President's Message

Ever changing taxonomy

Have you done it yet? Looked at that state list, or your home county list, or that list of species seen in your local patch, or your yard, and said to yourself, "Oh, darn, I know there was a major reordering recently, announced by the American Ornithologist's Union (AOU)." And, of course, a few names were changed in the process.

Some of the really dedicated listers among us surely jumped right on this project when the 52nd Supplement to the Check-list of North American Birds was published in late summer of 2011. And then of course, there are some of us who are slightly less diligent in reshuffling the taxonomy deck... though I'd like this column to serve notice that the rumors are absolutely untrue. I did not insist in continuing to label Merlins as Pigeon Hawks, or Peregrines as Duck Hawks, when these species zipped by the Greene Valley hawkwatch this fall. I'm absolutely OK with name changes. It's just that the overwrite on my diminishing little gray cells (stealing shamelessly from Agatha Christie's diminutive Belgian detective, Hercule Poirot) does take time and concentration.

Wait, you ask, what does a fictional Belgian detective have to do with taxonomy? Well, he preached the need for order and method to get it right, exactly the same philosophy as AOU...I think.

Check out the IOS website. There you'll find that the official Checklist of Illinois Birds, as established by the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (IORC) reflects all the changes in species order, names, etc. from the recent AOU report. This essential update was carried out by Bob Hughes, IORC and IOS member, and one of our state's finest birders.

Also available on the website is the current iteration of the Field Checklist of Illinois Birds, an essential carry-along when you're out birding. You can download it as a pdf, then print it double-sided on 8.5x14 paper or light card stock, fold it, and slip it into your pocket. This 3rd edition of the IOS Field Checklist includes 348 species and one unestablished introduction [African Collared-Dove]. It was modified from the 2nd edition by IORC Secretary Doug Stotz and IOS Board member Urs Geiser. Special thanks are due to Urs for undertaking the tedious task of reshuffling species names and order of appearance, while maintaining the integrity of the size and quadrifold layout. Anyone who has extensively modified a document in Word format knows how challenging that can be!

For those of us who have the 'old' list in our memory banks, the name changes are pretty benign. Common Moorhen is back to C. Gallinule (where it started many years ago) and the word Eastern now appears in front of 'our' Whip-poor-will. I'm pretty sure most of us will just say Whip-poorwill, secure in the knowledge that the now split Mexican Whip will not be found in Illinois anytime soon. But those darn warblers!! Ovenbird is now first, and Black-throated Green is just ahead of Canada. That's going to take some getting used to!

With the continued rapid advances in genetic sequencing science, we can be certain that the little gray cells of ornithologists and taxonomists within the AOU are working overtime. Another taxonomy reshuffle will surely be written across the sky in two or three years. Do you think the AOU retirement funds own big chunks of stock in field guide publishers? Hmm...



Anna's Hummingbird: Illinois' First Record

This story begins anecdotally with Frank and Donna Sturm, of rural Chillicothe (Peoria County), Illinois, returning from a mid-November vacation only to discover that one, possibly two, hummingbirds were still visiting their feeders. When Ann Hayes, who lives within a mile of the Sturms, learned of this, she emailed me the following message on 20 Nov. 2010, "...A neighbor of mine is still seeing hummingbirds at her feeder. Mine has been down since Oct. 15. 1 have done some reading, and places on-line state that any birds at the feeders after late October are inferior or sick ruby-throats. Or they may be Rufous Hummingbirds. I am going to ask the neighbor what she is seeing. I have also read that some people leave a feeder up all winter - in Illinois? Would that make any sense at all? How long do you leave your feeders up?" The reason Ann contacted me is because I have been banding Rubythroated Hummingbirds (Archilochus colubris) – 164 to date – at her place each August the past five years.

My email response back to Ann that same day was, "I always encourage people to keep their feeders out until at least Thanksgiving – it's during the months of October through January that the unusual species show up. The Rufous Hummingbird (*Selasphorus rufus*) is the most expected of the unusual species (there's been one down near Charleston, Illinois, the past three weeks). However, other species have been observed here in Illinois.... I'd be interested in hearing more about the hummingbird(s) at



your neighbor's feeders. If they are Ruby-throated, that does not mean anything is particularly wrong with them (after all, if there was something seriously wrong with them they wouldn't have survived this long). If they are something other than Ruby-throats – would you be willing to let me know right away?"

The message continued, "At this time of year these hummingbirds tend to stay at the same feeders for several weeks (since those are usually the only feeders available - because most are taken down before Thanksgiving). People with such birds either bring the feeder in at night and put it out before dawn the next morning, or, they have two feeders and alternate them to keep the juice from getting too cold. Birds coming to feeders at this time of year occasionally stay into January (or all winter) before they finally leave (or disappear). So, again, please let me know if your neighbor thinks she has something other than a Ruby-throat - which is By Vernon Kleen with details from Ann Hayes

a great possibility. If a photo could be taken and sent down to me - that would be helpful."

On receipt of my note, Ann responded late that night (still 20 November), "...I am going to put a feeder out here in hopes that I may attract some hummers and I will speak with the neighbor down the street tomorrow about her hummingbirds."

To Ann's surprise, a hummingbird came to her newly placed feeder almost immediately (21 November). Then, in mid-afternoon on 24 November (the day before Thanksgiving) she emailed me back indicating, "I just called Donna and the hummingbird was at her feeder. She was unable to get a picture - but will keep trying - she does think it is a rufous, and said you would be more than welcome to contact her about coming to band. Now to my hummer - yes, I put out a feeder and immediately got one. We were not home yesterday – but did see it in the a.m. before we left. It is definitely an immature male ruby -1 could see a few red feathers peeking through on his neck. I have not seen him yet today ... however, since Donna just saw hers, mine should show soon. As with Donna, you are more than welcome to come and try to band the one that is here."

Because the Sturms had a potential Rufous Hummingbird, arrangements were made with both the Hayes

and Sturms to arrive at their homes about dawn Saturday morning (27 November) in an effort to find out for sure what species were there, and, perhaps, catch and band them, as well. As I drove out of my garage that morning I could tell that one of my tires was flat. That, basically, cancelled the trip. I waited until 7 a.m. to call the Haveses to let them know that I would not be able to make it. However, since 1 was able to get the tire fixed by 8:30 a.m., I called the Hayeses again and learned that the birds had already appeared at both locations that morning - so I drove up there anyway arriving about 10:30

a.m. The two traps were in place before 11:00 a.m. Thad Edmonds joined me for the "wait". Neither the Hayeses nor the Sturms (nor Thad nor I) saw any hummingbirds after the birds' early morning visits – and we stayed until dark. The birds failed to show on Sunday, as well. We thought that they had, perhaps, already departed.

Communications on Monday and Tuesday were also negative (no birds). Then, on Wednesday, 1 December, Ann wrote, "My little friend made a showing about 15 minutes ago. Do Ruby Throats have red above their eye?" and later that day she provided the first photo. At 4:00 p.m. on 2 December she wrote, "He has been here all day. He has been guarding the feeder from the soft maple tree. I have some more pics to send you--what is strange to me - he has red coming in behind his eye?? I will be here tomorrow." The three photos were received by email and early that evening (still 2 December.) were forwarded on to most IORC members and other birders for review and comment with 1) a note stating, "Ready for another challenge – it may be a real challenge this time." 2) an invitation for everyone to join me at dawn the next morning

to see the bird, and 3) directions on how to get there. On quick review of the photos two IORC members suggested Anna's as a possibility; another suggested an immature male Rubythroated. By the time I had arrived



there the next morning, Ann, too, thought the bird may be an Anna's.

I arrived at the Hayeses home at 6:45 a.m. on 3 December. The trap was in place at 6:55 a.m. The bird arrived at 7:10 a.m. and went directly into the trap without hesitation. It was an immature male Anna's Hummingbird (Calvpte anna). John and Ann Hayes and I were the only ones there for this special event and, on release, the bird made the typical hummingbird departure-fast and away. Although it must have continued to be present somewhere in the area, it was not seen again until Sunday morning, 5 December, by Craig Taylor and colleagues who braved the snow in what could have been a futile trip. However, all who ventured there (despite the snow) from 5-13 December were able to observe this surprising Illinois jewel that appeared reliably many times each day at the Hayeses' feeder kept warm by a heat lamp.

The photos taken by Ann Hayes document this first "official" occurrence of the Anna's Hummingbird in Illinois. For the record, another Anna's Hummingbird (an immature female – photographed) was reported in Carbondale from 17-29 September 1990 (Robinson 1996); that record, because of the difficulty of identification, is considered of hypothetical occurrence.

By the way, we don't know for sure if the bird that we originally drove up

> to see was really a Rufous or not; however, the Anna's obviously, turned out much better—and, even though captured and banded (band number L27034), stayed around for nearly two weeks for the viewing pleasure of approximately 150 observers.

> Although the thrill of seeing the Anna's Hummingbird was "priceless" for those who were privileged to see it, it also provided an economic value as well. The exact number who saw the bird and the number of vehicles that found their way to the Hayes driveway were not recorded every day; however, the amount of time spent, if calculated in terms of dollars per observer

hour (including vacation time some observers took) is beyond the scope of such value. But, a real figure, \$2,000, would be close for just gas alone if 50 vehicles averaged 250-mile roundtrips at 20 miles per gallon with gas near \$3 per gallon.

Inbreeding of Illinois Peregrine Falcons

Inbreeding in raptor populations is not easily determined, but when a high percentage of individuals in a population are banded including many young each year, field observations of banded birds are possible to gather relevant data about such topics. The majority of the re-established Midwest Peregrine Falcon population is banded. The unique color band codes along with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service band that are placed on captured adults or fledging young allow for identification of individuals by scientists and other observers in subsequent years.

Tordoff and Redig (1999) documented only 4 precent of identified breeding pairs as being incestuous. Since the recovery of the species, the first recorded occurrence of inbreeding in Illinois Peregrine Falcons occurred in 2005

when the adult female (Magnolia – band code: blk22R) at the Hyde Park nest mated with her son (band code: b/g S/T) from 2000. Though the peregrines incubated their clutch of four eggs, the gutter nest failed as it ultimately washed out. Though never breeding successfully, this pair remained together in Hyde Park for the next four years.

In 2011, a second pairing of related peregrines occurred. At the Uptown Theater site, the adult female (Zoom b/r *4/H) nested with her son from 2005, Stan (b/g 98/K). Though Zoom was seen early in the breeding season

with her mate of the previous eight years, b/g G/G was last confirmed via bands on 18 March 2011.


The Uptown peregrines successfully fledged two young. Maximum efficiency in copulation (frequency

and success) occurs the week prior to egg laying (Radcliff 1980). Due to the length of time between the last sighting of b/g G/G and the first egg laid on 6 April 2011, odds are in favor of Stan being the biological parent of any fertilized eggs. This will be determined at a later date when the blood samples taken from this year's offspring are genetically mapped against last year's brood.

Isabel Caballero has developed microsatellite DNA primers as part of her recently completed dissertation research at the University of Illinois, Chicago and she has genotyped offspring for parentage studies of previous years' nests in the Chicago region. To ascertain if the eggs from the Uptown inbred pair of peregrines differed from unrelated mates, all eggs from accessible Illinois nests

were weighed and measured shortly after being laid. Peregrine eggs are considered unusually small if their size range number (length x width) is less than 1800 millimeters and unusually large if greater than 2400 millimeters (Radcliff 1980). All Uptown eggs fell within normal parameters. The weight for said eggs was at the upper range (average is 40-50 grams). Overall, the inbred eggs were not significantly different in size or shape from either the rest of the 2011 Illinois eggs or from measurements of peregrine eggs overall.



In the two recent Illinois inbred peregrine pairings, both were cases of a mother paired with her son. This may be in part due to the difference in dispersal distances between the sexes. Female peregrines will travel farther from their natal site to their breeding site while male peregrines stay relatively close (White et al. 2002). Other raptors show similar female-biased dispersal patterns between the sexes with pairing of related adults varying from mothergrandson, to mother-son, to siblings or half siblings (Carlson et al. 1998). The dominant pattern is for an established resident female to be paired with a returning related male.

continues to increase, we could see a greater frequency of inbreeding in the species. Inbreeding currently remains rare in the population, but because of the ongoing monitoring and banding of individuals in the region, we will be able to gather additional data to access the ramifications in the future.

IOS awards seven research grants

One of IOS's primary objectives is to promote scientific research and education in order to improve knowledge and awareness of birds in Illinois. To that end, IOS awards a number of research grants every year. IOS, with the support of organizations including the Chicago Ornithological Society, Kane County Chapter of the Illinois Audubon Society, and a number of individual IOS member donations, the Society was able to award seven grants of \$1,000 each in 2011. Each grant recipient, with a brief summary of their research, is listed here.

Virginia Abernathy

Virginia Abernathy is a graduate student at Western Illinois University. Her project focuses on the potential role ultraviolet light plays in the ability of Brown-headed Cowbird hosts to discriminate between their eggs and a foreign egg. The Northern Cardinal makes a good study species because it is a common host that usually accepts cowbird eggs, although evidence suggests this bird occasionally rejects immaculate or divergent eggs. To determine if a reduction in UV reflectance of cowbird eggs would elicit a rejection response from the cardinal, she tested the following four treatments:

- Cowbird eggs covered with UV-block
- Cowbird eggs covered with petroleum jelly used as a control
- Uncoated cowbird eggs used as a control
- Cardinal eggs covered with UV-block

After UV-block was applied, brightness in the UV spectrum was significantly reduced for both cardinal eggs and



cowbird eggs. The brightness in the UV spectrum was not significantly reduced after the petroleum jelly was applied. No other color spectra were significantly affected by either coating after application; however, cardinals did reject two cowbird eggs with UV-block (11.8%) and three of their own UV-blocked eggs (20%). These data may indicate that UV light plays a role in egg recognition by the Northern Cardinal.

The lack of a significant rejection response may be due to high intraclutch variation (differences in appearance of eggs laid by a single female) found naturally within cardinal clutches and the overall similarity in appearance between cardinal and cowbird eggs.

In addition, though cowbird eggs are typically smaller, they can overlap in size with cardinal eggs, which may have prevented cardinals from evolving a rejection response toward the smaller cowbird eggs. Furthermore, cowbird parasitism is not as costly for cardinals as it is for some species, and therefore, selection pressures to evolve an ability to recognize cowbird eggs are minimal.

Continuing Project Grants

The Illinois Ornithological Society looks forward to receiving new proposals for 2012 projects. Funding availability is variable, based on the changing economy and the political climate. The Society is always looking for ways to continue to provide grants for projects that can positively impact bird conservation and provide knowledge and awareness. John Andrews

John Andrews is a graduate student in the Natural Resources and Environmental Sciences Department at the University of Illinois. His project involves testing the conspecific attraction hypothesis, the tendency of a species to want to settle near one another, on Grasshopper Sparrows and studying nocturnal singing behavior of grassland birds in conjunction with the State Acres for Wildlife Enhancement (SAFE) program in central Illinois.

In 2010 and 2011 Andrews tested whether Grasshopper Sparrows use conspecific cues to select habitat by broadcasting the male Grasshopper Sparrow song.

Song was recorded at night and early mornings to determine if nocturnal song was occurring and if so, which species were singing at night.

Data from the experiment show that Grasshopper Sparrows are attracted to nocturnal singing from conspecifics. In both the 2010 and 2011 breeding seasons, significantly more Grasshopper Sparrows were observed in fields with playback stations broadcasting song than control fields with no treatment.

In 2010 especially, Grasshopper Sparrow densities were twice as high in fields with broadcasting used with their songs as opposed to the calls of other species. Grassland bird song was also recorded in both years, though more heavily in 2010 than 2011.

Preliminary analysis of these data suggests that Grasshopper Sparrows do sing at night. However, further analysis will investigate if nocturnal song is done during specific portions of the breeding season and if nocturnal song differs in structure or frequency from dawn chorus or diurnal songs. Incorporating behavioral natural history in conservation planning is essential to the restoration of declining grassland species like the Grasshopper Sparrow.

Antonio Celis-Murillo

Antonio Celis-Murillo is a graduate student in the Natural Resources and Environmental Sciences Department at the University of Illinois. His project goal is aimed at understanding the function of dawn singing behavior. Dawn singing refers to a period of intense singing activity by birds that usually takes place 30 to 60 minutes before sunlight. During the dawn chorus some species employ different vocalizations than what they use during the rest of the day. Some show high levels of vocal activity while others vocalize infrequently. Several hypotheses concerning the function and evolution of dawn singing have been proposed, however, this phenomenon still remains unclear.

In 2011, in an attempt to characterize patterns of singing activity by all passerine birds, Celis-Murillo recorded 720 dawn and morning choruses at 18 locations distributed across Kennekuk County Park in Vermilion County, Vermilion River Observatory in Vermilion County, and Phillips Tract Natural Area in Champaign County.

Recordings were conducted using autonomous recording units and manual acoustic recording systems (such as parabolic microphones and digital recorders).

These data will provide a thorough understanding of dawn singing behavior and the temporal and spatial patterns of bird vocal behavior in Illinois, such as the species that sing at dawn, the song rates at which they sing (in comparison with morning song) and the type of songs they use.

Understanding the function of dawn singing behavior on passerine birds is critical to develop a robust acoustic method for rapidly and effectively surveying birds using dawn singing. This protocol will be intended to serve as a tool for avian biodiversity assessments by amateurs, universities, government, and non-governmental organizations.

Jason Fischer

Jason Fischer is a fourth year PhD student in the Program of Ecology, Evolution, and Conservation Biology at the University of Illinois. His project explores the relationships between urbanization, avian condition, survival, and foraging behavior.

Urbanization is rapidly and drastically altering the face of the earth, with profound consequences for wildlife. While scientists

know that many species are extirpated by development, they have limited understanding of how species that survive in human-modified environments are impacted by different levels of urbanization.

Fischer uses mist nets to capture birds near feeders across the urbanization gradient present in Champaign County, Illinois.

Avian condition is assessed by measuring mass, fat, and muscle size. Identification bands are then applied to the legs of the birds. Attached to these bands are radio frequency identification (RFID) tags (also called pit tags).



When a tagged bird visits a bird feeder outfitted with an RFID reader, the identity of the individual and the time and duration of its visit is recorded.

This information will allow estimates of survival rates for populations at different levels of urbanization. It will also document changes in use of food resources.

Fischer has marked more than 500 birds with RFID tags. A pilot study conducted in the summer of 2010 suggested that condition does not change with urbanization, but at this time there is insufficient data to calculate survival estimates or compare foraging behavior at different levels of urbanization.

A continuance of this study will obtain a better grasp of the impacts of development and could lead to recommendations that mitigate the negative consequences of urbanization and improve conservation potential of birds that live in cities.



Bethany Krebs

Bethany Krebs is a graduate student in the Program in Ecology, Evolution, and Conservation Biology at the University of Illinois. Her project studies how movements and roosting behaviors of American Robins may impact the transmission of West Nile virus in the Chicago area.

Twenty five birds from seven nests were fitted with radio transmitters and tracked for three months. Mosquitoes, amassing over 200,000, have been collected within and outside of communal roosts for West Nile virus testing.

Radio tagged birds were found using previously unknown small communal roosts of two to five birds. Data also suggest that juvenile robins remain near where they were hatched for approximately three weeks, and then join flocks with other juvenile birds. There is some evidence of brood division between male and female birds, and survival of an adult's allocated fledglings appears to impact where the adult roosts and whether or not it joins a communal roost.

Due to high post-fledging mortality of juvenile birds, it was difficult to determine how parental roosting behaviors impacted the roosting practices of juveniles, however at least two surviving juveniles were found using large communal roosts. Currently the mosquito infection rate data are unavailable, pending testing of collected samples which will likely be finished in 2012.

Annina Rupe

Annina Rupe is a graduate student in the Environmental GIS Post-Baccalaureate Certificate Program and a M.S. candidate in the Department of Biological Sciences at Western Illinois University. Rupe's project investigates the breeding habitat conditions of the Eurasian Tree Sparrow.

The Eurasian Tree Sparrow's United States' population has not been extensively researched, thus the preferred habitat conditions must be identified so other ecological questions about this species can be answered.

During the summer of 2011, forty-two randomly sampled points were visited twice to collect presence/absence data regarding the Eurasian Tree Sparrow and the House Sparrow. Date and time of collection, maximum and average wind speed, and temperature were also recorded.

Geographic information software (ArcGIS) was used to determine the distances from each point to the nearest grassland, cropland, building, water, urban area, and forest.

Additional Eurasian Tree Sparrows were found from a search on rural roads throughout McDonough County and point and climatic data were taken from these positions.

All random point data were imported into a habitat modeling software (Hyperniche) to determine which habitat and environmental factors, such as landscape types,



elevation, and wind, affect the presence of the Eurasian Tree Sparrow and the House Sparrow.

Preliminary data analyses indicate that elevation and average wind speed, and distance to urban areas, forest, water, and grassland affected the House Sparrow presence. Distance to cropland, forest, grass, and buildings were the most important factors for Eurasian Tree Sparrow presence.

Eurasian Tree Sparrows (based on the non-random point data) were typically found at an elevation of 204 meters, were closer to grassland, buildings, and cropland, and farther away from water and urban areas.

The forest variability was 0.60, which means that Eurasian Tree Sparrows occurred where the forest edge was more diverse, such as shrubs jutting out instead of being linear with no variation. Continuing analysis on the random data will focus on determining more specific habitat conditions, based on model output.



Kelly VanBeek

Kelly VanBeek is a graduate student in the Resources and Environmental Sciences Department at the University of Illinois. Her project investigates the nesting ecology of birds in soybean fields, with a comparison of no-till and tilled soybean fields being the main objective. This research builds on current grassland bird research, which began in the summer of 2011.

Sixty-two nests were found in no-till fields, while four were found in tilled fields. The top three species of birds nesting in fields were American Robin, Mourning Dove, and Red-winged Blackbird.

Time-lapse cameras revealed that covotes and thirteen-lined ground squirrels were the most common predators.

No-till fields are more attractive as nesting habitat for birds. Beek suspects that the combination of structure and food resources is what makes these fields attractive. Few nests were destroyed by farming practices, while predators caused the most nest failures. Higher abundances of most bird species were found in no-till than tilled fields as well.

Further research goals include elucidating what attracts birds to no-till fields and examining how birds are impacting potential soybean pests. Ultimately these data will help managers make recommendations that can benefit both crop production and wildlife.

The 2011 Illinois Statewide Spring Bird Count


Population trends




Figure 2. The population of Red-tailed Hawks over the last 35 years in Illinois.

One of the scientific reasons for conducting this count is that birds are among the easiest taxa to monitor, plus birds move easily providing a correlation to the condition of a given habitat. Population trends for three species illustrate the annual variations. First, the decline in Red-headed Woodpeckers (Figure 1) has been documented by various censuses in many parts of the species' range. While many counties still detect the species (90 in 2011) only a couple individuals are detected per county. In contrast, Red-tailed Hawk populations (Figure 2) have steadily increased in the state. In general, Illinois' diurnal rap-

Figure 1. The population of Red-headed Woodpeckers over the last 35 years in Illinois.

tors appear to be in good shape. In 2011, Red-shouldered Hawk, Bald Eagle, Osprey, and Merlin set all-time county highs. Dickcissel (Figure 3) populations have an interesting cyclic pattern. One reason for the fluctuation from year to year could be related to what's happening on the species' Venezuelan wintering grounds. The variation of the annual bird count date could also be a factor.

Results and observations

The total number of species documented during the 2011 count was 263 (See Table 3), with nearly all of the counties reporting at least 100 species (Figure 4). Statistics including number of miles driven, hours walked, and observers, are included in Table 2. These statistics are important because observer hours can affect the significance of the data gathered. An interesting data set is one that shows the commonality of species through time. Though these data can be difficult to interpret because of different effort each year, one approach is to simply rank how common a species is in a given year and compare that rank to previous years. Red-winged Blackbird (Table 1) was the most abundant species detected for the fifth consecutive year. The 2011 count also appeared to be a very good year for White-crowned Sparrow, which ranked 16 or below in the previous four years, but ranked at No. 8 this year.

No new species for the count were found in 2011. In general there were not many rare species detected. Some exceptions include two Whitewinged Scoters in Cook County. This is only the eighth year in which they




have been reported. Also, a Painted Bunting (Jackson County) was found for the third consecutive year in the state, but only the sixth year overall.

As with any year there were several new high counts both for the number of species reported and the number of counties detecting a given species. While the all-time high



counts are interesting it is also important to note the species that were recorded in very low numbers. Here are observations that were gleaned from Table 3.

- An all-time high count of Trumpeter Swans was detected, with the majority of these being in Warren County.
- Four ibises were found (3 Whited-faced and a single Glossy).
- All-time highs of Great Egrets were found both throughout the state and within a single county (DuPage).
- Only 197 Black-crowned Night-Herons were found far below their all-time highs.
- Nine Ospreys in DuPage County tied for the all-time high for a county.
- Bald Eagle numbers continue to increase setting a new all-time high for the third consecutive year. Their numbers have gone from 220 in 2009 to 233 in 2010 to 259 in 2011.
- Merlins (5 in Lake County) and Red-shouldered Hawks (31 in Union County) set all-time highs for a county. In addition, there was an all-time high for the state set with 8 Merlins.
- · Black-necked Stilts continued to increase with an

all-time high for the state and county (39 in Mason County). However, in general it was not a good year for high numbers of shorebirds.

- An all-time high record was set for the number of counties that found Pileated Woodpecker.
- Fayette County was the only location for Bewick's Wren.

Given several new all-time highs were set for different sparrow species, we thought it would be interesting to map out the hot spots in Illinois. (Figures 5-9) Some of the species that are early migrants are, as would be expected, more common in northern Illinois (e.g. Whitethroated Sparrow). While other migrants like Clay-colored Sparrow are more common in the north they appear to be more widespread in the western part of the state. The widespread White-crowned Sparrow is more common in the eastern part of the state. Other breeding species are more common in their core breeding range (e.g. Vesper Sparrow and Lark Sparrow).

Field Notes The 2010-2011 Winter Season

In terms of weather, the Illinois winter of 2010-2011 was very similar to the two previous winter seasons (i.e. colder temperatures and considerable amounts of precipitation). Temperatures fluctuated throughout the entire winter season, ranging from considerably above to well below normal. Periodic occurrences of higher winds produced severely harsh wind chills. Substantial amounts of precipitation were recorded throughout Illinois during frequent minor and major winter storm events. Overall, 23 individual noteworthy winter storms moved across all or a portion of Illinois during 2010-2011. These frequently occurring storms produced a variety of precipitation types (e.g. rain, freezing rain, hail, and snow), depending on the temperature regime at the time of the storm. There were 182 bird species reported throughout the state. However, this community was less diverse than that reported during the previous two winters (185 and 189 species, in 2009-2010 & 2008-2009 respectively). Nevertheless, this still represents a notable wintering avian community for Illinois.

Temperatures during December varied widely across the state ranging from considerably below to considerably above normal. This month was extremely active in terms of regularly occurring winter storms moving through Illinois. The season began with a major winter storm on 3&4 December which produced variable amounts of snowfall (1-8 inches) throughout the northern 2/3 of the state. Another minor storm skimmed the northern tier of counties, dropping approximately 1 inch of snow on 9 December. Shortly thereafter, another major storm occurred on 11&12 December. During the early half of the storm (11 December), moderate to heavy rainfall (0.5-1 inch) fell across the entire state, turning over to 1-6 inches of snow during the latter half of the storm (12 December). Additionally, this storm was accompanied by 20-35 mph winds which produced severe wind chills of -10 to -25 degrees. A few days later (15&16 December), Illinois was hit by another major winter storm which produced 3-6 inches of snow across the northern 1/3 of the state, 1-3 inches of snow in the central 1/3, and light rain and freezing rain through the southern 1/3. On 20 December, Illinois was again punished by a major winter storm. This event dropped 2-6 inches of snow over the northern half of the state and 1-2 inches of snow through the southern half. These storms were also accompanied by moderate wind chills ranging from 0 to -10 degrees. A slower moving major winter storm slammed into Illinois over the Christmas holiday (24&25 December), resulting in 4-8 inches of fresh snow over the northern portion of the state, 2-4 inches in central Illinois, and 1-2 inches across the southern region. The month ended with a storm event on 31 December, which yielded light rain, high winds, falling temperatures, and substantial wind chills throughout the entire state.

Temperatures during January ranged from slightly above to moderately below normal. Following the extremely active weather pattern of December, early January was relatively quiet, with nothing more than brief snow flurries occurring throughout various portions of the state. However, this respite from winter storms was all too brief. Illinois was pounded by a major storm on 11 January, which produced 2-5 inches of snow across the north, 3-6 inches in the central region, and 1-2 inches of snow through the south. A slightly weaker storm moved across the state on 17 January, resulting in light freezing rain and 2-4 inches of snow in the northern 1/3 of Illinois, light rain and freezing rain in the mid-section, and light rain throughout the south. A very weak storm yielded an inch or less of snow across the northern 2/3 of Illinois on 20 January. During the latter portion of the month, a series of milder storms moved across Illinois in fairly quick procession. On 24 January, an inch of snow fell over the central and northeast portions of the state, followed the next day (25 January) by light rain and freezing rain over the extreme southern region. A more widespread storm dropped 1-2 inches of snow in the north, light freezing rain in the center of the state, and light rain through the south on 27 January. The last day of the month, Illinois was slammed by the first of a massive two-pronged winter storm. The weaker first storm produced 1-2 inches of snow in the north and central portions of the state, along with light rain and freezing rain over the southern 2/3 of Illinois. Following this initial storm, the winds increased substantially and temperatures plummeted.

The extremely powerful second storm, which hit Illinois on 1&2 February, created a major blizzard that paralyzed the country from the Great Plains to the east coast. This storm dropped 12-24 inches of snow throughout the northern 2/3 of the state, along with heavy freezing rain and a major icing event through the southern 1/3. Winds from 25-30 mph, created severe wind chills ranging from -20 to -30 degrees on 2&3 February. Two weaker regional storms followed this monster blizzard. Light rain and freezing rain fell across the extreme southern portion of the state on 4 February, while approximately 1 inch of snow fell across the northern 1/3 of Illinois on 6 February. Strong winds and lower temperatures yielded brutal wind chills of -10 to -30 degrees during 6-9 February. This was followed by a two-week period in which no winter storms and much milder temperatures enveloped the state. A smaller storm produced light rain through northern Illinois, including light freezing rain and flurries over the northern tier of counties on 20 February. The latter portion of February experienced a series of relatively weak winter storm events. On 21 February, light rain and freezing rain changing to light snow fell over the northern 1/3 of Illinois, while light to moderate rain occurred through the southern 2/3 of the

state. This was followed by light rain and freezing rain, along with patchy spots of hail, over the entire state on 23 February. The next day (24 February), the northern half of Illinois had 1-3 inches of snowfall, while the southern half of the state experienced light to moderate rain. Another weak storm on 26 February resulted in an inch of snow and light freezing rain in the north, and light rainfall in the south. The winter season ended with a stronger storm on 27& 28 February, which produced light to moderate rain and freezing rain over the northern 2/3 of Illinois, along with moderate to heavy rainfall over the southern 1/3 of the state. February temperatures fluctuated considerably, ranging from well below to well above normal throughout the month.

The 2010-2011 winter bird community included most of the expected wintering birds, along with a fairly large variety of lingering migrants and semi-hardy species. Furthermore, a notable number of uncommon and accidental species were also documented. By the end of the winter season, very little early spring migration had been observed within Illinois.

Overall, most species composing the wintering avifaunal community were observed in less abundant numbers during the 2010-2011 winter season, as compared to the previous winter. In 2010-2011, "waterbirds" was the main species group which increased in overall abundance as compared to last winter. Species groups which decreased in overall abundance included: waterfowl (puddle and diving ducks), upland gamebirds, gulls, "permanent residents," "semi-hardy species," woodpeckers, "open country birds," mimic thrushes, sparrows, and blackbirds. Several species groups had equal numbers of increasing and decreasing species. Among these were: waterfowl (geese), diurnal raptors, shorebirds, doves, thrushes, and finches. Most waterfowl (swans) and owl species were recorded in fairly typical abundances. Several less common species, which are often recorded or should be present within the wintering community, were not encountered in 2010-2011. These species included: Gray Partridge, Eared Grebe, Tree Swallow, House Wren, Sedge Wren, Marsh Wren, Palm Warbler, Indigo Bunting, Dickcissel, and Yellow-headed Blackbird.

The avian community reported this winter included ten extraordinary species (Barrow's Goldeneye, Gyrfalcon, Mew Gull, Slaty-backed Gull, Glaucous-winged Gull, Anna's Hummingbird, Rufous Hummingbird, Bohemian Waxwing, Chestnut-collared Longspur and Henslow's Sparrow), which required review by the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (IORC) before they could be accepted (Illinois Ornithological Records Committee 2007). Several additional species requiring IORC review were also observed within the state. Among these, some of the more interesting species included: Great Egret, Whooping Crane, American Avocet, Greater Yellowlegs, Least Sandpiper, Pectoral Sandpiper, Dunlin, Little Gull, California Gull, Forster's Tern, Barn Owl, Varied Thrush, Gray Catbird, Smith's Longspur, Orangecrowned Warbler, Pine Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, and Chipping Sparrow.

Waterfowl to Vultures

During the 2010-2011 winter season, 35 species of waterfowl were recorded within Illinois. This community included: 6 geese, 3 swans, 9 "puddle ducks," and 17 "diving ducks." Overall, the majority of waterfowl species, including both "puddle" and "diving ducks," were less abundant this winter. By comparison, geese had equally as many increasing

(i.e. Greater White-fronted and Ross's Geese) as decreasing (i.e. Snow, Cackling, and Canada Geese) species, while swans were reported in similar numbers to last winter. Continuing a trend noted over the past few years, overall goose populations wintering at traditional central and southern locations appeared to be considerably reduced. Nevertheless, noteworthy numbers were reported at some traditional concentration sites like Carlyle Lake. The 50 Ross's Geese noted were an exceptional flock.

The majority of both "puddle duck" and "diving duck" species were observed in lower abundance during the 2010-2011 winter season. This included the trend of substantially reduced populations of ducks at traditional central and southern wintering concentration sites. The only notable duck concentrations were found at Lake Chautauqua NWR, Carlyle Lake, and Winthrop Harbor in Lake County. Two Barrow's Goldeneye were good finds, especially the one on the Mississippi River, allowing many observers to view it.

Ring-necked Pheasant was slightly more numerous this year, though all other upland gamebirds were less abundant statewide. Very few Northern Bobwhites were observed in the northern 2/3 of the state. The ongoing trend of no Gray Partridge reports, suggested the likely disappearance of this species from Illinois.

Among the other "waterbirds," 2 species of loon, 3 grebe, 3 heron, and 2 vulture species were observed this winter. Black-crowned Night-Herons and Black Vultures were reported in numbers similar to the previous year.

Diurnal Raptors to Terns

During the 2010-2011 winter season, 13 species of diurnal raptors were encountered within the state. Most of these species were reported in similar numbers to last winter. However, the Northern Harrier and American Kestrel decreased in abundance, while the Bald and Golden Eagles and Northern Goshawk exhibited slight to moderate increases.

American Coots and Sandhill Cranes were considerably less numerous this winter statewide. One early arriving Whooping Crane was flying over Chicago in February. The only notable concentration of cranes was observed in Kankakee County in early December.

A total of 8 shorebird species were recorded in Illinois this season. Wilson's Snipe and American Woodcock were more abundant this winter, while Killdeer were slightly less plentiful. Lingering shorebirds in early December included American Avocets, Least Sandpipers, Dunlin, and Pectoral Sandpiper. Additionally, a very early spring migrant Greater Yellowlegs was detected in late February.

An impressive 14 species of gulls and 1 tern were identified in Illinois this winter. Among the wintering gull community however, all species were either less abundant or were reported in numbers similar to last season. Of the more unusual wintering gulls, Iceland and Glaucous were less plentiful, while Thayer's, Lesser Black-backed, and Great Black-backed were similar in abundance to 2010-2011. Both Ring-billed and Herring Gulls were reported in greatly reduced numbers statewide. The only noteworthy concentration of Ring-billed Gulls was observed at Carlyle Lake. The "semi-hardy" Bonaparte's Gull was also present in considerably lower abundance. Two other species requiring IORC documentation were recorded this winter including a California Gull in Lake County, and a flock of Forster's Terns with the collection of unusually late shorebirds at Rend Lake. Three extraordinary gulls were also observed

briefly at various locations including Mew, Slaty-backed, and Glaucous-winged.

Pigeons to Kinglets

Eurasian Collared-Doves were more abundant, while Mourning Doves were considerably less numerous statewide this winter. Few observations of Monk Parakeets were reported.

Eight species of owls were found in Illinois this season. Most owls were recorded in similar numbers as last winter, except Barn and Long-eared, which were less abundant. Only two Snowy Owls were observed, one by many, in the north-central part of Illinois. Illinois did play host to two rare hummingbird species this year in early December, including Illinois's first accepted Anna's Hummingbird and a beautiful, cooperative, male Rufous Hummingbird, both in central Illinois.

With the exception of the Yellow-bellied Sapsucker which was present in usual numbers, all woodpecker species were reported less abundanlyt statewide. Only two Eastern Phoebes were observed in the south. Loggerhead Shrikes were nearly absent from the state this winter, with only three reports, while Northern Shrikes were present in similar numbers to last winter.

Other than the American Crow, the common "permanent resident" species (i.e. corvids, chickadees, Tufted Titmouse, and nuthatches) were encountered in slightly to greatly reduced numbers this season. It was a "low" year in numbers of the cyclic Red-breasted Nuthatch. Horned Larks and Brown Creepers were considerably less numerous throughout Illinois during the 2010-2011 winter season. No late-lingering swallows were detected this winter within the state.

Only the two typical wintering species of wrens were found in Illinois this season, and both were reported in greatly reduced numbers statewide. Additionally, both kinglets were present in substantially lower numbers throughout the state.

Thrushes to Buntings

A total of 4 thrush and 3 mimid species were observed this winter. All species were reported in substantially lower numbers, with the exception of the American Robin, which was much more abundant this year. European Starlings were considerably less numerous with no notable concentrations reported. American Pipits were present in typical numbers this year, while Cedar Waxwings were considerably more plentiful across the state.

Four species of warbler were recorded in Illinois this winter. Although more widely distributed, Yellow-rumped Warblers were less abundant statewide. The other three warbler species were all noteworthy in terms of wintering occurrences. Eastern Towhees were somewhat less abundant this winter, while three Spotted Towhees were located, and two photographed. Fifteen species of sparrow were observed this winter in Illinois, all in slightly-to-greatly reduced numbers. The exceptions included American Tree Sparrow, Chipping Sparrow, and Le Conte's Sparrow, which were all more abundant this season. The Chipping Sparrow, which used to be a very unusual winter visitor, continues to be reported in greater wintering numbers, this year being found in all three regions of the state. Northern Cardinals and Lapland Longspurs were substantially less numerous throughout Illinois during the 2010-2011 winter, though the Snow Bunting was considerably more numerous and widespread throughout the state. A single Smith's Longspur was reported once again this winter.

Blackbirds to Weaver Finches

During the winter 2010-2011 season, 7 species of blackbird were identified within the state. The majority of these species were encountered in decreased numbers, although Red-winged and Brewer's Blackbirds were more abundant statewide. Concentrations of these birds at traditional southern wintering locales were once again considerably reduced.

Eight species of finch were reported this winter. House Finches and Pine Siskins were more numerous, while the American Goldfinch decreased in abundance, with Purple Finches recorded in similar numbers to the previous winter. There was a relatively good movement of "winter finches" into Illinois this winter, with small numbers of redpolls regularly encountered throughout northeastern Illinois and a fairly large number of Pine Siskins in the northern half of the state. Few but both crossbill species were also observed this winter.

Acknowledgments

The foundation of this summary was the detailed information regarding wintering avian populations as submitted directly to the compiler by field observers throughout the state. Maximum counts are provided, where available, from each of the three regions of Illinois (north, central, and south) as described by Bohlen (1978). Additional data reflecting the progress of the season are noted, when available, for species and areas of special interest. The species accounts which follow, utilize the taxonomy and nomenclature of the 52nd Supplement from the 7th Edition of the A.O.U. Check-list (American Ornithologists' Union 2011) and the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (1999).






