. We faithfully put out seed, suet, fruit, nuts, mealworms or nectar anticipating the thrill of looking out one morning and discovering a really good bird at one of our feeders.

Occasionally we're rewarded. The yard list my wife, Karen, and I maintain has several species which have only appeared once or twice, like the Hooded Merganser female who

Given the abundance of Mourning Doves as feeder birds, perhaps we shouldn't be too surprised when one of their rarer cousins put in an appearance. Illinois' one and only record of Band-tailed Pigeon was at a feeder in Springfield for a month in winter 1996/97 and the state's first and only Inca Dove used a backyard feeder in Carbondale for three months in late 2004 (last seen on Christmas Day). These two records give us incentive to check out our backyard doves carefully.

Like pigeons and doves, finches, sparrows and buntings comprise another group of bird species whose penchant for using feeders produced several spectacular state rarities, like the Black-throated Sparrow which used a feeder in Glencoe in suburban

Cook County for two months in early 1981; a Golden-crowned Sparrow who wintered for two consecutive years (February/ March 1989 then December 1989 through April 1990), using a feeder at the entrance to the Green River Conservation Area; a Hoary Redpoll at a Skokie feeder in 2000; the Lazuli Bunting at a feeder in Winchester in Scott County in June of 2002; the Painted Bunting

at a feeder in Gurnee, Lake County in April 2000; and a Gray-crowned Rosy-Finch appearing for several days in a yard in University Park in Will County in November 1990. Who said feeder watching is dull! Hummingbirds, woodpeckers (the one and only Williamson's Sapsucker ever to appear in Illinois was present for several days in a Chicago backyard in April of 1985),





tanagers and orioles (the state's first Scott's Oriole spent three weeks at a feeder in Stark County in January and February 2000) represent other sources of rarities you may find while feeder watching - if you're really lucky. For the past decade or so, the Rufous Hummingbird, still a real rarity in Illinois, has been reported nearly every year at feeders in fall, and the most unusual discovery of a Broad-billed Hummingbird was photographed at a feeder in Trivoli, Peoria County, in November 1997.

Rarities like these are not your only potential eye-openers. Exotic, aka non-countable, birds can also liven up a feeder-watching day. Doug Stotz, the IORC Secretary, loves to relate the story of the Senegal Parrot who appeared in his backyard a few winters ago. Or remember that pair of Great Tits at a feeder in Harvard (McHenry County) in May 2003. Surely escapees, but nonetheless quite a sight! Our own yard list footnotes a few non-countable species, like a Chukar, Budgies, Cockatiels, a couple of unidentified parrots, and European Goldfinches (twice). But our best exotic was a bird we couldn't even identify at first - a



sparrow-sized, ground-feeding bird with a fairly hefty bill, all tan underneath, with two really bold white wing-bars and a hint of gray on the top of its head. The bird was quite shy, but we got a couple of poor pictures, pored over various field guides and finally made the identification – a Common Chaffinch. Not very common to us!

Given the widespread popularity of casual backyard bird feeding, there's a multitude of feeder watchers out there who may lack a comprehensive capacity to identify the expected (or unexpected) birds at their feeders. It makes you wonder what other first-of-state species has been missed because a casual feeder watcher didn't realize what was at their sunflower seeds, or their nectar feeder. Or maybe they did identify the bird, but just weren't aware it was

unusual. Some of our neighbors also feed the birds; I plan to ask them to call me when a bird they can't identify shows up. You never know...






Field Notes The 2007 breeding season

I will not change much in the way in which the breeding season report will be imparted. However, I will likely be using observers sightings to document how several species ranges are gradually (a few quickly!) changing by using the "Others" section to include records from areas of the state not often reported from or included in the report in the past. For a few other species whose ranges do not include all of Illinois (or at least formerly did not), I will also list some records from near the edges of their ranges in Illinois.

Some species have somewhat subtle or unusual aspects to their breeding ranges in the state that would be interesting to tease out or discover, although several fall within relatively little-birded parts of the state. Species like Northern Parula have small areas of the state (mainly in northeastern Illinois) where they do not breed. Possibly a not well-known distribution anomaly involves the southernmost area of the common House Wren's state distribution. This species is very rare or non-existent in far southern Illinois, except for within towns and within major river valleys. Where does this unusual distribution end in southern Illinois? The range of this species' in Illinois has increased markedly southward. Other northern Illinois breeding species increasing their range farther southward might include Veery, Rose-breasted Grosbeak, Savanna and Vesper Sparrows, and Bobolink (?). Illinois is also seeing increased breeding records of Red-breasted Nuthatch,

Clay-colored Sparrow, and Pine Siskin farther south than historically reported.

Also of interest would be records of previously more southerly species beginning to breed farther north. This would include such disparate species including Fish Crow, Northern Mockingbird, Summer Tanager, Blue Grosbeak, Orchard Oriole, Yellow-throated Warbler, Prairie Warbler, Yellow-breasted Chat, Great-tailed Grackle, and Eurasian Tree Sparrow.

Rarely reported species—which are possibly more common as breeders than records indicate—include Sharpshinned and Broad-winged Hawks, Black Rail, Yellow Rail, Brown Creeper, Pine Warbler, and Black-and-white Warbler. This phenomenon may partly be due to their more secretive habits or the fact that they breed in areas that are not often birded. Species like the Brown Creeper are much more common and widely distributed than records often indicate.

A few species, many (but not all) already on the state-threatened or state-endangered list, are quickly disappearing from Illinois as breeding birds. Reports and comments on uncommon-to-rare species would be much appreciated to document their continued declines. Birds on this list include all summering/breeding terns, Snowy Egret, Little Blue Heron, Common Moorhen, all nightjars, Red-headed Woodpecker, Loggerhead Shrike, Cerulean Warbler, and Yellow-headed Blackbird. Many of these species could easily become extirpated (or nearly so) from Illinois within the next one to two decades. Even species such as both cuckoos, Wood Thrush, and Bobolink could soon become state-threatened or endangered in the near future, as populations become more and more localized.

For those who care to send in a few details about the nests that they may find, I will regularly include details about nest contents and/or locations, not only for the historical record but also hopefully for the interest of subscribers who find such details interesting. Although the breeding season may not produce sightings of great rarities, it is arguably the most important season for the regular breeding species, and their nesting activities can often be quite interesting.

Occasionally I will also include both June and July maximum counts so as to impart the highest totals of both adult pairs and family groups or flocks, especially in those groups which regularly wander in mid to late summer (i.e. herons,

etc.) and those that gather in flocks after breeding (i.e. ducks, blackbirds, etc.). I also encourage everyone to give as precise locations as they can when reporting their sightings, to include the names of townships (if known), in place of just the county name, especially for rural locations.

The 2007 summer season weather

The 2007 spring season looked to be a lead-in to the continued very warm temperatures of most summer seasons of late, which have led to the drought conditions over many parts of Illinois in recent years, with temperatures 4-5 degrees above average from March through May, the fifth warmest such period since 1895. Precipitation amounts were lower than normal for the spring period for much of the state. However, both temperature and precipitation in June in Illinois were only slightly above average. In July, temperatures were actually slightly below average statewide, with near average precipitation. The July precipitation was much more variable however, depending on different parts of the state, with the west-southwest portion of the state receiving just less than half the average amount of rain than normal for that month, while northwestern Illinois received almost 5 inches more precipitation than the previous area, or about 175% of the normal average. This variability left some areas of the state still remaining in drought conditions. Severe weather was only reported on eight dates in June and six dates in July in the state.

The 2007 summer season highlights

In the rare vagrant category, a Neotropic Cormorant was found in southern Illinois and remained for at least a month for many to see. However, that species pales in comparison to the two species found in northeastern Illinois. A potential first state record Brown-chested Martin and a second state record Fork-tailed Flycatcher caused great excitement for the single observers that viewed them. Both are pending review from the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (IORC).

Two new species nested in Illinois for the first time in 2007—Bufflehead in McHenry County and Laughing Gull in Chicago (Cook County). There is some thought that the female Bufflehead may have been injured slightly, so as to prevent continued migration to its normal breeding grounds, but after already being inseminated by a male, with the female remaining in Illinois to nest and raise her young. After having one or more Laughing Gulls returning to the same Chicago-area locations for the last few summers, including a hybrid Laughing X Ring-billed Gull last year, it was just a matter of time before one was confirmed breeding there.

Many American White Pelicans nested less than a quarter mile from the Illinois border in Iowa on an island in the Mississippi River, and numbers of this species continue to increase during the summer at and along several major Illinois lakes and rivers, especially in the western half of the state.

A plethora of duck species was found this summer, including such summer rarities (and non-breeders) as Greater Scaup, Surf Scoter, Common Goldeneye, and Common Merganser, while Common Loons at three locations included

one long-staying bird in alternate plumage. Other non-breeding birds to appear this summer included several subadult Mississippi Kites, which over-migrated into areas outside of their normal breeding range. In one case, three birds readily fed on the 17-year cicadas, which occurred mostly in northern Illinois during spring and summer 2007. Two American Golden-Plovers possibly summered in central and northern Illinois.

A late July Merlin sighting was one of several species to make summer appearances in the state, arriving exceptionally early (from the north?), apparently as very early fall migrants. The appearance of two Hermit Thrushes in late July was virtually unprecedented; they arrived several weeks earlier than any previous Illinois fall report. While Red-breasted Nuthatches did breed in two locations in northeastern Illinois this summer, several other nuthatches began appearing in early July and continued through early August, representing an abnormally early movement of this species southward from its normal breeding range. White-throated Sparrows were found singing at several locations in the middle of summer, as far south as Knox County. A singing White-crowned Sparrow was seen by many along the Chicago lakefront, this one present for at least a month, making it six out of the past seven years that at least one of this species has shown up along the Chicago lakefront in mid-summer. One wonders if the White-crowned Sparrow will soon attempt nesting like White-throated Sparrows have done in Chicago in recent years. Yet another boreal forest species, a junco, was seen in early June, apparently a late spring migrant.

Some of the highlights (and disappointments) involving breeding species include an unprecedented number of American Bitterns heard and seen in northeastern Illinois, including some in unexpected areas like the one in central Illinois in July! "Southern" herons were somewhat scarce, at least partially due to the continued demise of one of their most important breeding rookeries. Cattle Egrets were almost non-existent. New Bald Eagle nests continue to appear throughout the state, and after their first nesting occurrence just a few years ago, Osprey were found nesting in several areas of the state this summer.

Increased numbers of Yellow-billed Cuckoos in northern Illinois, especially in the Greater Chicago area were thought to be the result of the 17-year periodical cicada emergence in northern Illinois. Good numbers of summering Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers were noted by several observers in the northwest corner of Illinois along the Mississippi River, including a rarely found nest. Several Alder and Least Flycatchers were noted including one definite nesting of the latter species. Cliff Swallows continue to become increasingly common throughout the state as a breeding species, returning to many areas of the state where they have not bred in many years. Bewick's Wren was found at the traditional Siloam Springs State Park breeding area after going unrecorded there the previous three summers. Sedge Wrens were more numerous and statewide in distribution as a breeding species in early June, as opposed to their more usual abundance and arrival in early July. A nesting Marsh Wren in one southern Illinois location was locally very rare. Fifty-five Veeries was a record

high count for the species during the breeding season. One Swainson's Warbler was found after going unreported last summer, while Mourning and Blackburnian Warblers continue to hold territories at Lowden-Miller State Forest, but without confirmation of a nest. Interestingly, the highest counts of Prairie Warblers came from a central Illinois study, with only singles and pairs reported from southern Illinois locales.

Painted Buntings continue to appear at their lone Illinois breeding location, while Blue Grosbeaks are quickly becoming a relatively common species in central and even parts of northern Illinois in the summer. High numbers of Brewer's Blackbirds on a McHenry County sod farm certainly imply a good-sized breeding colony, likely in the several nearby pastures and hayfields, supplanting Illinois Beach State Park as the best place in Illinois to see this species during the breeding season.

Like the other unusual July appearances of boreal species including Hermit Thrush, Red-breasted Nuthatch, and White-throated Sparrow, the appearance of several Purple Finches in late July and on into the first few weeks of August represents a very unusual and possibly unprecedented occurrence for this and the other above species. Continued and seemingly increasing reports of European Goldfinches in the Chicago area at several locations, beg the question, when will breeding occur?




