


President's Message

Is it time to do it again?

26 years ago, almost 1,000 birders across Illinois made a commitment to participate in a five-year survey of our state's breeding birds. The goal was "...to conduct a comprehensive and systematic statewide survey of breeding birds, to document their distribution and status in the state." In 1991, after several hundred thousand hours of volunteer time in the field, the survey work was completed, and the lengthy process of collecting, consolidating and analyzing the data began, culminating in the publication of *The Illinois Breeding Bird Atlas, Illinois Natural History Survey Special Publication 26*, authored by Vern Kleen, Liane Cordle and Bob Montgomery.

It's beyond the scope of this column to name all the myriad people who helped make this mammoth project a reality. But it's certainly fair to say this was a true commitment by our state's great birding community – to come together and work toward the common goal of capturing the data needed to assess the what and where of Illinois' breeding birds.

Why, do you ask, should we do it again? And even if we should do it again, isn't it too soon? There are several reasons:

Climate change is apparently having an effect on the breeding ranges of various species, especially some southern species, which appear to be making big moves northward. Land uses continue to change. On the positive side, restoration technology has advanced and has brought back some major habitat chunks available to our breeding birds. On the negative side, agricultural practices continue to change, and some of those changes may be having a profound effect on certain species. One of the goals of the first survey was to provide a baseline to monitor change. Some states have already completed their second round (our neighbor to the north is in the early stages of planning their second survey. And they completed their first survey nine years after Illinois). In casual conversations about the need for another atlas with some of our birding friends, some have asked: "Doesn't eBird make the need for these surveys a thing of the past?" I think the simple answer to that question is - No. While a great resource, eBird does not provide the rigorous, carefully designed database needed for a comprehensive atlas.

It is also certainly true that today's technology makes it possible to simplify and streamline the data entry process. Can't you just see it – surveying an atlas block and immediately entering your data into a dedicated user friendly website, using your smartphone, iPad, etc.!

As you read this column, we have simultaneously activated a simple on line survey, asking whether you would be willing to volunteer for field surveys, what part of the state do you reside, are you willing to help in the overall organizing process, etc. We will be providing access to this same survey to all the state's birders, IOS members and non members alike, via IBET, the Illinois Birders Forum, BCNnet, and other appropriate listservs. Please take a few minutes to complete the survey.

Given the degree of advance organization required, it's likely the first field work would be the spring/summer of 2014 at the earliest.

Letter from the Editor

Let's flock together ...

IOS President Bob Fisher's message in this issue about a potential second Illinois Breeding Bird Atlas brought back memories. I really learned my breeding birds those five summers, including the sounds of young Yellow-headed Blackbirds begging from their natal marsh, as well as the fact that female Bobolinks look nothing like the males. That was long ago, and the memory reminds me that learning about birds and their behaviors and plumages continues indefinitely.

During the atlas, I discovered the Yellow-headed Blackbirds nesting in a marsh located on a gun club's property – the owners graciously allowed me to survey the area. I also discovered Yellow-headed Blackbirds nesting, in the same atlas block no less, in a marsh with a few houses on one side. Those blackbirds are no longer nesting in either place, and as you may know, this species might one day become extirpated from our state. It might be disheartening to go out in the same block and not discover the blackbirds, but the information would be important to tell the story of this bird's nesting status in Illinois.

I also remember the Western Meadowlark that sang in Lake County all summer long while I was working on the project, plus the discovery of three different Cedar Waxwing nests and how the bird sneaks in from the bottom of the tree to get to its nest. What joy to see the wide gapes of the nestlings as their parents plunked food into their mouths.

I would so enjoy embarking on that journey again, but it seems we are all so much busier now than we were back then, at least I seem to be — and I wonder would we be able to do it again? Would I? But there's one really important reason that has me thinking now is the time to repeat the project. It would bring us together. It seems sometimes, just as the nation seems divided, birders in Illinois can sometimes be divided. For one, there are all those contests out there where birders are doing big days and trying to beat one another, which can sometimes lead to divisiveness.

So, if all the birders in the state embarked on a single project, would that not be a way to bring us together? We can share stories about what we're seeing, help each other out and create more information for ornithologists. I'm willing to give it a try. We need the flock of birders in our state to pull together for the good of each other and birds, just like, if I may be so bold as to say, we need a nation less divided and more interested in helping out our fellow mankind.



Bohm Woods and the SIUE Nature Preserve: Valuable Conservation Assets for Southwestern Illinois

Introduction

Madison County, located in southwestern Illinois along the Mississippi River near St. Louis, was historically characterized by a mosaic of diverse habitat types. This included rich bottomland and upland bluff forests, shrublands, wetlands, and a variety of prairie types. The diversity of habitat supported an equally diverse avifauna. Unfortunately, agriculture and urbanization have dramatically altered the landscape, replacing natural areas with crop monocultures, manicured lawns, buildings, roads, and parking lots. Today, the remaining habitat is highly fragmented and overrun with invasive plant and animal species.

Recently, there has been a concerted effort to identify and protect the few remaining areas of natural habitat in this region. In 2006, Bohm Woods was added to the Illinois Nature Preserve system. This 92-acre preserve was purchased by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources using funds from a settlement with Dynegy, Inc. over noncompliance with the Clean Air Act (Davis, 2006). While relatively small in size, Bohm Woods encompasses the highest quality old growth forest

remaining in the region. The landscape is impressive, with loess hills interdigitated by networks of steep ravines, draining into a bottomland hardwood forest that is part of the Cahokia Creek floodplain. Massive hardwoods and a rich assemblage of understory vegetation offer native birds a degree of vertical complexity that is unusual for the region.

The 2660-acre campus of Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) is located immediately to the south of Bohm Woods and includes some of the largest remaining forest patches in the area. These upland forests have a mixed disturbance history. The majority of forests on campus were agricultural land prior to development of the campus ~ 50 years ago. However, small areas of old growth persist in association with ravines.




Figure 1. Aerial photo of three bluff forest patches in Madison County, IL where avian monitoring is being conducted. Dotted white lines indicate approximate boundaries of the SIUE Nature Preserve, which includes Sweet William Woods. Solid white lines indicate approximate boundaries for Bohm and Bluebell Woods. Dots indicate locations of sampling plots (N = 130).

In 2010, a faculty-led initiative resulted in designation of ~380 acres of undeveloped land along the western border of campus as the SIUE Nature Preserve. This protected area, located on the bluffs adjacent to the American Bottoms, was designed to serve as a habitat corridor (SIU Edwardsville to Bohm Woods or "E2B corridor") linking the largest

forest patch on campus, ~150 acre Sweet William Woods, with Bohm Woods Nature Preserve. Corridors are valuable conservation tools that provide connectivity and an opportunity for gene flow for species in fragmented landscapes. The habitat corridor created by the SIUE Nature Preserve includes Sweet William Woods, a restored prairie known as Whiteside Prairie, and a wooded corridor, portions of which border 78-acre Cougar (Tower) Lake (Figure 1).

In 2008, thanks to the support of the Illinois Ornithological Society/ Du Page Birding Club, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. and the National Great Rivers Research and Education Center, we initiated long-term monitoring of the bluff forest bird community in the two forest patches (Bohm and Sweet William Woods) joined by the corridor, as well as an additional forest patch (75-acre Bluebell Woods), located outside the corridor. We are particularly interested in monitoring species of conservation concern, such as the state threatened Cerulean Warbler, which has been occasionally observed in Bohm Woods, as well as on the SIUE campus. In addition to monitoring populations of resident and migratory bird species utilizing bluff forests, we are also generating predictive habitat models that will enable us to identify suitable habitat for each species in order to make more informed land use decisions.

Materials and Methods

We selected 130 randomized

= 66) for our study. At each plot, we collected a suite of vegetation variables, including: Distance to edge, Successional age of the forest (based on analysis of historic aerial photos; Fritzgerald and Minchin, in prep), total richness (native and exotic), total shrub density (native and exotic), total tree dominance, total groundlayer cover, total tree density, 90th percentile DBH, snag class, coarse woody debris class, and canopy height. In addition, we used the statistical techniques known as non-metric multidimensional scaling (NMDS) and Lance-Williams flexible beta clustering, to summarize the major dimensions of variation in forest species composition and to classify the three forest patches into four forest types: Group 1: Sugar maple -

White ash - Red oak - Basswood for-

est; Group 2: White Ash - White Oak

- Hickory forest; Group 3: Box elder

- Hackberry - Elm forest; Group

4: Black locust - Hackberry - Elm

(Looft et al. in prep).

We conducted fixed-distance point-count surveys (25 m radius) from May-July, 2008 and from May-August 2010 at each of the 130 plots (see Richter et al. 2010). Surveys were conducted daily from 0600-1000 hours except when raining, foggy, or excessively windy. Each survey included a 1 minute warm-up period, followed by a 5 minute sampling period. Before the warm-up period a laser rangefinder was used to mark distance. All birds seen or heard during the sampling period were recorded (Bibby et al. 2000).



During the sampling period a digital voice recorder (Olympus DS-40) was used to record songs and calls for subsequent identification in the lab. Plots were visited multiple times during the spring and summer.

Survey data were used to estimate population densities for individual species and for comparisons of species richness and diversity among forest patches. In addition, we conducted an indicator species analysis (Dufrene and Legendre 1997) in order to identify bird species that best differentiated the forest patches. The combined survey and vegetation data are currently being used to build predictive habitat models using logistic regression.

Results and Discussion

We recently published results from the 2008 season (Richter et al. 2010) and are currently combining this dataset with additional data from our 2010 survey. To date, we have encountered a combined total of 92 species during point count surveys within the three forest patches over the two field seasons (Table 1).

Research findings thus far underscore the importance of the E2B corridor and the avian community which it supports. For example, the Sweet William Woods, which is part of the corridor, exhibited the highest number of species (n = 63). In addition, species diversity, which incorporates both species richness and evenness, was highest for the

two forests (Bohm and Sweet William Woods) within the corridor (Richter et al., 2010).

Species found to be indica-

tors for Bohm Woods included a number of forest interior species, such as the Wood Thrush. Other indicators included three woodpeckers (Downy, Hairy, and Northern Flicker), two additional thrushes (Swainson's and American Robin), two warblers (Yellow and Black-throated Green), two apodiforms (Ruby-throated Hummingbird and Chimney Swift),

one sparrow (White-throated), and

one flycatcher (Acadian). Bohm

Woods was especially attractive to

Acadian Flycatchers. Three species

were indicators for Sweet William

Woods including the Carolina

Chickadee, Carolina Wren, and Kentucky Warbler. In contrast, Bluebell Woods, which is largely comprised of young forest, was characterized by a larger number of relatively common species including Northern Cardinal, American Goldfinch, Tufted Titmouse, Eastern Towhee, Common Grackle, Blackcapped Chickadee and Blue-gray Gnatcatcher.




Figure 2. Habitat model for the Wood Thrush, *Hylocichla mustelina* in Bohm Woods. Shading indicates probability of encountering a Wood Thrush based on a logistic regression model. The model indicated a positive association with distance to edge (French et al. in prep).

We have created habitat models for 82 bird species with 54 exhibiting significant associations with one or more habitat variables (French et al. in prep). Figure 2 shows an example of a habitat model for the Wood Thrush in Bohm Woods, demonstrating the utility of this approach. In this instance, the Wood Thrush, was found to exhibit a positive association with distance to edge. The model predicts the highest probability (~60%) of encountering a Wood Thrush in the forest interior

and lower probabilities toward the edge. It is easy to see how such information might facilitate sound management decisions. For example, any management practice that led to a reduction of forest interior habitat, would likely result in a reduced probability of encountering a Wood Thrush. Of course, there are additional factors that must be considered

as well, such as the ability of species to breed successfully in a particular area. Wood Thrushes, for example, are frequent targets of brood parasitism from Brown-headed Cowbirds (Robinson et al. 1995). In a similar way, detailed modeling of cowbirds could lead to more effective management strategies for minimizing their impact. In the future, we hope

to incorporate nest examination into the study to determine if species are using these forests as breeding habitat or for migratory stopovers. For those species which do attempt to breed, we would like to know if their attempts result in success or failure. In other words, do bluff forests constitute source or sink habitat for individual bird species?

Bohm Woods Nature Preserve, in particular, offers a unique glimpse into Illinois' past. We encourage you to visit on your next birding trip.

The Bobolinking Project: Experiments in Field Ornithology

The Bobolinking Project was a part of Audubon's Together Green initiative. The project's main goal was to link young people to stewardship and ecological monitoring opportunities at Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie and Bartel Grassland in Illinois. Project participants learned about one of the rarest of North America's major biomes, the tallgrass prairie. This habitat is an important breeding ground for many grassland bird species which are among the fastest and most consistently declining birds in North America. A series of outreach activities, educational workshops and hands-on field activities were conducted to show participants what they could do – individually and together – to protect and improve the quality of this ecosystem on which people and birds depend.

Outreach

Ten outreach presentations with a total of 100 attendees were given to high schools and community-based organizations in Plainfield, Oak Forest, Chicago, Frankfort and Wilmington to recruit high school and junior high school students. Additionally, a website was launched in April 2009 to reach a broader audience.


Workshops

Seven workshops were conducted with a total of 80 participants (Figures 1 & 2). The workshops gave students the opportunity to learn about grassland bird identification and breeding biology. Students learned about the basic criteria used for bird identification such as size, shape, behavior, field marks and song. They learned how to use monitoring field equipment including binoculars and GPS units. They also were educated about how they could help establish or improve bird habitat in their local area, monitor bird

populations and advocate for birds and their conservation needs.

Field experiments

Two field experiments with a total of 80 participants were conducted (Figures 3 & 4). Students examined nest predation rates on artificial ground nests at two grassland sites in the Chicago Wilderness region. They assessed potential predation pressures as a function of proximity to a walking trail, grassland site, and type of egg. A total of 208 nests were deployed - 120 at Bartel Grassland and 88 at Midewin. Nests were placed at varying distances (2m, 5m, 10m, 25m) from a walking trail and were baited with one Japanese quail (Corturnix japonica) egg and one plasticine egg. Quail eggs (24 x 30mm) were used to simulate a larger songbird egg such as a Dickeissel (Spiza americana), Eastern Meadowlark (Sturnella magna), and Bobolink (Dolichonyx oryzivorus). The plasticine eggs (19mm x 15mm/6.1grams)

approximated a smaller songbird egg such as a Grasshopper Sparrow (Ammodramus savannarum), Savannah Sparrow (Passerculus sandwichensis), and Henslow's Sparrow (Ammodramus henslowii). Using eggs of different sizes ensured that small predators such as mice could depredate nests as well as larger predators. Nest monitoring was conducted at 3 day intervals for two 12 day periods from late May 2009 through June 2009. An additional 58 baited nests were set out with digital motionsensitive cameras to identify nest predators both diurnal and nocturnal at both sites.

Results from a survival analysis indicated that overall rates of predation differed by site, type of egg predated and proximity to the walking path. Nests at Midewin experienced greater predation than those at Bartel (Tarone-Ware $\chi 12 = 5.029$, p < 0.025; Figure 5). Predation rates were significantly higher for plasticine eggs compared to quail eggs at both sites (Tarone-Ware $\gamma 12 = 37.197$, p < 0.001; Figure 6). At Bartel, proximity to a walking path influenced nest survival. Nests placed 5m from the walking path were most successful, while

those placed 25m from the path were least successful (Tarone-Ware $\chi 12 = 25.851$, p < 0.000; Figure. 7). In contrast, at Midewin, distance had no discernable effect on nest outcome. A logistic regression analysis was performed on final levels of predation and supported results from the survival analysis.

Both avian bill marks and small to mid-sized mammal dental imprints were recovered on plasticine eggs. Potential predators included raccoon (Procyon lotor), white-tailed deer (Odocoileus virgianianus), thirteen-lined ground squirrel (Spermophilus tridecemlineatus) and small rodents (Peromyscus spp. and Microtus spp.). Photographs documented both mammalian (Figure 8) and avian predators (Figure 9) in the study area. White-tailed deer, thirteen-lined ground squirrels and Eastern Meadowlarks were captured destroying eggs at artificial nests. Study results suggested that different

patterns of predation and predator assemblages impact nest outcome at these sites.

Restoration workdays

Two restoration days took place with a total of 37 attendees. Restoration efforts entailed the planting of native species and collecting seeds. Through the restoration efforts, participants learned about the habitat needs of various bird species and the effect of invasive plant species on bird habitat and associated ecosystems. Students from Oak Forest High School participated in a wetland restoration day at Bartel and planted blue flag iris (Iris virginica) plugs (Figure 10). Students from Concordia Place collected golden Alexander (Zizia aurea) seeds and planted aromatic aster (Aster oblongifolius) plugs at the Midewin seed beds (Figure 11).

Birding the Jane Addams Trail in Northwestern Illinois

One of the richest birding spots in the greater Freeport area is to be found along the Jane Addams Trail, a former railroad bed, which currently extends from the southern trailhead west of Route 26 and just south of the Route. 20 bypass, north to the Badger Trail at the Wisconsin stateline. The southern trailhead abuts the Pecatonica River. Traveling north, on foot or by bicycle, one soon finds the trail following the floodplain of Richland Creek virtually all the way to the stateline. Numerous bridges along the route afford excellent viewing access to the meandering Richland Creek bottomlands, wetlands, feeder streams and the habitats associated with them.

More than 100 herbaceous plant species provide ground cover beneath the 27 shrub species and 34 tree species initially documented. Needless to say, this plant diversity welcomes many of our feathered friends. A survey by two experienced birders, Mary Blackmore and Dan Wenny, on the northern


half of the trail from Richland Road to the stateline recorded 77 species. Bird walks by the Northwest Illinois Audubon Society usually note some 55 species for a two-mile morning stroll in April.

In March, waterfowl can be found in the numerous backwaters and man-made ponds near the trail. Wood Ducks raised their young in

several of the backwater ponds. Sedge meadows attract Swamp Sparrows, Sedge Wrens and rails. The wetlands south of Orangeville host breeding Sandhill Cranes, and in drier years, exposed mudflats provided habitat for a variety of shorebirds. Grassland birds such as meadowlarks and sparrows can be found in the open areas of Butterfly

Red-necked Phalarope. This is one of the more uncommon species that has been seen along the Jane Addams Trail.


Farm, a trailside holding of the Jane Addamsland Park Foundation. Cliff Swallows use nearby bridges for their nesting colonies. Woodland areas along the trail attract a variety of warblers during migration.

Certain areas along the trail have already gained some notoriety. One remembers the Virginia Rail in the sedge meadow just south of Route 26 at Orangeville, or the Red-necked Phalarope and the Marbled Godwits at the Orangeville wetland, or the Golden-crowned Sparrow and the Great Horned Owl nest with their two young trailside at Scioto Mills. As more birders visit the area, such special spottings are certain to increase.

While major parking areas are only available at the southern trailhead and the Orangeville trailhead by the BP station, one can gain access to the trail nearly anywhere that one of ten roads cross it. This is an agricultural region so be sure to consider this when parking along a roadside.



Field Notes: The 2011 Breeding Season



The statewide average of 6.73 inches of rain in June represented a 2.65-inch surplus, to go along with the 1.33-inch surplus that fell in May, and 3.79-inch surplus in April. All of this rainfall caused many rivers throughout the state to inundate large areas with their floodwaters including the Illinois, Mississippi and Ohio Rivers, all above flood stage during June. Many of these major rivers' tributaries were also in flood including the LaMoine River at Ripley, Bear Creek near Marceline and the Little Wabash below Clay City. The water levels there were all the highest on record for them for June. The Rock, Green, Pecatonica, Iroquois, Kankakee, Mackinaw, Kaskaskia, Embarras, Cache and several other rivers were either above or much above normal stream flow for much of June over part or all

of their lengths. Rend, Shelbyville and Carlyle Lakes were also all several feet above their summer target levels. This continued well into July at most of these locations, making it the 12th wettest May-July on record. Much of this rainfall occurred as severe weather systems, which swept though the state. Severe weather was widely reported in both June and July, with June producing 8 tornadoes, 53 reports of significant hail, and 213 wind damage reports occurring mostly on June 4, 8, 10, 15, 17-19, 22, 25-26, and 30 with baseball-sized hail in Augusta, on 10 June. The severe weather continued into July with reports of three tornadoes, five significant hail events and 109 damaging winds. It is feared that as many as 50% of nests and some to many adults of Illinois's small remaining Greater Prairie-Chicken nesting population were destroyed/killed during equally and even more destructive weather that occurred during that species' nesting attempts in April and May, during a particularly bad hail storm in that area. Downed trees were another common consequence of many of these strong storms, so large numbers of forest nesting songbirds and/or their nests were likely destroyed by the severe weather. Early season cool and wet conditions for nesting Eastern Bluebirds reduced the numbers of young produced by them, and possibly for Eastern Phoebes, Purple Martins, Tree Swallows, and possibly early cavity-nesting species including chickadees, titmice, nuthatches and some woodpeckers.

On the positive side, this summers large periodic cicada emergence over much of the southern third to half of Illinois was likely a boon to many nesting species that often feed on such insects such as Mississippi Kites, cuckoos, Red-headed Woodpeckers, flycatchers, Cedar Waxwings and others.

Ducks through Hawks

An impressive array of 23 waterfowl species was located throughout Illinois, which included 19 species of duck. However, other than the usual nesting species and both teal, observers were able to confirm breeding for few of the many species found. Some of them surely attempted to nest, especially at places like Hennepin and Thompson Lakes, the two large and relatively recently restored wetlands

species in Illinois?).

along the Illinois River. Now filled to capacity, Thompson Lake and other nearby wetlands at the Emiquon Preserve are attracting many rare marsh-nesting species as well as a large array of uncommon to rare migrants, some of which may someday stay to nest.

Wild Turkey is quickly becoming the most likely gallinaceous species to be found throughout the state. Gray Partridge is probably near extirpation from Illinois, and the previous few harsh winter weather seasons have decimated numbers of the once common Northern Bobwhite and Ringnecked Pheasant from much of the state, birds which continue to suffer from ever-fewer acres of necessary habitat needed to survive. Although many would put the blame on supposed increasing numbers of coyotes, the real problem has and always will be the loss of habitat caused by man, which have lowered these birds numbers all along.

There were increased sightings of the usual (basic-plumaged) non-breeding, Common Loons, though increased numbers of breeding Pied-billed Grebes were a direct result of significantly more numerous areas to breed in due to the recharging of many wetlands from heavy rainfall.

The newly located nesting locations for both Anhinga, American White Pelican and Caspian Terns were once again in use, and numbers may even be increasing, as the use of a second nearby nesting island for the pelicans and higher numbers of Anhingasand Caspian Terns at the nesting sites indicates. Although the large amount of rain and floodwaters likely improved feeding opportunities for the heron family, and possibly enticed new rookeries to form, numbers of reports were pretty much normal. Probably the most unusual vagrant record of the season, the Wood Stork that showed up in early June in Lake County not only set a northernmost occurrence record for the state but was also one of the earliest Wood Storks to arrive in Illinois during the summer/fall season by almost two months. This bird follows on the equally unusual occurrence of 3 encounters (at three locations) this past spring, by the stork's related and closely allied species, the White Ibis (all in adult plumage) in southern and even central Illinois. Only three other adult-plumaged White Ibis have been found in Illinois, and encouters of all four ibis species seem to slowly be increasing especially during their more usual, post-breeding dispersal and arrival period into Illinois.

The new, disjunct population of Mississippi Kites breeding in Rockford continue to return to breed in their residential, urban neighborhood. Both Osprey and Bald Eagle nests continue to appear in new areas around the state. Nesting was not confirmed for Northern Harrier or Sharpshinned Hawk this year but Cooper's Hawk has likely returned to historic breeding population levels for this species throughout the former breeding range in Illinois. Few pairs of breeding Swainson's Hawks were located again this year, leading one to wonder how much longer they will remain an Illinois breeding species.

Rails through Woodpeckers

Two endangered Black Rails were located this summer, singing at both a central and northern Illinois location in June and July indicating probable breeding. One responded several times to recorded playbacks of the song, while the other was at the same location as one reported in 2010. King Rails were only located at two, longtime breeding areas in Illinois. Sora and Virginia Rails were located in typical numbers in their northern Illinois strongholds, though a Sora summering in a vard in the middle of the "corn and soybean" desert" was quite unusual. One summering Purple Gallinule was located while Common Gallinule breeding locations/ numbers were up. Sandhill Crane breeding numbers and locations continue to increase throughout the northern half of Illinois, with rumors of other, more southern nesting locations outside this species normal range reaching this author, though details were lacking. The Vermilion County pair returned to attempt nesting again, though were once again unsuccessful, likely due to predation of the young.

Nesting shorebirds bred in typical numbers, though new locations for breeding Black-necked Stilt seem to be located in new areas in Illinois each year. Recharged wetlands in several areas may have enticed a few Wilson's Snipe to stay and nest in new areas in the northern half of the state. Seven species of gull (two nesting species) and five species of tern were found in their usual northeastern Illinois breeding locations, though almost all of the nesting species only do so at one or a few locations. Though the Caspian Tern breeding colony atop a building in Chicago appeared to grow, no breeding colonies for Forster's Terns, which formerly bred, have been located for several years now, and only a few small breeding colonies of Black Terns remain in Lake and McHenry counties. The lone Common Tern nesting population continues to suffer from the negative effects of weather, predation and possibly chemical contamination, despite valiant attempts by biologists and volunteers to keep the nesting colony active.

The non-native Eurasian Collared-Dove population continues to grow in Illinois, and the species can likely be found in every county in the state. Black-billed Cuckoo numbers remained at their low ebb, while the slight increase of Yellow-billed Cuckoos over the past couple of years may be more a function of more birds stopping to take advantage of this year's periodic cicada emergence in the southern half of the state. Caprimulgid species continue to be reported in much lower than historic numbers, though smaller towns with older buildings which retain their pebble-topped, breeding roofs, still hold on to a few to several breeding pairs of Common Nighthawks. Vern Kleen's extensive banding efforts with Ruby-throated Hummingbirds continue to show the true abundance of these birds in a way that single-observer sightings cannot. However, I will continue to give maximum counts of hummingbirds found by observers in their daily observations, despite their disparity with Kleen's banding numbers. The Pileated Woodpecker appears to slowly be making inroads into new breeding areas in northeastern Illinois.

12 Meadowlark

Passerines

Several Least Flycatchers were once again detected into mid-June, but without any confirmation of breeding. It is unclear if the small population that formally bred each year at Lowden-Miller State Forest is still present. A number of Western Kingbirds were discovered this year, but with confirmation of breeding found at only one typical breeding location in Granite City. Scissor-tailed Flycatchers once again nested in Illinois marking the 9th year (in 9 counties) since 2000 that this species has been recorded in the breeding season, and the 7th year that nests/nesting evidence have been located during that time, in six southwestern Illinois counties. Loggerhead Shrikes are now becoming harder to find in their last remaining stronghold within Illinois in the southeastern portion of the state. Will they persist through the next decade in Illinois?

Reports of Bell's Vireo seem to be on the increase, especially in far southern Illinois where this species was once rarely reported. Corvid populations in the state also appear to be on the increase, or have at least begun to increase above the low numbers being reported a few years ago as West Nile Virus first swept through the state. Cliff Swallows continue to reclaim and increase their numbers in former breeding areas in the state, although numbers in the eastern third of the state are still much lower than more western areas of the state, especially along the major river systems.

The numbers of breeding Carolina Wrens remain low outside of far southern Illinois after the severe winter weather of the last few years. Bewick's Wren was not reported this year from their usual Siloam Springs breeding location. Marsh Wrens are very rare as a breeding species outside far northeastern Illinois, so those found singing at two locations, one a large, newly restored wetland in west-central Illinois could portend a new breeding population in that area. Wet and somewhat cool temperatures limited the number of young fledging from early Eastern Bluebird

nesting efforts. Northern Parulas seem to be making small inroads into the northcentral and northeastern parts of the state where the species has rarely been reported. Outside of southern Illinois, this species has always had a rather unusual distribution in the state, not often being found in the former "Grand Prairie" regions of the state, even along major river valleys. Breeding populations of Pine Warblers continue to appear in new pine plantations in areas of the state where this species has never before bred. Have these pines matured to the point where they are now "acceptable" to use during the breeding season, or is something else going on? The singing male Tennessee Warbler in late June was a quite unusual migrant report. Likewise, a Darkeyed Junco caught in a mist net and a singing male, in late June and mid-July, respectfully, were also very unusual, and begs the question which direction were they moving? Although always a pleasant find wherever located, the increasing numbers and locations where Henslow's Sparrows are being found makes one wonder why they remain on the state threatened list when species nearly or as uncommon like Grasshopper Sparrow and other more uncommon species have not been similarly designated. Summer Tanagers, Blue Grosbeaks and Orchard Orioles continue to be found in new and/or increasing numbers of locations in central and northern areas of the state. Several new breeding pairs of Painted Buntings were found this summer near the historic breeding location of Illinois's sole breeding colony. With more search effort given in southwestern Illinois near the Mississippi River, could there be even more breeding pairs of this species than we now realize? The first Illinois nest was located for the naturalized, exotic European Goldfinch. A small, localized population of this species is beginning to grow and develop a yearound population in a few areas of the Chicagoland lakefront and occasionally elsewhere. Some have now been seen every year in at least each of the last ten years at this location. Will this become one of the newest additions to the Illinois state checklist, similar to the Monk Parakeet?

A number in parentheses () indicates the number of birds observed at a particular location or on a particular date. No number signifies single birds. Place names given in *italic type* are counties. The sequence of records within species accounts, except for maximum counts, begin in northwest Illinois (Jo Daviess, Carroll and Whiteside counties), proceed to the east, then continue back and forth across the state in a systematic pattern with the southernmost records at the end.

Transparent directionals (n.=north(ern), ne. = northeast(ern), etc.), and including c.= central, are used where applicable. Words referring to natural features are generally not abbreviated in names of residential communities (thus Forest Park, Fall Creek, Garden Prairie, etc.).

Headings for species requiring JORC (Illinois Ornithological Records Committee) review in parts of Illinois or in some plumages are underlined, while those for species requiring review of all records are CAPITALIZED AND UNDERLINED. Records pending IORC review are enclosed in square brackets []. The IORC review list can be viewed at the IOS/IORC website, http://www.illinoisbirds.org/iorc.html. Noteworthy dates and sites of occurrence and remarkably high counts for the state as a whole or for particular regions of the state are underlined and boldfaced, and some further editorial remarks are boldfaced. Four-letter alpha or bird-banding codes in capitalized letters (e.g. WODU for Wood Duck, PUMA for Purple

Martin, etc.) developed by the USGS Bird Banding Laboratory are occasionally used within the species accounts.

Remarks on the historical significance of records aim to be valid for the corpus of data published in H. David Bohlen's 1989 Birds of Illinois and the seasonal summeries in the Illinois journals Illinois Birds and Birding (summer 1984 – spring 1991) and Meadowlark (summer 1991 – present). Data from other sources may have bearing on the validity of these remarks. Species names and sequence correspond to the American Ornithologist's Union Check-List of North American Birds and its supplements through the 52nd supplement (2011). The 2003 DeLorme Illinois Atlas & Gazetteer has been used as a standard for spelling of place names for sites included therein.

Some records not printed here may still be under IORC (Illinois Ornithological Records Committee) review; when completed, they will appear in the published IORC report. As standard policy, all observers, regardless of experience, must fully document all unusual observations. Easy to use documentation forms are available from IORC Secretary, Doug Stotz, Environment and Conservation Program, Field Museum of Natural History, Roosevelt Road and Lake Shore Drive, Chicago, IL 60615. Completed documentation forms of "listed" species should be submitted to the IORC Secretary within one week of the observation.

Sandhill Cranes (Grus canadensis) have attempted nesting at Heron County Park, Vermilion County, for the past two years. This is the southernmost known breeding attempt for this species in Illinois. The 2011 clutch of two eggs produced one young; however it apparently drowned due to local flooding or got eaten by a predator. Amazingly, the area where they placed their nests in both 2010 and 2011 has seen extensive flooding both years. The breeding pair remained in the area at least into early winter - they were found on the 2011/2012 Christmas Bird Count.










