Guest Essay

Birding today: Better by far

We often hear people (or ourselves) complain that birding is not as good as in the old days.

For me, the old days were the late 1950s and 1960s.

I strongly believe today is the period of great birding. I base this on three major points: Opportunity, attitude and mentorship.

I grew up and continue to live in St. Charles, Kane County. There were no forest preserves near me and parks were mowed playgrounds. Kane County had a forest preserve district but it amounted to fewer than 600 acres and was beyond bicycling range. There were a lot of traditional farms and farmland but they were private and only through the permission of the owner could one enter.

The prevailing attitude about the out of doors we mostly got from our parents and teachers. Nature was where one hunted, fished, gathered nuts and berries or avoided.

Kane County even paid bounties for crows (5 cents), hawks (10 cents) and foxes (an amazing \$5). My gang of friends and I did most of our nature study along the sights of our shotguns. We did not meet people who studied birds.

I had the good fortune to meet Floyd Swink in 1959 and he gave me encouragement with botany, but bird watching was not discussed.

By that time, the chemical age had become well established with both synthetic pesticides and herbicides gaining wide acceptance. It was not uncommon to find a robin or grackle dying a trembling death in the front yard.

The change in birding came April 22, 1970, Earth Day. The celebration was enormous with thousands of people on college campuses, high schools and city halls proclaiming the time had come to take care of our environment. The news media covered it from coast to coast. The politicians at that time were stuck in the morass of the Vietnam War, racial tensions, and civil unrest but here was something they could do: Save ferns, frogs, and falcons. They jumped at it.

Politicians awarded grants to states and local governments to buy land. Ironically, the source of the money was the newly created off-shore oil drilling leases. Illinois DOC (now DNR), forest preserves, conservation districts, parks, and even cities got millions for land acquisition. Kane County alone went from approximately 900 acres in 1970 to more than 12,000 acres by the year 2000. Now there were public places to go birding.

The public's attitude about nature began to change. Instead of only consuming the forests and prairies, people wanted to save them. They also demanded the government put a stop to pollution and take steps to protect the environment. People also sought out ways to study and enjoy the out of doors. Our nature clubs and groups swelled in size as people joined and new groups formed including the Illinois Ornithological Society.

Today, we are fortunate those few birders and nature zealots who did exist remained steadfast and gave guidance to the growing legion of birders, photographers and outdoor enthusiasts. In addition, new books, optics and tours evolved in response to the new attitude.

I really enjoy our present state of birding in Illinois and have no desire to go back to the 50s and 60s. I have pleasant memories of that time but I also remember the misery. I encourage everyone to enjoy the moment. Find pleasure in the birds and habitats of Illinois and spread the joy to others. Stay active in IOS.

Remembering Arlo Raim through the eyes of others

Swainson's Warbler survey in southern Illinois suggests potential breeding

Introduction

Commonly associated with large canebrakes (giant cane; Arundinaria gigantean), Swainson's Warblers (Limnothlypis swainsonii) are often difficult to observe within the densely vegetated bottomlands of the Southeastern United States (Brown and Dickson 1994). Due to the secretive nature of this species, accurate descriptions of breeding distributions are challenging to determine. Population trends derived from the North American Breeding Bird Survey (BBS) indicate Swainson's Warbler populations have likely decreased throughout the Mississippi Alluvial Plain (Hunter et al. 1993) and Midwestern United States (Thompson et al. 1993) over the past 40 years. Habitat loss and degradation of wet deciduous forests and large canebrakes have influenced population declines of this habitat specialist (Brown and Dickson 1994). Many populations on the northern edge of the species distribution (e.g. southern Illinois) have observed dramatic reductions or extirpation (Graves 2001). However, the warbler's secretive nature and preference for often inaccessible habitat make it likely that many individuals go undetected.

Although Swainson's Warbler was not known as a breeding species in Illinois until the 1950s, Eddleman et al. (1980) discovered 36 singing males while surveying the Cave Creek Valley in Jackson County. Subsequent searches within the valley revealed a population decline throughout the 1980's (Robinson 1996) and the species was consequently classified as state endangered and added to the list of Conservation Priority Birds as part of the Illinois Wildlife Action Plan (IWAP). With the last known breeding populations disappearing in the early 1990s (Kleen et al. 2004), individual observations in southern Illinois during 1991-2008 have been sporadic (Table 1). Given that observations have occurred recently in southern Illinois our primary objectives of this research were (1) to document the current distribution of Swainson's Warblers in southern Illinois; and (2) to determine the breeding status of located individuals.

Methods

Swainson's Warbler surveys were conducted within the Cache River State Natural Area, Cypress Creek National Wildlife Refuge (CCNWR), Shawnee National Forest (SNF), Horseshoe Lake State Fish and Wildlife Area and private properties located in the southern region of Illinois. Following the habitat characteristics of breeding Swainson' Warblers previously recorded in Illinois, southern Missouri and eastern Arkansas, we defined potentially suitable habitat as canebrakes or shrub thickets near water with high stem density resembling that of canebrakes (Eddleman et al. 1980, Brown et al. 2009). Specific suitable habitat patches surveyed were located

by using historical breeding sites (Robinson 1996), infra-red maps produced during recent winter aerial surveys conducted by CCNWR, and searching for previously unknown canebrakes within floodplains and bottomlands of southern Illinois. A few canebrakes in SNF were surveyed by volunteers from the Shawnee Audubon Society.

At each canebrake located within the study areas, we used 5-minute call-playback surveys to determine the presence of Swainson's Warblers. Songs were broadcast adjacent to canebrakes using audio recordings provided by the Macaulay Library of Natural Sounds (Cornell Lab of Ornithology, Ithaca, NY) and an MP3 player with portable speakers. Songs used were from a male recorded 28 April, 1957 in West Virginia (recordist: William W. H. Gunn) and chip notes used were from a different male recorded 7 April, 1981 in Louisiana (recordist: Theodore A. Parker III).

Nest searches were conducted with one to three people in appropriate nesting habitat (i.e. cane or dense vines) where male Swainson's Warblers were detected. For each bout of nest searching, searchers used behavioral cues and visual inspection of all nest-like objects to detect the presence of nesting activity.

Results

Song playback surveys of 115 distinct patches with suitable habitat throughout the southern Illinois study areas detected Swainson's Warblers in two specific patches (1.7% of total surveyed) during 19 May through 27 July 2009. Within these two specific patches, behavioral observations and nest searching resulted in:

Individual Accounts

On 2 June, 2009, while searching for canebrakes in a swamp located in southern Johnson County, the potential song of a Swainson's Warbler was heard about 200m from an observer's location. This individual was singing within a recently planted (< 10 years) IDNR forest regeneration plot with a tree density resembling the stem-density associated with most observed canebrakes. After using song playback, the bird was confirmed to be a male Swainson's Warbler and the bird repeatedly responded aggressively within close range (often < 4 m). A subsequent playback survey of the area and immediate vicinity on 12 June failed to detect the presence of the male. However, on 22 June, the same male (determined by distinctive song quality) was relocated without song playback about 100 m from the previous location in similar habitat.

Nest searching for this individual was conducted on 29 June and 15 July. On each visit, two researchers followed the singing male without playback for nearly four hours. No observations of a female or behaviors indicating nesting activity were detected. While observing this male foraging at close range, we heard the quiet "subsong", a barely audible variable warbling described as sounding similar to American Goldfinches (Carduelis tristis) (Brown and Dickson 1994). Although many nests of other species were located within this specific habitat, no putative Swainson's Warbler nest was located.

On 12 July, a singing male Swainson's Warbler previously located by volunteer Rhonda Rothrock of the Shawnee Audubon Society, was relocated in the SNF in Jackson County. Initially observed singing at a height of 5m in a tree adjacent to a large canebrake, the male moved into the canebrake after 5 minutes of unobstructed observation. Based on specific areas where the male repeatedly sang, we focused nest searching efforts in two areas within the canebrake. After about three hours of searching, we found a fairly bulky nest woven into center branches next to a cane stem 1m above ground (see photo). This inactive nest closely resembles the structure, size and location of a Swainson's Warbler nest (T. J. Benson pers. comm.). Shortly after we located the nest, the male flew directly over the nest and began singing rapidly. After following the male for another hour, we failed to detect additional potential nests or female Swainson's Warblers.

Upon returning to the probable Swainson's Warbler nest on 27 July, eggs or any new signs of activity at the nest were not detected. The male was singing about 150 m from this location and immediately responded to playback. The male responded to broadcasted call notes by chipping rapidly from the ground within 5m. This interaction attracted a family of Hooded Warblers (Wilsonia citrina) and a second Swainson's Warbler that also chipped loudly nearby. No intraspecific aggressive interactions were observed as the two Swainson's Warblers appeared to cooperatively chip near the playback. While the two birds chipped from the ground or low perches we were unable to identify any distinctive differences in appearance. After two minutes the birds dispersed in the same direction. Although the male continued to sing for the next hour, we were unable to relocate the second Swainson's Warbler or any other signs of breeding activity in the area.

Discussion

During this study only two male and one probable female Swainson's Warblers were detected in southern Illinois. Repeated observations and behavior suggest these individuals were actively defending territories throughout the summer and were not transients. Although we were unable to confirm breeding in either occupied habitat patch, the behavior, presence of a Swainson's Warbler pair and potential nest strongly suggests a breeding attempt in the SNF. A lack of intraspecific aggression or differential appearance between the Swainson's Warbler pair suggests the second (non-singing) individual was probably a female, however, by late July the possibility of a recently molted hatch-year bird or another male cannot be ruled out.

Swainson's Warblers continue to occur rarely (e.g., 1.7% of total patches surveyed in this study) in appropriate habitat and at very low densities in southern Illinois. Due to the elusive habits of this species and large home-range size (range 1.55 to 30.75 ha, mean = 9.38 ha) (Anich et al. 2009), some birds may not have responded to playback resulting in a significant bias. In 1992, however, similar survey methods used in southern Missouri, one of the nearest extant populations to Illinois, reported 29% of canebrakes were occupied by Swainson's Warblers (Thomas et al. 1996).

Why Swainson's Warblers are now exceedingly rare along the northern periphery of their historical breeding range remains unclear. Major factors potentially influencing the Swainson's Warbler population decline in southern Illinois include habitat loss and the negative effects of brood parasitism by the Brownheaded Cowbird (Molothrus ater). The habitat structure that once supported a Swainson's Warbler population in the 1970's has likely changed overtime. Loss of suitable canebrakes in the Shawnee National Forest may have influenced Swainson's Warbler habitat selection decisions, therefore causing dispersal of some individuals. Habitat fragmentation in the Shawnee National Forest also increases the chance of brood parasitism by Brown-headed Cowbirds (Hoover et al. 2006). With low fledging success, 0.6 warbler offspring fledged when simultaneously raising a cowbird (Benson et al. 2010), the Swainson's Warbler population may have been dramatically affected by brood parasitism. Historically at low densities, Swainson's Warblers in Illinois may not be able to cope with the multiple effects of habitat alteration and cowbird parasitism.

Naturally ephemeral, canebrake habitat tends to wink in and out of existence over the course of several vears or even decades as the forest canopy becomes more or less open. The canebrake where the pair of birds and nest were observed was particularly well-developed and was larger in area, greater in stem density, and taller than nearly all of the other canebrakes surveyed. A growing interest in managing for or promoting canebrakes in bottomland forests in southern Illinois will undoubtedly improve the chances of having several breeding pairs of Swainson's Warblers in Illinois in the future. The presence of these few territorial males provides some hope that if canebrakes increase in number and size in southern Illinois, then Swainson's Warbler numbers may increase. Moving forward we will continue to survey canebrakes each summer in an effort to better document the number of Swainson's Warblers on breeding territories each year and whether particular canebrakes are occupied across several consecutive years. This information will be important to the development and implementation of canebrake management and enhancement activities.

Author's Note

Territorial male Swainson's Warblers returned to respective territories in both Johnson and Jackson counties during 2010. However, no nesting activity was observed in either location.

Specific Swainson's Warbler observation locations were intentionally omitted from this article in an attempt to help protect the probable nesting pair and possible future populations. Birders attempting to search for this species are asked to exercise discretion when using playback to locate this species in Illinois. The "Code of Birding Ethics" (American Birding Association) cautions birders to avoid advertising, using playback and, stressing rare and endangered birds, especially when nesting.

First documented nesting record for Anhinga in Illinois

Kennicott (1854) stated that the Anhinga (*Anhinga anhinga*) was quite common in Illinois in June in the Cache River Bottoms near Cairo, and Cahn (1930) listed the Anhinga as a bird of the cypress swamps in southern Illinois. And Although described as a common summer resident in extreme southern Illinois during the late 1800s by Ridgway (1895), there are no specific records of Anhinga nesting in Illinois (Cory 1909; Bohlen 1989).

Following an apparent population decline, other observations over the following century were usually limited to sporadic single-day sightings. These relatively few observations led Robinson (1996) to classify Anhinga as "very rare" in southern Illinois. Most Anhingas seen in Illinois today are likely spring overmigrants and post-breeding wanderers from the closest known current breeding colonies in western Tennessee (Nicholson 1997).

However, given the above statements from Kennicott and Cahn, it should likely be no surprise that Illinois' first documented nesting for Anhinga came from the largest tract of cypress swamp in Illinois, along the Cache River.

On 1 May, 2009, several observers saw an Anhinga soaring over a bald cypress (*Taxodium distichum*) swamp adjacent to the Lower Cache River Access near Perks, Illinois (Stotz 2009). Similar to the few exceedingly rare spring observations of Anhinga (Robinson 1996), this individual may have been regarded



as an overmigrant. However, while walking near the Lower Cache River Access on 23 May, 2009 I watched a large black bird fly over the swamp. From the canoe launch, I was only able to observe the silhouette of the bird as it began to soar above the swamp. After a few moments, I noticed that the bird was followed by three other individuals. The long neck, long rectangular wings and long triangular tail of each bird led me to identify them as Anhingas. After about five minutes of circling, I detected two more individuals. All six birds continued to circle above the swamp for about ten minutes before soaring out of sight.

I returned to the Lower Cache River Access on the morning of 26 May and set out into Buttonland Swamp in a kayak. Within a few minutes, I observed three Anhingas flying just over the trees. Although these birds were much closer than my previous encounter, I was still only able to examine the silhouettes of each individual. This observation allowed me to finally discern plumage characteristics indicating that one bird had a dark neck (male) and

the other had a tan neck (female). Over the next few months, multiple observers reported soaring Anhingas from the Lower Cache River Access and surrounding areas (Stotz 2009). Subsequent searches in Buttonland Swamp yielded no detection of nesting activity.

While conducting a Prothonotary Warbler (Prothonotaria citrea) survey by kayak in a large cypress-tupelo swamp located in Johnson Co. on 25 June, I saw a large dark bird take off from a low perch. I quietly followed it and was able to see the bird land on a low branch just over the water. With binoculars I was able to distinguish the tan neck and white wing coverts of an adult female Anhinga. I then began searching the area for signs of nesting and heard the distant sounds of a heron rookery. At the edge of this immense rookery, I observed the large stick nests of Great Egret (Ardea alba) and Great Blue Heron (Ardea herodias) within the tupelo (Nyssa aquatic) canopy. After moving approximately 20 m toward the interior of the rookery, I watched an Anhinga fly out of a tree where another perched in an



alert posture. Within the same tree, I noticed what appeared to be a large nest. This nest was about half the size of nearby heron and egret nests and constructed of different material (i.e. large dead leaves). With a little more searching, I found another leafy nest with an adult Anhinga incubating. I found a total of three nests that I believed were currently active (adults incubating or perched nearby) and two other potentially active nests all located on the periphery of the large heron rookery.

On the morning of 14 July, 2009, I returned to the Anhinga nests with Amber Albores and Jeff Hoover. Adult Anhingas circled and landed on nearby trees while we attempted to document the number of active nests. The first three Anhinga nests we located each contained at least one small chick. A chick with emerging tail and wing feathers was observed perched on a branch about five feet from nest number three. Chicks commonly perch on branches near the nest starting at week three (Frederick and Siegel-Causey 2000). We eventually confirmed the presence of five active Anhinga nests and located a sixth potential nest of unknown nesting status.

Editor's Note:

On 4 July 2010, at least 6 juvenile Anhingas were located together in a tree within a rookery in the same vicinity as the 2009 nesting. Based on the advanced plumage of these juveniles, nesting was initiated earlier this year. A report will follow in a future Meadowlark.

Continued nesting of Mississippi Kite in Winnebago County

In 2008, a pair of Mississippi Kites (*Ictinia mississippiensis*) successfully nested and fledged a chick in Rockford (Williams 2009). In 2009, Mississippi Kites again returned to the neighborhood of the C. Henry Bloom School in Rockford, Winnebago County, and a pair nested successfully, again fledging one chick. Interestingly, two other kites were occasionally seen in the area, although only one nest was found. Here is a report regarding the 2009 nest.

On 17 May 2009, neighbors in the Bloom School area of Rockford saw and reported Mississippi Kites flying around their homes. Larry Balch saw up to four kites several times during the breeding season. The four included two adult males, an adult female, and a subadult female. At first, the birds were concentrated around Bloom School. Although the favorite perch tree from 2008 had fallen over in a storm in the late fall of 2008, the kites were frequently seen perched in another tree with dead limbs that was immediately adjacent to last year's perch tree.

By 4 July, a female was fairly regularly seen in the new perch tree, and two to four kites were seen over the park adjacent to the school, but we were unable to locate a nest in the area. On the morning of 5 July, we discovered many sticks from "bottle rockets" that had apparently been fired in, and from, the school parking lot overnight on 4 July. After that, no kites were seen for three days until I found a male bathing in a puddle in the school parking lot on 8 July.

For all of the remainder of July and most of August, various observers saw at least two adult kites (a

male and a female) regularly in the Bloom School neighborhood, but, despite the frequent sightings, we were never able to close in on a nest site. Finally, on 28 August, Larry Balch heard a bird calling repeatedly from a tree for 15 minutes and, on 29 August, Larry and I were finally able to find a juvenile (the noisy caller) and the nest. We kept the kite family under observation for the next few weeks, during which time the juvenile was increasingly adept at flight. We also received periodic reports from a number of folks who came to look for kites and, seeing them, let us know what they saw, and where. We are very grateful to have received their reports. The kites were last reported on 16 September by John Bergstrom.

In 2008, an adult was last seen on 21 September and the juvenile on September 29. Assuming that this is the same adult pair, they succeeded in nesting and departing a week earlier, apparently with the juvenile in their company.

At the beginning of the spring, we asked that anyone seeing kites around Bloom School please refrain from posting on a listserve to protect the likely nest and to minimize disturbance to the birds and neighbors. We also suspected that the kites might nest in a differerent part of the neighborhood (they did) and, because this is a heavily residential area around a school, we didn't want to alarm the school authorities (they did call the police and report the license number of a car in the school parking lot in May-it was a birder) and the neighbors. We very much appreciate the coop-

eration of all of you who came to view the kites but refrained from posting. Since we were unable to locate the nest until the chick was fledged and very vocal, your restraint undoubtedly served to maintain tranquility in the neighborhood. When the nest was finally

located, the neighbors in the immediate area were very cooperative and friendly, and enjoyed the visitors and reports. One fellow even went to his computer, Googled Mississipi Kites, and came out with printed photos while we were out on the sidewalk in front of his house looking at the birds through a telescope. Another neighbor went so far as to get out his step ladder and offer it to a birder so that he could get a better angle to take a picture of a perched kite.

One puzzle remains regarding the adult male and subadult female. They were seen from time to time in July and into early August. Where they were on the other days is a mystery. As of mid-August 2010, there were up to three adult male, one adult female and one subadult kites in the Bloom School neighborhood of Rockford. On 13 August 2010, Larry Balch located a nest with a

chick in the school neighborhood. A pair of adults was regularly coming to feed the chick, which was fairly well-developed. As of this writing, the chick has now left the nest but is still in the area of the nest tree being fed by its parents. A report of a flying juvenile has been received, but has not been seen before or since the report. From the behavior of another pair of adults, we suspect a second nest but have not been successful in locating it yet.



First successful nesting of American White Pelican in Illinois

On 17 June 2009, staff from Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge discovered nesting American White Pelicans on a small island in Carroll County, Illinois (just west of Thomson, Illinois, in Pool 13 of the Mississippi River). Since pelicans are notoriously timid during nesting, we did not attempt a count, but did document at least six pelican chicks had hatched.

Subsequent trips to the island found an estimated 25 young pelicans had fledged from this colony.

After checking with Illinois DNR biologists, other federal biologists and Richard Bjorklund, we believe this constitutes the first successful documented nesting of American White Pelicans in Illinois. Three years prior, pelicans were found nesting on the Iowa side of the Mississippi River within 1/2 mile of these nests. These were reported in "North American Birds" as the first nesting pelicans in that state. In 2009, the Iowa colony fledged roughly 400 young. **Editor's Note:** More than 100 nests with young of American White Pelicans were found on Woodruff Island in Carroll County the summer of 2010.



Caspian Tern nests for first time in Illinois


On 1 July 2009, Steve Huggins discovered a breeding colony of Caspian Terns (Sterna caspia) with at least 50 unfledged young atop a Chicago, Illinois building near Navy Pier, Cook County. Huggins told Douglas F. Stotz about his discovery, and Stotz visited the location on 6 July 2009 to find 230 adults, 13 young with black caps (possibly fledged), and 54 smaller young.

Huggins returned 9 July 2009 at lunchtime while working at the location to count 51 young on

the roof and seven that had fallen off the roof and were being fed by adults on the grass near the building. In addition, Huggins saw five immature birds flying. The adult count was 172 with five or six birds that were apparently still incubating eggs. This sighting constitutes the first confirmed nesting of Caspian Terns in Illinois. The exact location is not being disclosed because it is on private property, which is strictly patrolled.

Historically, Caspian Terns have been considered regular migrants in small numbers through Illinois, even in the Chicago area. Nelson (1876) mentions a 9 June 1876 individual as being "very unusual" in the lateness of its appearance in the Chicago area. Nelson considered the species a migrant.

A few birds were suspected to have nested in Cook and Lake Counties in the late 1970s (Bohlen 1989). However, adults and young are already migrating by at least early July, with young still begging



for food from their parents. During the late 1970s and afterward, few birds summered, with a maximum of perhaps, 10 birds, far lower than the numbers that now summer in Chicagoland.

Given the large numbers of these terns that have been summering in the Chicagoland area within the last decade, it was suspected that the species might be nesting on some offshore islet or manmade structure along the Chicago lakefront.

Indiana's first nests of this species were documented in East Chicago, Lake County, on 24 June 1997, fewer than five miles from Chicago and the Illinois state line. A minimum of 41 nests, 20 downy young and 137 adults were found nesting on the LTV Steel plant landfill directly adjacent to the Indiana Harbor Ship Canal along the edge of Lake Michigan (Brock and Castrale 1997). They were nesting with a colony of breeding Ring-billed Gulls. This colony increased to 248 tern nests with 100+ fledglings at the above, sole-known nesting site 8 June 2005 (Keller and Keller 2006). These terns appear to be increasing their numbers and breeding distribution in the region along with the ballooning gull population.

The Caspian Tern has gradually and steadily increased in Illinois from the eight individuals found at four Chicago locations in 1991 (Kleen 1992) and five there at four locations in 1996 (Kleen 1997). None were even reported there during the summers of 1993-95 (Kleen 1994, 1995, 1996).


Northern Rough-winged Swallow builds nest on garage air-conditioning ducts

For several days in July 2009, I had noticed Northern Rough-winged Swallows (*Stelgidopteryx serripennis*) swooping around my garage doors when I would return from a drive. I initially thought they were hawking insects as they would often swoop over the backyard and drive-way. This species has nested under the bridge several yards from my driveway for the past 30 years.

On 17 July 2009 as I opened my basement door leading to the garage, I saw an adult rough-wing in the garage, hovering near the ceiling, and twittering. After it left, I got on a ladder and looked into the area. There, in a shallow opening between the ceiling and some air-conditioning ducts, I could see some nesting material and at least three heads of nestlings. The area was dark, with a bit of light coming in from behind making photography difficult. I finally did get a photo of the nest but no adult coming to it. They were very wary and would not enter the garage, even when I got into my car to observe.

The next morning, as I opened the garage door, an adult came into the nest. It immediately fluttered around, calling agitatedly and then left. It did not return. The night before there had been unseasonably low temperatures. I do not know

if the young might have died from exposure or something else, but the adult did not return to the nest during the remaining two hours I was home before going on vacation.

A pair of Carolina Wrens had raised two broods in the garage earlier in the summer. Then they moved to the front perch deck. After finding the swallow nest, I am wondering if the wrens moved because of the swallows having usurped their territory. Rough-wings are the only swallows which are usually found around my house because the area is too wooded for Barn Swallows. Roughwings typically nest in cavities near water. I could find nothing in the literature about rough-wings nesting inside structures, but they do use cavities in man-made-structures.

Field Notes: The 2009 Breeding Season

The weather

Weather coming into the peak of the nesting season was about normal with near-average May temperatures, although the precipitation for that month was above-average. The previous 12 months were the wettest on record (since 1895), and spring (March-May) was the fifth wettest on record. While the slightly above-average June temperatures (although early June was cooler than normal) likely benefitted fruits and insects eaten by passerines that depend on them for sustenance, the continued above-average rainfall in June was not likely as kind to nests with eggs and young, which survive better in warm, dry conditions. Portions of the lower Illinois and Mississippi Rivers crested above flood stages during June.

Severe weather was common during June, with 15 reports of tornados and widespread hail and wind damage throughout the month. The average air temperature for St. Charles in far northern Illinois was 68 degrees and 77 degrees at Carbondale in far southern Illinois.

July temperatures were well-below average. In fact, it was the coldest July on record for Illinois. The temperature in Wheaton (DuPage County) was 44 degrees on 5 July, the coldest temperature for the month. There were 33 reports of record low daily minimum temperatures as well as 218 reports of record low daily maximum temperatures statewide throughout July. To make matters worse (at least for the birds), precipitatation was above average. The lower Illinois River was above local flood stage for the beginning of the month. However, severe weather was otherwise minimal in July with six reports of tornados. It was the third wettest May-July period since 1895. This trend continued into August with well-below average temperatures and well-above average precipitation.

These weather patterns were likely not conducive to good nest success rates, at least where weather played a factor in their outcome. Joan Bruchman's loss of almost an entire colony of nestling Purple Martins at Lake Arlington likely played out over a large area in northeastern, and maybe much of northern Illinois during the severe cold snap in early July. Continual wet conditions likely did not help young in nests when parents left them unattended to gather food.

Continual high floodwaters along rivers like the Mississippi, Illinois and Ohio may be helpful to some species such as ducks and herons by providing more easily accessible food and more habitat, but can also hamper bird species that nest and forage along theses rivers. The endangered Least Tern more often than not is finding its nesting substrate along these rivers under water for much of the breeding season in Illinois. In addition, high water levels can inundate nesting areas for species such as bank-nesting swallows and kingfishers, literally washing them out of their nesting homes.

Still, the increased amounts of rain and higher water levels serve to recharge shrinking wetlands needed by Illinois's many rare marsh birds.

New Illinois breeding discoveries

Thanks to the work of professional biologists, as well as happenstance discoveries by individuals, three new species have now been added to the state's list of successful breeders. Biologists checking small islands in the Mississippi River, which already had been home to breeding herons and cormorants, discovered that American White Pelicans had recently colonized a second island near the Iowa border, this year on the Illinois side. And as multiple "vagrant" Anhingas lingered at the same locations into June, some including Matt McKim-Louder wondered: Could they possibly be nesting? McKim-Louder, a graduate student studying Prothonotary and Swainson's Warblers, canoed into a large cypress-tupelo swamp in Johnson County to check on the numbers of nesting herons in a longtime rookery. When he noticed a few leafy nests among the heron-topped stick nests, he discovered the "vagrant" Anhingas were all sitting on nests! The current closest breeding Anhingas are at Reelfoot Lake in Tennessee, although they had formerly nested at the north end of that lake in Kentucky until about 1950, also in a large heron rookery.

Lastly, while working at his job at a Chicago lakefront location, birdwatcher Steve Huggins noticed that a large number of white birds, likely gulls, were atop a lakefront building. Upon closer inspection, Huggins saw that they were Caspian Terns, not gulls. Better yet, many of the birds were juvenile nestlings, most not yet having fledged, and not yet capable of flight. Like several large Ring-billed Gull colonies found the last few years in the Chicagoland area, these terns had decided to nest on a rooftop instead of the rocky islands or beach front locations they normally choose. Ring-billed and Herring Gulls were also nesting and loafing on the same rooftop, and the terns likely followed the gulls' lead. Because large numbers of juvenile and adult Caspian Terns have been seen along the Chicago lakefront the past several summers, birders suspected the species was nesting nearby. In addition, a few nesting colonies were just north and south of Chicago in Indiana and Wisconsin.

There is no mention of breeding Caspian Terns or American White Pelicans in any of Illinois's oldest, historic ornithological literature including Kennicott (1854), Nelson (1876), and Ridgway (1889). In fact, these authors considered both of these species uncommon to rare in the state, but their numbers have increased rather dramatically fairly recently.

I added a few records into the field notes this season to show a few numbers of much smaller maximum counts for some species such as herons, swallows, hummingbirds, kingbirds, sandpipers and others. This was done to show that a good maximum count for certain species such as Great Egret, kingbirds, many of the swallows and a few others can be much lower in June, than it will be in July after the species have fledged young, families gather up and begin flocking in preparation for migration. Some of the maximum counts for these and other breeding species such as the Spotted Sandpipers likely include birds which have already migrated in from out of state. A count of 20 Rough-winged Swallows is locally impressive in June, but will be heavily trumped in mid to late July when flocks of these and about every other swallow can be seen along the utility lines or flying low over lakes like Chautauqua, Carlyle, Rend, and others, by the hundreds or even thousands. Likewise 20-50 Great Egrets are impressive just about anywhere until young, post-nesting dispersers, and groups taking advantage of a localized fish glut can swell numbers into the hundreds or even thousands in some areas. Lastly, Vern Kleen's amazing hummingbird congregations have been impressive the last few years where he goes to band, showing that what might simply appear as 10-15 birds coming to a few feeders, may actually be 100 (or considerably more), by identifying the numbers of such birds simply by placing bands on each one's legs. However, any count made in the field (by non-banders) is exceptional, even in the southern part of the state where they are more common, if one exceeds 5-10 birds.

I will also likely not report each and every Bald Eagle and Cooper's Hawk that is found after this year, and have done so the last couple years simply to show the extent to which their populations have rebounded since their once rare status in the state. Try to count more than 3 or 4 Cooper's Hawks in one day sometime...but they are just about everywhere if you can find them. Both species' breeding populations are likely better, or at least almost as good as their numbers were before DDT caused such a collapse in their populations. The same goes for my reporting of the increasing numbers of the ever northward expanding populations of Orchard Orioles and Blue Grosbeaks. Compared to the numbers reported of these birds even ten years ago, I think I have dramatically shown how they are increasing and expanding their ranges, especially in central and northern Illinois. All of these things have been done to show a clearer picture of Illinois's breeding bird populations.

Vagrants, especially southern dispersals

Possibly the best vagrant sighting of the summer was a very cooperative Tropical Kingbird, seen and photographed by many near Lake Carlyle. This bird was found and tentatively identified by a birding pipeline worker. He noticed the bird next to a cross-country pipeline, which was being installed How convenient! This makes one wonder how many such birds are out there, where the birders generally aren't.

This bird was spending a lot of time eating mulberries, but when it was banded and identified to species, the kingbird appeared emacated. The berry-stained breast of this bird helped tell another story, that of its long and stressful migration. This species has a large distribution over Central and South America, barely entering the U.S. in the extreme southwest during summer. In its normal range, southernmost populations (in southern South America) are migratory, while those living farther northward are not, or little so. Most are austral migrants. It would be nice to know the provenance of this bird.

A recent study has found that some normally insectivorous birds in preparation for or during migration can consume up to three times their own body weight in berries. The study suggests that the birds seek berries with the most deeply colored pigments because they contain high amounts of antioxidants that can help protect the birds during long, stressful migrations.

Only about the third record for the state, a cooperative Royal Tern at LaSalle Lake put on a show for those lucky to get there in time to see it, and amazingly another one (the same individual?) had been seen about a hundred miles down river a couple days earlier. A more regular Illinois vagrant, the White-winged Dove was nicely photographed while coming to Ed Franks' backyard feeder. Franks, an ornithologist, is Professor Emeritus at Western Illinois University. Another vagrant, encountered yearly in Illinois, an adult male Rufous Hummingbird, was photographed and banded. Both species were detected on typical dates for these species. Another vagrant, the Brown Pelican was seen in several locations in the state—perhaps a record number of this species for one season were detected during the 2009 summer season.

Other birds common to the southern Gulf coast were found in Illinois during summer. Observers noted summering and post-nesting dispersing Black-bellied Whistling-Duck, Neotropic Cormorant, White Ibis, and Roseate Spoonbill (all appearing for the second consecutive summer) as well as Mottled Duck and the previously mentioned Brown Pelican and Anhinga. Most/all of these species were also found this summer (and/or last summer) in nearby southern Indiana and southeastern Missouri, including Fulvous Whistling-Duck. Perhaps these species will become regular post-breeding wanderers to this state. Interestingly, the place where many of these birds were found this summer was the same area where historic sightings of the same species occurred, likely on a regular basis—in Monroe County, back when these species' numbers and the wetland acreage were much higher.

Other good finds included several lingering northern birds, mainly ducks—Bufflehead, Common Goldeneye, Common and Red-breasted Merganser, Surf Scoter and a beautiful, alternate-plumaged Horned Grebe, all in Chicago or other northern Illinois areas. Three, possibly four Western Grebes lingered, one until the end of the season in several areas of the state, likely a record number of individuals for summer in Illinois. A late July record Scissor-tailed Flycatcher apparently didn't involve a locally nesting bird.

Other rare/endangered nesting species

Exciting nesting species included the second consecutive year for the small and far northern, disjunct breeding Mississippi Kite colony in a residential area of Rockford.

American Bitterns were found in increased locations compared to most years. Black Rails were also found for the second consecutive year, this time two at opposite ends of the state. One was photographed displaying aggressively and showing territorial/nest-defense behavior. A pair of state and federally endangered Piping Plovers attempted to nest at one of their last, previous breeding spots in the state, in Waukegan (last noted nesting there in 1973 and 1979). Due to potential human disturbance at this heavily used public beach, scientists collected and hatched the eggs at the Lincoln Park Zoo, with the young later released in Michigan. Black-necked Stilts continued their march across Illinois as a breeding species. New nesting birds were located in northern and central Illinois, with increasing breeding areas located in southern Illinois.

Other interesting finds of mostly state-endangered species include several Barn Owls in southern Ilinois found with nest boxes full of young. This species has likely become more common than records suggest, especially in southern Illinois, both possibly even in more northern areas of the state. Swainson's Hawks may be decreasing, even given their small breeding population, as active searching for breeding pairs turned up few birds. Another active search for Swainson's Warblers, partially aided by a \$500 research grant by IOS, did produce a few singing males and possibly a breeding pair. Bewick's Wren was only located at its one known, annual Illinois nesting location. A single, singing male Painted Bunting was found again at its lone, known Illinois breeding location. A fair number of Black-billed Cuckoos (recently listed as state-threatened), mostly singletons, were found this summer, mostly in Chicagoland. The state-endangered Loggerhead Shrike continues to breed in small numbers at Lost Mound NWR, Midewin NTP, and in southeastern Illinois near the prairie-chicken refuges. The species none-the-less continues to disappear from many other long-held territories and still seemingly good habitat, and thus was recented upgraded from state-threatened. Will this species still be found in Illinois at the end of the following decade?

Interesting breeding and post-nesting dispersal patterns

American Crows seem to be slightly increasing or holding their own in their battle with West Nile Virus. Corvids and their relatives, in general, are particularly susceptible to the virus so Blue Jays as well as chickadees have also suffered. I am trying to keep track of maximum counts of these species in the field and encourage observers to keep regular counts of these birds and report them to the journal. I wonder if Illinois's relatively small Fish Crow population has declined significantly as well.

The massive winter invasion of Pine Siskin (both in Illinois, neighboring states, and points much farther south) resulted in numerous and widespread breeding evidence throughout Illinois, but especially in Chicagoland. There were likely more breeding siskins in Illinois this seaso, than I have witnessed in my 35+ years experience observing nesting birds in the state. Small and good sized flocks were also being encountered very late into the summer season at feeding stations, even in far southern Illinois. Although not as in evidence on the same scale, a number of Red-breasted Nuthatches were detected throughout the summer, but with

no confirmed breeding. Some of each species were thought to be early fall "migrants", but keep in mind that when nesting this far south, both species' normal wintering range is usually much farher **north**, not south. So unlike most species migrating out of Illinois after nesting, these two species are heading north in late summer and early fall, not south. These species leave the north when cone crops are low and return when seeds become more plentiful.

About the only place in Illinois where it is relatively easy to detect migratory movements of bird species, even those considered mostly sedentary or partially migratory (Blue Jays, chickadees, etc.) is the Chicagoland lakefront. The latest of the late migrants can easily be found there, with some of the last individual gulls, flycatchers, warblers, thrushes, sparrows and others present at least until the first 10-15 days of June. Such late, migratory birds are only rarely ever found outside the Chicagoland lakefront, and then usually represent only a very few individual birds found with an extraordinary amount of birding time put forth. Because of this factor, some exceptional insights can be had regarding the regular, late-season migratory movements of species that are found along the lakefront. Some of these birds' movements (especially shorebirds and flycatchers) can be so late as to make it difficult to distinguish between a late, northbound arriving, boreal-nesting migrant and an early southbound, migrant in fall migration. Even the most experienced birder/ ornithologist might have to flip a coin to determine which way a given bird is moving.

One has to wonder: Are some of these birds, found away from the lakefront parks (with little nesting habitat), actually trying to set up a territory and breed (e.g. Least and Alder Flycatchers, Blackthroated Green and Nashville Warblers, all of which have summered or attempted to breed in Illinois)? There were interesting examples this season of many especially late, boreal breeding flycatchers, thrushes, warblers and even sparrows that were found, for example, Dave Bohlen's mid-July Black-throated Green Warbler and Lincoln's Sparrow. Which way were those birds going? And what's up with Bob Hughes's end-of- July Prairie Warbler, Tufted Titmouse and Carolina Wren at Montrose or Paul Clyne's late July White-crowned Sparrow? Some of these birds, often termed summer wandering birds, are likely a result of one or more nesting failures and they may be looking for a better spot to try to nest the following year.

Other interesting birds such as Keith McMullen's mid-July Bobolink at Prairie Ridge SNA (where the species does not nest), and Bob Hughes's several sightings of Dickcissels (7 records) and Bobolinks (3 records) in early June through mid-July at Montrose (where neither species nests), serve as evidence of the continual, large-scale amount of mowing that goes on throughout these specie's breeding range in Illinois and elsewhere. When these birds' nests are destroyed by mowing, the species may head north or south early looking for a new breeding area to re-nest in or start south early on their long trip back to their southern South America wintering areas.

I once had a landowner/farmer proudly tell me that he could now get off four to five mowings of his hay fields each year, and I have noticed in my extensive statewide summer travels that first mowed fields can be seen in Illinois now as early as May, just as Boblinks and Dickcissels are building

their first nests. I have also seen flocks of 20 or more mostly adult Bobolinks in a field in early June, seemingly already flocking up to head south after another failed breeding season nesting attempt.

Very likely, there's a causal relationship between increased mowing (and a dramatic loss of habitat) and the declining numbers of these species, which is documented in USGS Breeding Bird Survey data.

As you will see in the 2009 breeding season field notes, Yellow-throated Warblers, Blue Grosbeaks, and Summer Tanagers continue to increase their breeding numbers farther north into Illinois and beyond. Many ornithologists have already made the fairly obvious correlation with global climate change. Personally, I was very excited to add Blue Grosbeak to my Lake County list by finding the first nest for the species in Lake County, no less!

Birdwatching is a lot of fun at any season, though many take the summer season off to gear up for the more exciting spring and fall migrations. However, all of our birds, even the common ones, exhibit some of their most interesting behaviors while they build and defend nests, feed young and prepare for their return flight to their wintering areas. In so doing, nesting birds can reveal information that we can use to help conserve the habitats they need to successfully reproduce, ensuring we have a great diversity of birds to watch during migration.









is to the ornithological community as well as to his friends and the conservation movement.

Arlo lived with his cherished dogs in a trailer partially heated with solar energy near Kickapoo State Park. He practiced a life of simple frugality only buying what he absolutely needed and recycling or making use of what others would call trash. He recently helped construct radio towers, which were brought to Mexico and erected to track the signals of neotropical migrants entering the Yucatan. Arlo, I'm told, climbed the 50- to 75foot high radio towers to make sure they were set up properly, while younger ornithologists stood on terra firma in amazement. Arlo also followed crows in early spring from their Champaign winter roosting areas all the way to northern Michigan. He tracked a Sora that took off in the middle of a spring thunderstorm in Champaign and flew northwest until it landed in a marsh near the Quad Cities.

There are people all around us doing great things quietly and sometimes considered to be different and therefore not to be well regarded. We should embrace all the Arlo Raims of the world and not wait until they are gone to realize how important they are.


