President's Message

The Illinois Spring Bird Count

Where were you on May 6, 1972? That was the first (official) Spring Bird Count here in Illinois – though a 'trial run' count had actually been conducted almost a year earlier, on May 8th, 1971. From that beginning, the SBC goal has been to get birders to cover every one of the 102 counties in our great state, counting the migrants and the returning resident breeding species.

Ably coordinated by Vern Kleen over a substantial chunk of those 40 plus years (THANKS, VERN!), doing the Spring Count has been a fixture in the lives of many members of the Illinois birding community. Karen and I participated in our first Count in 1976 here in DuPage County; I was the driver and Karen tallied as we wound our way through the streets of Downers Grove, eventually recording just under 800 birds of 36 different species. Our highlight was two Graycheeked Thrushes! Looking backward with a somewhat jaundiced eye, I wonder if they weren't (just) Swainson's.

The SBC results provide powerful statistics on population trends by species, range changes over time, and a host of other useful information on the state of the birds here in Illinois – like the impressive increase in the numbers of Cooper's Hawks as they populate the suburbs and residential areas across the state, or the explosive growth of Blue-gray Gnatcatchers (at one time a fairly rare SBC bird, especially in the northern half of Illinois, now seemingly everywhere there's suitable habitat for this diminutive woodland species). The data has also delineated the declines of three species once more common in Illinois than they are today: Ring-necked Pheasants (a victim of changes in agricultural practices, especially the elimination of hedgerows), Redheaded Woodpeckers, and Bewick's Wrens, a species disappearing from much of its range in the eastern USA.

Vern retired as statewide compiler after the 2009 SBC; Tara Beveroth, Avian Field Specialist for INHS and IOS Board member, took over for Vern in this important job, beginning in 2010. The transition has been very seamless, and the longstanding question of where and how to store the Illinois SBC database has been resolved. Implemented by Tara and her INHS colleagues, the entire database is being stored at the Midwest Avian Data Center: http://data.prbo.org/partners/mwadc/.

Stay tuned; complete public access to this 40+ year history is coming soon on the MADC website. And if you attended the recent Gull Frolic, you also heard from Tara about the other substantive change to the SBC. Beginning in 2013, two days in early May will be scheduled for the Count. It's always been a struggle to get coverage in all Illinois counties – the population center counties attract large numbers of birders, the rural counties get little, sometimes no coverage at all. By switching to the two day format, dedicated SBCers will have the opportunity to count in their home patch on one day, and then help count in an underbirded county the next! I can't wait!

Across Illinois during the fall, winter and spring of 2011/2012 observers, birders, raptor rehabilitators, scientists and the general public were amazed at the extent to which Snowy Owls irrupted into the state. Articles and photographs of Snowy Owls made front covers of Illinois newspapers (DeVore 2011), television stations ran special newscasts about the irruption, and birders were often treated to multiple sightings of Snowy Owls throughout Illinois. The huge extent of this most recent record 2011/2012 invasion of 133 sightings or detections in 34 counties in Illinois was, no doubt, bolstered by the ebird contributions of citizen scientists (in most cases experienced birders), other birding forums, the Christmas Bird Count database (a color photograph of a Snowy Owl graced the cover of the 112th CBC issue, LeBaron 2012) and the increased interest in owls bolstered by the media. The fictional Harry Potter's famous companion - Hedwig - a Snowy Owl perhaps stoked additional attention. The Snowy Owl irruption occurred – counter intuitively - in an almost snowless Illinois winter and during the third warmest winter on record according to National Weather Climatic Data (http://www.

nedc.noaa.gov/). Illinois's irruption was "just part of the iceberg," so to speak, being part of a continent wide Snowy Owl irruption, massive in scope across the North American continent west to east and as far south as Texas (Dolan 2012) and even as far flung as Honolulu, Hawaii, a first ever record for Hawaii (ebird 2012). For all of the participants who ventured out to witness this record irruption in Illinois and elsewhere – it was truly impressive. (See Figure 1 and Table 1)

The first Snowy Owl recorded in Illinois during the 2011/12 season



was an aircraft strike of a bird at O'Hare International Airport on 11 November 2011. On 19 November at Montrose beach and fishhook pier in Chicago, Cook County birders observed two Snowy Owls having flown in off Lake Michigan. Before this and through the end of fall the stage had already been set for a major irruption. In Canada in southern Ontario by mid-November Snowy Owls were showing up at many locations with 14 Snowy Owls at Nittishi Point on 9 November being a peak tally in the massive fall movement (Bain 2012), and in southern Manitoba the owls were widespread. Just to the north, multiple Snowy Owls were noted in 27 Minnesota counties, 37 Wisconsin counties and 24 Michigan counties by the end of the fall season in the Western Great Lakes region (Svingen 2012), while a large irruption in the Dakotas was well underway. To the west of our state a juvenile male Snowy Owl was noted on 7 November, which was the

Snowy Owl at Montrose, Chicago, Cook County. 7 December 2011. Photo by Robert Hughes. first of 14 Snowy Owls in Iowa, and there were four in Missouri (Wehtje 2012) during the fall period. To the east, Indiana recorded its first fall Snowy Owl in Starke County on 18 November (Hengeveld et al. 2012).

In December, it was also clear that something major was about to happen or was already happening particularly during early winter and the Christmas Bird Count period (14 Dec - 5 Jan, LeBaron 2012). In Wisconsin just to our north 32 Snowy Owls were tallied on 16 CBCs, the most ever in that state, plus there were winter season reports from 40 counties according to Kavanagh (2012). In Illinois, five counts tallied six Snowy Owls (Sweet 2012), this was in keeping with our neighbor Indiana's four CBC Snowy Owls which tied their previous all-time high (Cassady 2012). Illinois CBC Snowy Owls were all recorded in northern Illinois with four along the lakefront, and two in the interior of the state at Illini and Decatur.

CBCs aside, December and January were the months of the most number of detections or reports of Snowy Owls in the state (See Figure 3). Forty-five Snowy Owls were reported in December and 35 in January with numbers tapering down to 30 and 20 in February and March respectively. March was a record warm month and many owls by mid-March were returning north; detections went significantly down in April and May with just three and four detections for those months (who's looking for Snowy Owls when there's green grass and lawn mowers going?). Looking at the overall detection map, see (Figure 1) and the 133 reports for the state, the lakefront reports of 14 and 52 reports for Lake and Cook counties, one could challenge that many of the reports might be duplicate sightings (and possibly some were, see methodology). In Lake County, 10 reports were lake-

front sightings and four were inland; in Cook County, 34 were lakefront reports and 18 detections were inland. Sixty-nine percent of the Snowy Owl detections statewide were inland as compared witho 31 percent along the lakefront. (See Figures 4 and 5.) One can get a sense of this with the Figure 1 and the five reports at Midway Airport in Cook County, nine reports at O'Hare Airport, Cook County, five Snowy Owls noted in Champaign County; seven in Grundy County, and seven in McLean County (See Appendix.) Clearly the trend was that the Snowy Owls coming down the lakeshore moved farther south and inland. that 16.6 percent of the Snowy Owl reports during this irruption season were at airports (19.6 percent if you add old Meigs Field in Chicago, Cook County which is now Northerly Island park).

In addition, lakefront observations showed a big fall off in numbers after December. Kanae Hirabayashi, a frequent birder at Montrose's Harbor and beach along Chicago's lakefront noted on IBET (Illinois Birders Exchanging Thoughts) that after mid- January she did not see another Snowy Owl until mid-February. Lake Michigan did not freeze this winter season and many owls, being unable to hunt ducks from a frozen lakefront, seemed to just push on for better hunting grounds and food sources. From mid-January through mid-February owls seemed to have settled into wintering territories and just a month later by mid-March many were on the return north, though after this major irruption several did linger into April and mid-May.

Unlike the previous irruptions of Snowy Owls during the winters of 1991/1992 (Johnson 1992) and



1996/1997 (Johnson & Biss 1997) when most Snowy Owls were noted along Lake Michigan's lakefront this irruption was far and widespread into the interior of Illinois with individuals detected southwest to Randolph County, west to Quincy and along the Mississippi River, as far southeast as Edwards County, and as far south as Pulaski County.

Methodology

The same general methodology was used for obtaining and screening Snowy Owl observational data points as in this journal's 1997 report (Johnson and Biss). However, during this irruption many more tools were available including on-line Ebird reports, IBET (Illinois Birders Exchanging Thoughts) sightings, IBF (Illinois Birder's Forum) on-line CBC (Christmas Bird Count) data for obtaining data points for the Snowy Owl sightings acknowledged. Several hundred photographs were reviewed/

used in separating out individual sightings at Montrose, other Chicago lakefront locations, and elsewhere. IBET and IBF often provided links to photographer's websites to determine whether or not to count a new Snowy Owl record. As a caveat, however, it was nearly impossible to separate out individuals that might have been seen at a different location from each other particularly those reports in close proximity. Thus the number of Snowy Owls reported may have been the same individuals at different locations, but I suspect that far more owls went undetected particularly inland away from large population centers.




Figure 2: Snowy Owl distribution (historical occurrences)

For the historical record of distribution of Snowy Owls by counties in Illinois, the author reviewed nearly all Illinois Audubon bulletins (beginning with a 1916 bulletin), all Illinois Birds and Birding issues, and Meadowlark, a Journal of Illinois Birds issues to date (Figure 2).

Any errors of omission are the author's and, as always, updates are welcome to make the record more accurate and complete.

Significant records

The southernmost record ever for Illinois occurred during this irruption in Pulaski County 27 January - 5 February 2012 on Shawnee College Road (Rhonda Rothrock in lit.). The most southwestern record was just east of Red Bud, Randolph County from 26 January through 21 February 2012 (Susan Harbaugh in lit.). The most western record was at the Quincy airport from 15-17 January 2012 (Kara L. Knuffman fide Steve Bailey). The most southeastern sighting was in Edwards County near Bone Gap on 11 December 2011 (Bob Shelby in lit.). The first ever Spring Bird Count record for Snowy Owl also occurred when Pete Olson (in lit.) and other observers photographed a Snowy Owl near Crego Road in

Figure 1: Snowy Owl distribution (Winter 2011/2012)

DeKalb County 5 May 2012. Finally, the latest departure date for Illinois was recorded on 14 May 2012 when Kristin Ellis noted and documented (on file with IORC) a Snowy Owl along an airport taxiway at Rockford International Airport in Winnebago County (one of three detected there during this irruption).

Prey items

During this irruption period in Illinois, Snowy Owls were observed feeding on or there was food content evidence from Snowy Owl pellets for: Red-breasted Merganser (Mergus serrator), American Coot (Fulica Americana), Brown (Norway) Rat (Rattus norvegicus), Thirteenlined Ground Squirrel (Ictidomys tridecemlineatus), Meadow Vole (Microtus pennsylvanicus), Deer Mice (Peromyscus sp), and Eastern Cottontail Rabbit (Sylvagus floridanus). In addition Mallard (Anas platyrhynchos) was believed to be another prey item though not confirmed. For further information see Josh Engel's report in this journal on the Snowy Owl pellet contents from this 2011/2012 irruption.

Snowy Owls away from their breeding grounds can become very versatile feeders. During a 15-year winter study at Boston's Logan Airport Norman Smith (1997) observed Snowy Owls as very opportunistic feeders, having fed on prey items from geese, ducks, cormorants, rails, pheasant, other owls (including Snowy Owl), shorebirds (including American Oystercatcher and Upland Sandpiper), gulls, muskrat, striped skunk, fish, and even a Great Blue Heron! David Parmelee (1992) noted that John James Audubon also observed Snowy Owls eating fish at water holes.

Winter Territories

Normally without color marking or radio tracking it is nearly impossible to determine an owl's wintering territory. However, during this irruption two Snowy Owls were able to be tracked largely due to the owls



being the only individuals in their respective counties. In Coles County, Ron Bradley (in lit.) over the course of eight weeks (2 January through 24 February) was able to determine that a male Snowy Owl (nearly pure white) ranged over nine miles of hunting territory near Mattoon, Illinois. In McHenry County, Jim Kriss and Karen Lund (pers. comm.) determined that a Snowy Owl ranged over five miles from Huntley to near Union, Illinois over a period of 13 weeks (19 February through 11 May 2012).

Mortality and Casualties

There was a 6 percent, or eight, known fatalities during this irruption: two of these were road kills from vehicle collisions, two were kills from aircraft strikes, three from starvation and another from starvation and poisoning. Linda Breuer, director of Barnswallow, a wildlife rehabilitation center near Wauconda, recovered an owl in Lindenhurst, Lake County on 30 November 2011, in an open suburban neighborhood with dogs, playgrounds and fences. The owl had apparently been in the area for nearly three weeks amusing families and dogs until someone became really concerned and called Breuer. The

owl was infested with feather lice and suffered from emaciation, being less than 50 percent its estimated, normal body weight, and suffering from advanced rodenticide poisoning. Despite critical supportive care, the owl died after two and 1/2 days (Breuer in lit.). One of the aircraft strikes resulted in a banded specimen found by the operations personnel at Rockford International Airport, Winnebago County, on 23 March 2012 found 20 feet off the runway after being struck by the lower left flap of an aircraft wing (FAA Wildlife Strike Database, http://wildlife-mitigation.tc.faa.gov/wildlife/default. aspx). Daniel and Barbara Williams (in lit.) were involved in the recovery of this female specimen which was hatched prior to 2011; it will eventually be housed in the Field Museum of Natural History, Chicago, Cook Co. The owl was banded by Travis Guerrant of Addison, Illinois, in Boone County on 21 March 2012, two days prior to its demise, not too far from the Rockford Airport. Another mortality was of an owl identified by its remains found in the right landing gear and specimen evidence off a runway after an aircraft strike, the first to occur during the irruption at O'Hare International airport on 11 November 2011.

Remarkable Rescues and Rehabilitations

Perhaps the most amazing Snowy Owl story (Mistretta 2012, LuAnn LaSusa, & Karen Lund, in litt.) during this irruption in Illinois occurred when at night on 30 November 2011 a Snowy Owl, perhaps hunting or startled, flew up and collided with a vehicle and was literally pinned to the grill of a SUV Ford Escape going nearly 55 mph near Hampshire on an open country road (Melms Road) in Kane County. Unknown to the driver

until the vehicle was stopped and, after driving several miles, the driver then found a huge white owl pinned by its talons to the front grill of his car and wing flapping against the hood. Such encounters occur often with cars and owls. This usually results in the demise of the owl either flattened in the road or roadside by the same or other vehicles, but, such was not to be the case with this Snowy Owl's encounter with a vehicle. While at the driver's place of employment, local police were notified, and officer, Pete Velez, captured the owl when she became dislodged from the grill by herself, then transported the owl to Willowbrook Wildlife Center, in Glen Ellyn, for rehabilitation. The immature female owl suffered from head trauma, a fractured clavicle and two fractured ribs all on the owl's left side where it had made contact with the vehicle. LuAnn LaSusa from Willowbrook who provided much of the owl's care noted that the owl ate on the first day of care, which was rather unusual. After nearly two months of extensive care and rehabilitation including flight exercises, the immature female owl was successfully released back into the wild at Pratt's Wayne Forest Preserve in DuPage County on 23 January 2012.

Another Snowy Owl that probably was struck by a vehicle occurred near Tolono in Champaign County (Pressey 2012) in early January when observers noticed the owl had not moved much while sitting out in a corn stubble field. The owl, extremely weakened and starving, was rescued on 3 January 2012 and was taken to the University of Illinois Wildlife Medical Clinic. Named Qigiq for a "white hawk that flies in the sky," from Inuit Eskimo culture, the young male owl suffered a broken left wing



that required extensive surgery of the humerus bone. Dr. Julia Whittington performed the surgery that repaired the owl's broken wing. Anne Rivas (2012), a veterinary student and the wildlife clinic's co-manager, and Kim Knap of the University of Illinois Veterinary Teaching Hospital were successful in restoring the bird's wing extension critical for flight after intensive care. The clinic decided that it would be in the owl's best interest to be flown at the end of March to Sitka, Alaska for flight training at the Alaska Raptor Center where chances for the owl's survival would be much higher. Unfortunately, this owl could not fly despite the surgeries, but does remain at the Alaska Raptor Center and is a popular bird as a visitor to children's classrooms as a tool to develop nature appreciation and conservation (Debbie Reeder pers. comm.).

Close Encounters of the Raptor Kind

Certainly one of the most dramatic and photographically documented encounters with another bird of prey during this irruption occurred at Northerly Island on 29 January 2012. The entire Peregrine Falcon vs. Snowy Owl attack was captured on film by photographer Rick Remington. Remington's series of photos and account of the event were posted on North American Birding website (Neise 2012) and within a day the site went viral and because of so

many hits the website had to be closed down and transferred to another provider. This amazing photographic series noted the falcon would attack and the owl would crouch down in a defense posture and get ready to lunge back at the falcon or spread its wings as a threat display. The owl performed a somersault just as the peregrine approached and openly displayed its large talons in an attempt to scare off the falcon. This threatening encounter lasted for five full minutes before the falcon flew off and the Snowy Owl flew down to the rocks at the edge of Lake Michigan. Remington stated, "It was a surprisingly violent and noisy encounter, with both birds shrieking loudly and the owl extending its giant wings to intimidate the smaller falcon. I fully expected this to end badly for the owl based on what I was watching. In spite of the obvious mismatch, the Snowy Owl managed to hold its own and escape unscathed." The Peregrine was one of the local breeding birds and was likely defending its hunting territory. Very similar encounters between these two species, as well as with wintering Gyrfalcons, have been witnessed by others in northeastern Minnesota (Evans 2000), in New England (see Forbush 1927), near Barrow, Alaska (Pitelka et al. 1955), and on Baffin Island (Sutton and Parmalee 1955), and usually also involved the falcons attacking the Snowy Owl, often to a stand-off but also included the Snowy

Owls chasing and killing a Peregrine and being killed by a Peregrine.

Another photographic encounter with a bird of prey occurred when a Northern Harrier was observed and photographed harassing a Snowy Owl on the ground in central Illinois, see photograph.

Historical detection distribution map by counties in Illinois

Snowy Owls have occurred historically in 73 counties in Illinois (Figure 2.) Nearly all the distribution has been in the top two-thirds of the state. Only one county in northern Illinois has not recorded a Snowy Owl: that is Putnam County. In central Illinois, six counties have not recorded a Snowy Owl: Cass, Scott, Greene, Macoupin, Shelby and Edgar, nearly all in the bottom tier of central Illinois. In southern Illinois, 22 counties have never recorded a Snowy Owl and distribution has been splotchy with Wabash County being the southeasternmost, Randolph County the south-westernmost, and Union and Pulaski counties being the southernmost counties with records.

Historical irruptions in Illinois

According to Bohlen (1989) known irruptions of Snowy Owls have occurred during the years of 1876-77, 1882-83, 1889-90, 1892-93, 1896-97, 1901-02, 1905-06, 1909-10, 1917-18, 1926-27, 1930-31, 1949-50, 1974-75, 1976-77, 1978-79, 1980-81, 1991-92 (Johnson 1992), 1996-97 (Johnson 1997), and 2011-12. Bohlen (1989) also lists other possible irruptions during the years of 1967-68 and 1987-88. Angelo Capparella (pers. comm.) suggests that there may have been another invasion year in Illinois during 1867-1868 based on a mount specimen from Lee Co. (ISU specimen #234).

Other Midwest state's irruptions

Additionally many Midwest states achieved record Snowy Owl irruptions during the period 2011/2012.

Indiana tallied a record 50 Snowy Owls from 18 November 2011 through 12 May 2012 (Ken Brock in lit.). Nebraska had reports of 200 sightings with at least 159 of those verified (David Heidt, Joel Jorgensen in lit.). Kansas had a record 160 observations and Missouri tallied approximately a record 60 sightings from 22 November 2011 through 6 March 2012 (Mark Robbins, Joshua Uffman in lit.). One observer in N. Dakota alone had 101 observations of Snowy Owls and there were at least 153 observations statewide from 10 November 2011 through 4 May 2012 (Corey Ellingson in lit.). There were 193 sightings in South Dakota from 1 November 2011 through 7 May 2012 (Jeffrey Palmer, Michael Melius in lit.). Michigan tallied approximately 200 sightings with the first arrival on 11 November 2011 in the Upper Peninsula (Skye Hass in lit.). Minnesota had 337 reports from 4 October 2011 through 8 July 2012 though many were duplicates and the final tally was estimated at 217 birds (Anthony Hertzel 2012). Like Minnesota, Wisconsin estimated their total to be between 150-200 individuals from 10 November 2011 through 7 June 2012 (Ryan Brady in lit.) and like Minnesota there was a problematic issue of distilling down of duplicate individuals from ebird and other listing sites. Iowa recorded 154 owls, their second largest documented irruption, from 7 November 2011 to 10 March 2012 (Stephen Dinsmore in lit.). Ohio recorded 23 owls from 28 November 2011 through 8 April 2012 (Craig Caldwell in lit.) and surprisingly just to the south of Illinois, Kentucky reported none (Brainard Palmer-Ball, Jr. in lit.).



Snowy Owls (*Bubo scandiacus*) staged a record irruption during the winter of 2011-2012. With Snowy Owls seen throughout the state, several people were able to procure regurgitated pellets. Pellets consist of undigested parts of a bird's prey, often comprising fur, feathers, exoskeletons and bones. Pellet contents have long been used to assess the diets of owls, which due to their nocturnal habits can be very difficult to do through observations (e.g. Cahn and Kemp 1930).

I received a small series of pellets from the irruption from the Chicago lakefront (six pellets, thanks to Jennifer Duncan, Steve Spitzer, and Jerry Goldner) and from Coles County in east-central Illinois (two pellets, thanks to Ronald Bradley), which I analyzed for their contents. A similar study conducted at Horicon Marsh, Wisconsin, during the 1960-61 Snowy Owl irruption, found that among five individuals, 73% of pellets


contained meadow voles (*Microtus* pennsylvanicus), 30% contained muskrat (*Ondatra zibethicus*), and 23% contained duck parts (Keith 1963).

Identifications of the rodents were made based on the molars found in the pellets using Hoffmeister (1989) and the Field Museum mammal collection as references. Three prey species were found in the lakefront pellets. One pellet - from Montrose Beach contained the skulls of two brown rats (Rattus norvegicus). Among five pellets collected between Northerly Island and 41 st St. were eight meadow voles, two unidentified Microtus voles, and one American Coot (Fulica americana). The two pellets from Coles County contained no fewer than nine individual Peromyscus mice.

This study reveals just a small sample of the varied diet of Snowy Owls in Illinois during the 2011-2012 irruption. Other prey items, including easterncottontail (Sylvagus floridanus) and Red-breasted Merganser (Mergus serrator), were also reported. A study of a similar number of Snowy Owl pellets from coastal Washington during the same time period revealed a diet consisting entirely of birds, including Sanderling (Calidris alba), Horned Grebe (Podiceps auritus), and Bufflehead (Bucephala albeola) (Paulson 2012).




















The 2011/2012 Christmas Bird Count

After the cold counts Illinois birders had to contend with the last two years, an early cold snap in late November and early December must have seemed ominous. However, things warmed up nicely, and only 6 counts failed to reach the freezing mark. Surprisingly, the coldest count for the state turned out to be Lake Shelbyville, which only reached 28 degrees F on count day. On the other hand, 8 counts exceeded 50, and 15 recorded low temperatures above freezing. Needless to say, running water was open on all counts, with only 4 reporting any freezing, and only 3 counts reporting still water as completely frozen. Only 10 counts reported any snow fall, with a maximum of 3 inches at Carlyle. To counter this, 28 counts reported winds of at least 15 mph, with 16 counts dealing with winds of at least 20, and 4 reporting winds of at least 40 mph. Illini State Park reported peak winds of 48 mph. The count also followed an epic fall for western vagrants in the Midwest, so the total count of 176 species seen on count day (with 4 more count week birds) should be no surprise.

Overall, 65 counts reported this year, with 1,122 observers contributing 3467.75 party hours. Despite more observers, this was fewer party hours than last year, possibly because of the high winds so many counts had. An additional 190 feeder observers contributed 416 hours. As always, Fermilab had the most observers with 138, while Quincy reported the most feeder-watchers with 22. Three counts reached 100 species, with Union County at the top with 107. Illinois' first CBC Mountain Bluebird was at Collinsville. Other notable finds included Pacific Loon, Prairie Falcon, and Spotted Sandpiper at Clinton Lake; Lesser Yellowlegs and Dunlin at Meredosia; a California Gull at Chicago Lakefront, a Rufous Hummingbird at Chicago Urban; a Cape May Warbler at Chautauqua; and a Henslow's Sparrow photographed at Evanston.



Ducks through Herons

Greater White-fronted Goose numbers were an impressive 208 percent above the 10-year average, Snow Goose were 77 percent above, and Ross's Goose numbers were up 22 percent. Only Cackling Goose had a below-average year. Cypress Creek's 15,216 Greater White-fronted Geese alone were more than the 10-year average. Even with the impressive goose showing, this year might well be termed the year of the swan – 419 swans were reported, including 181 Mute Swans on 18 counts, 781 Tundra Swans on 11 counts (including 722 at Clinton, IA), and a record 251 Trumpeter Swans, led by Union County with 63. Most dabbling duck numbers were higher than last year, with Cypress Creek reporting impressive totals of Gadwall (1639), Northern Shoveler (1471), and Northern Pintail (2149). Clinton, IA had 6,540 Canvasback. Pere Marquette's 2,500 Ring-necked Ducks led an impressive 8450 state total, while all three scoters were reported, including lone Surf Scoters at Bloomington, Calumet, and Davenport, 8 White-winged at Waukegan, and a lone Black at Barrington. Only 1 Long-tailed Duck was reported (at Evanston). Peoria reported 880 Ruddy Ducks, leading a state total of 4,028.

Ring-necked Pheasant numbers were down drastically from last year, with only 163 reported on 25 counts, and Newton only reported 11 Greater Prairie-Chickens this year. Wild Turkeys were only slightly below last year, but only 107 Northern Bobwhite were reported on 14 counts. This is the lowest total for the species since 1941.

In addition to the Pacific Loon at Clinton Lake, lone Red-throated Loons were reported at Chicago Lakefront, Carlyle (count week), and Springfield (count week). Chicago Lakefront also had a Red-necked Grebe, while Springfield reported a count-week Eared Grebe and Carlyle had a count-week Western Grebe. Seventy-six American White Pelicans were reported on 9 counts, with a high of 56 at Muscatine. Mermet Lake had the only Great Egret, and Calumet City had 10 of the 17 Black-crowned Night-Herons reported.

Raptors through Gulls

A Turkey Vulture was still present at Schapville in Northern Illinois. Bald Eagles were down slightly from last year, likely because of the lack of ice. Four counts reported lone Golden Eagles, and 12 reported Merlin. Clinton Lake had a Prairie Falcon. A Virginia Rail was at Lisle Arboretum, while Union County reported 3 Virginia Rails and a Sora. One-thousand-eight-hundred-sixteen (1,816) Sandhill Cranes were reported on 11 counts, including 1,367 at Lisle Arboretum.

Shorebirds were very well represented, with 77 Wilson's Snipe on 13 counts, 3 American Woodcock at Mermet Lake, a Spotted Sandpiper at Clinton Lake, and lone Lesser Yellowlegs and Dunlin at Meredosia. A California Gull was reported for the second year in a row, this time on Chicago Lakefront. Eight counts reported a total of 16 Thayer's Gulls, 9 counts reported Lesser Blackbacked Gulls, 6 reported Glaucous Gulls, and Calumet City reported the only 2 Great Black-backed Gulls.

Four-hundred-thirteen (413) Eurasian Collared-Doves were reported on 33 counts, a total only surpassed two years ago. Lone Barn Owls were at Carlyle and Warbluff Valley. Five counts reported Snowy Owls, including 2 at Chicago Lakefront, part of a truly impressive invasion year. Long-eared Owls were reported on 13 counts, and 20 Northern Saw-whet Owls were reported on 9 counts, including 8 at Lisle Arboretum. A female Rufous Hummingbird was still present on the Chicago Urban – the 5th in state CBC history.

Flycatchers through Weaver Finches

36 Eastern Phoebes were seen on 11 counts this year, including 1 at Chicago Urban and 2 at Barrington. Loggerhead Shrikes were up as well, with 12 on 9 counts, compared to 6 on 3 counts in 2010. Northern Shrikes were also up, with 45 seen on 19 counts, including 11 at Fermilab. One count-week White-eyed Vireo was spotted at Carlyle. A record 334,685 American Crows were counted, one of 8 species to be recorded in every count circle. The 238,000 reported at Middlefork River Valley were more than the entire state finds in most years. Two counts reported Fish Crows, with 6 at Union County.

Kankakee Valley had a lingering count-week Northern Rough-winged Swallow and Rend Lake had a Barn Swallow. Four counts reported House Wrens, 3 reported Sedge Wrens, and 4 reported Marsh Wrens. As mentioned, a Mountain Bluebird was still present at Collinsville. Five Gray Catbirds were reported on 3 counts. Brown Thrashers were reported on 16 counts.

Warblers were present in surprising numbers, including 3 Orange-crowned on 2 counts, a Cape May photographed at Chautauqua, 9 Pine Warblers on 5 counts, 2 Palm Warblers at Lisle Arboretum and one at Davenport, and lone Common Yellowthroats on 2 counts.

A Henslow's Sparrow was photographed at Evanston. Five counts reported Lincoln's Sparrows. Three counts reported solo Indigo Buntings, and Mermet Lake reported two Dickcissels. Union County reported 20 Western Meadowlarks. Twenty Brewer's Blackbirds were reported on six counts, led by the 11 at Collinsville. Thirty-eight (38) Red Crossbills were reported on six counts, with Union County in far southern Illinois reporting 22. Only two counts reported White-winged Crossbills. Only 9 counts reported Common Redpolls. The last two species moved into the area in numbers in January. Pine Siskins actually exceeded last year's total with 1070 reported on 30 counts. Only 2 counts reported Evening Grosbeaks, although Thorn Creek had a flock of 15. Eurasian Tree Sparrows were reported from 19 counts this year.



Field Notes: The 2011-2012 Winter Season

Overall, the weather in Illinois during the 2011-2012 winter season was noticeably milder (i.e. longer periods of warmer temperatures and lesser amounts of precipitation), as compared to the previous three winters. Throughout the entire winter temperatures fluctuated widely, but the majority of the season experienced normal to considerably above normal periods. By comparison, only brief episodes of slightly to well below normal temperatures occurred. Statewide temperatures never dipped below 0, and a wind chill of 0 to -5 degrees in mid-January was the coldest of the season. Reduced amounts of precipitation fell across Illinois during fairly frequent minor and major winter storm events this season. In total, 14 noteworthy winter storms traveled across all or a portion of the state during 2011-2012. These storms produced rain, freezing rain, and/or snow depending on the current temperatures.

Throughout December, temperatures across the state ranged from moderately below to considerably above normal, with the majority of the month being warmer than usual. A number of major and minor storms moved through the state during December. Temperatures in January ranged from well below to considerably above normal. However, most of the month was warmer than what typically occurs, with the exception of mid-January which produced the coldest temperatures of the season. January was also a fairly active month in terms of storm events. Another strong wind storm (20-30 mph), moved through Illinois on 1 January but produced very little precipitation. On 12 and 13 January, a powerful winter storm dropped 4-8 inches of snow in the northern portion of the state, 2-4 inches in the central region, and even 1-2 inches of snow through the south. This storm was accompanied by strong winds (20-30 mph), which produced the coldest wind chills of the season (0 to -5 degrees). Temperatures in February ranged from moderately below to considerably above normal. However, as with the two previous months, February was overall much warmer than usual. A strong winter storm dropped 4-8 inches of snow in the northern 1/3, light to moderate rain and freezing rain in the central 1/3, and light rain in the southern 1/3 of the state on 23 February. The winter season ended on 28 February with a very strong storm which produced moderate to heavy rainfall across the entire state, including several strong thunderstorms and tornados throughout the south.

During the winter of 2011-2012, a substantially diverse avian community (193 species) was observed within Illinois. This community included most of the "expected" wintering birds, along with a noteworthy variety of lingering migrants and "semi-hardy" species. Additionally, many birds which are typically present only in the southern region of the state were also recorded this winter. Furthermore, a considerable number of uncommon and accidental species were also documented throughout the

state. By the end of the winter season, early spring migration had noticeably commenced within Illinois.

Once again, the avian community observed this winter was substantially diverse with 193 species identified throughout the state. This community was even higher than the high diversity reported during the previous three winters (182, 185, and 189, respectively). Consequently, Illinois again played host to a notable wintering avian community. Overall, the majority of species composing the wintering avifaunal community were observed in greater abundance during the 2011-2012 winter season, as compared to last winter. During the 2011-2012 winter season, many species groups were reported in greater abundance. These groups included: waterfowl (both puddle and diving ducks), "waterbirds," permanentresidents, "semi-hardy species," woodpeckers, shrikes, mimic thrushes, sparrows, blackbirds, and finches.

The avian community this winter included many exceptional vagrant and lingering/wintering species. These included Brant, Barrow's Goldeneye, Western Grebe, Prairie Falcon, Little Gull, Mew Gull, Rufous Hummingbird, and Mountain Bluebird), which required review by the Illinois Ornithological Records Committee (IORC) before they could be accepted. Several additional species were noted requiring IORC review within the state due to rarity or season of occurrence. Among these, some of the more interesting species included: Harlequin Duck, Pacific Loon, Spotted Sandpiper, Purple Sandpiper, Greater & Lesser Yellowlegs, Least Sandpiper, Dunlin, California Gull, Barn Owl, Fish Crow, White-eyed Vireo, Tree Swallow, No. Roughwinged Swallow, Barn Swallow, Gray Catbird, Orange-crowned Warbler, Cape May Warbler, Black-throated Blue Warbler, Spotted Towhee, Chipping Sparrow, Vesper Sparrow, Lincoln's Sparrow, Harris's Sparrow, Indigo Bunting, Scarlet Tanager, Dickcissel, and Baltimore Oriole. The Whooping Crane was the only exotic/released species observed within Illinois this winter.

Waterfowl to Vultures

Overall, 35 species of waterfowl were reported in Illinois during the 2011-2012 winter season. The majority of waterfowl species, including both "puddle" and "diving ducks," were more plentiful this winter. Goose populations appeared to be more abundant this season at traditional central and southern wintering locations. Additionally, Snow Goose populations were elevated throughout central and southern portions of the state. While Mute Swans were somewhat less numerous this winter, Trumpeter and Tundra Swans were much more abundant. The northward migration began in earnest with geese in mid-February. Overall, both "puddle" and "diving ducks" were reported in greater numbers this year. Although various species were more abundant

this winter at traditional central and southern concentration sites, numbers were still considerably reduced as compared to populations in the fairly recent past.

Once again, four species of upland gamebirds were recorded in Illinois during the 2011-2012 winter season. Northern Bobwhite and Ring-necked Pheasant numbers continued to decline statewide. The Gray Partridge, once again, failed to be encountered this winter, suggesting that this bird has been extirpated from Illinois.

During this winter, observers identified three toon, four grebe, three heron, and both vulture species within the state. The majority of these "waterbird" species occurred in greater abundance, with the exception of the American White Pelican and Black Vulture which were less numerous, and the Great Blue Heron which was reported in numbers similar to last winter.

Diurnal Raptors to Gulls

During the 2011-2012 winter season, 13 species of diurnal raptors were recorded throughout the state. Most raptor species were reported in numbers very similar to last winter, though it is worth noting, that the wintering Bald Eagle population within Illinois has been considerably lower over the past several years. There were no exceptional concentrations of raptors encountered this winter.

Once again, two species of rail were calling in a small marsh in southern Illinois and this family should be looked for in all parts of Illinois in the winter, including far northern Illinois. American Coots and Sandhill Cranes were considerably more abundant and widespread this year statewide. Southbound cranes were noted in large numbers in several Chicagoland and even downstate areas in mid-December but straggling flocks continued into early January. However, large flocks of returning "spring" migrants poured through the Chicagoland area in mid February, with good numbers of cranes present in Illinois throughout the entire winter season!

This winter Illinois hosted eight shorebird species. Of these, Killdeer were substantially more numerous and widespread, while the Wilson's Snipe decreased in overall abundance and distribution. Once again, the Lake Michigan shoreline hosted a Purple Sandpiper. The American Woodcock was almost entirely restricted to returning early spring migrants in February, in numbers similar to the previous winter. Like a number of other species responding to the warming effects of global climate change in our area, birds of this family are lingering longer (especially in southern Illinois) and returning earlier, all within what is considered the "winter" season. Overall, 13 species of gulls were reported this season statewide. Noteworthy concentrations and a diversity of wintering gulls were found at Carlyle Lake.

Pigeons to Kinglets

Monk Parakeets continue to exhibit a declining population trend in Illinois, with few reports from the Chicagoland area.

Eight owl species were recorded in Illinois this winter (all in one day by one group of birders! See article this issue). The entire Midwest region experienced a major invasion, including record numbers here in Illinois of Snowy Owls (See Dave Johnson's article in this issue). Among the rest of the wintering owl community, Great Horned, Long-eared, and Northern Sawwhet Owls were more abundant, while Short-eared Owls were less plentiful. Two Rufous Hummingbirds were once again well-

documented this winter, with the help of noted hummingbird bander Vern Kleen.

Of the usual seven woodpecker species found in Illinois, the Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, was present in similar numbers to the previous winter, while all of the other woodpeckers were reported in greater abundance this year. As has become a regular occurrence in winter, a number of Eastern Phoebes were scattered throughout southern Illinois. There were good numbers of both shrike species this winter, though all but one Loggerhead were located mostly in southeastern Illinois.

Nearly all of the small, common, winter and year-around resident species (i.e. chickadees, Tufted Titmice, nuthatches, Brown Creepers, kinglets and wrens) were more abundant statewide in 2011-2012. Only the Red-breasted Nuthatch was less plentiful as it was a "non-invasion" winter for that species. Nevertheless, there were no exceptional concentrations of any of the above species observed. However, once again there were five species of wren detected in Illinois this winter, including House Wrens detected at four locations.

Thrushes to Buntings

Four species of thrushes and three species of mimids were identified throughout the state. The American Robin was considerably less numerous statewide. Remarkably, one female Mountain Bluebird spent most of the winter and was observed by many birders. There were no exceptional concentrations of American Pipits or Cedar Waxwings this winter, although American Pipits have become a regular component of at least the early winter birding community in Illinois just within the last decade or so.

An amazing seven species of warblers were reported in Illinois this winter including nine Orange-crowneds at seven locations (!), with Yellow-rumped Warblers more abundant and widely distributed. Three of the remaining species were all noteworthy in terms of their winter occurrence in Illinois, as Common Yellowthroat and Pine Warbler are regular winter residents in small numbers, at least in far southern Illinois. See the article this issue on the very cooperative Black-throated Blue Warbler which spent many days in early winter in Chicago feeding at Yellow-bellied Sapsucker sap wells.

A Scarlet Tanager was well documented with photos, and was noted coming to a feeder for black oil sunflower seeds, for Illinois's first winter record of this species. Illinois produced 16 species of sparrows during the 2011-2012 winter season. While fewer numbers of American Tree, Chipping, and Savannah Sparrows were reported, all other sparrows were present in greater numbers. Although the number of Chipping Sparrows decreased this year, the species appears to be establishing itself as a regular wintering bird within the state. LeConte's Sparrows are also now a regular wintering species, at least locally, in many southern Illinois and some central Illinois fields, especially in fields with a large amount of foxtail (Setaria sp.) grasses. Lapland Longspur and Northern Cardinal numbers increased this season, while Snow Buntings and Dark-eyed Juncos declined.

Blackbirds to Weaver Finches

Of the eight species of blackbirds observed in Illinois in winter 2011-2012, the majority of the species were more abundant this winter The exception was the Eastern Meadowlark and Brewer's Blackbird which were less numerous. Once again, icterid numbers at traditional southern wintering locations were reported in lower abundance although several notable

concentrations were still encountered there. Two Baltimore Orioles were well-documented with photos.

A total of eight finch species were observed in Illinois this winter. The winter 2011-2012 season produced a pretty significant invasion of both crossbills, Pine Siskin and Common Redpolls mainly in northern Illinois but at least small numbers of all four species were found south into central Illinois as well. A single Evening Grosbeak was also located. Eurasian Tree Sparrows were found in good numbers this winter, including one bird which spent much of February in a Cook County yard for many to view.

The Changing Illinois winter bird community

The shorter and warmer Illinois winters brought about by global climate change are quickly bringing about marked changes to the Illinois winter bird community and its dynamics. It has already been shown that migrants travelling overshortor medium distances arrive earlier and stay longer in their breeding areas. And for the most part, these are the species for which the most noticeable changes in the Illinois wintering bird community are occurring. For instance, as recently as the winters of 1989-1991, Canada Goose numbers in the heavily hunted southern Illinois quota zone were counted by aerial censuses and their numbers ranged between 565,000 and 871,000, with 3 or 4 southern Illinois "goose" refuges annually attracting 150-250, 000 or more Canada Geese at each refuge every winter. During those years and earlier, a flock of 10-25 Snow Geese was something to get excited about anywhere in Illinois, and even a single Greater White-fronted Goose or Ross's Goose was unheard of, even in the big southern Illinois goose flocks, and always needed to be documented. Flash-forward to the past several years on those same southern Illinois "goose" refuges. Highest tallies for Canada Geese now come from central and northern Illinois, and those counts only range between 1,500-5,000, with counts on two of the three big southern Illinois goose refuges having only tallied between 500-1,200 birds on two of the refuges the last few years. Contrast that with Snow Goose and Greater Whitefronted Goose numbers, which now far outnumber the Canada Goose flocks, with several areas harboring 50,000-100,000 Snow Geese (as far north as Springfield and Lake Chautauqua), and as many as 5-10,000 Greater White-fronted Geese in several areas. Counts of 10-25 Ross's Geese are not uncommon for those willing to sort through the huge Snow Goose flocks. Most of the large Canada Goose numbers are now wintering northward at Horicon National Wildlife Refuge and other areas in Wisconsin and points farther north.

On the flip-side, the 2011-2012 winter season saw the largest numbers of wintering Tundra and Trumpeter Swans likely yet reported for an Illinois winter...a good sign for the Midwest's rebounding, re-introduced Trumpeter Swan population. Migrating south(east) bound Tundra Swans in mid-December and even into January, almost met the returning northbound flocks of early to mid-February, and like today's Illinois Sandhill Crane migrants, made it hard to tell if the birds were coming or going... or maybe some were actually even wintering. Three species of wintering swans have become the norm at the Channahon Widewaters area in Will County. Speaking of those cranes, good numbers of that species were detected in each month of the winter season, with birds flying southbound in December and January as well as northbound in January and February. In fact, some Sandhill Cranes fitted with radio-

transmitters for a study being conducted in northeastern Illinois have shown that several of the birds were flying back and forth between northeast Illinois and the main eastern staging area for cranes in northwestern Indiana, 4 or 5 times in fall/winter "migration"! Large numbers of cranes (including Whooping Cranes!) are now wintering in northwest Indiana, instead of continuing on to their more normal wintering areas in Florida and the Gulf Coast states.

Concerning raptors, Golden Eagles appear to be forming a regular wintering area in central/southern Wisconsin and northwestern Illinois, to the extent that the National Fish & Wildlife Service is beginning to conduct a winter aerial survey of their numbers. Historically most Illinois winter Golden Eagle records usually came from the same refuges in far southern Illinois that attracted the large numbers of geese on which they feed. Although they are still often found there, in recent years up to at least a half dozen or more of these eagles are getting detected in other areas of Illinois, especially in northwest Illinois during the winter. Winter records of Merlin have increased fairly dramatically within the last 20-25 years or so as well. The winter 1991-1992 Merlin account in the Illinois birding journal Illinois Birds & Birding read "first confirmed overwintering Merlins in state history" (4 records, w/3 in northern IL). All winter records prior to this were asked to be "thoroughly documented". Bohlen (1989) referred to both Golden Eagle and Merlin as "rare winter residents", with rare defined as occurring only "once or twice a year, and some years not at all". Most of the earlier Illinois bird journals for the 1980's and early 1990's listed 2-5 Merlin sightings per winter, occasionally fewer. The Meadowlark: A Journal of Illinois Birds, lists between 10-18 Merlin sightings most winters for about the last ten years...quite a jump in numbers for such a short time period since they were formerly considered rare. Interestingly, this same phenomena has been detected in other surrounding Midwestern states, as well as the fact that a large number of wintering Merlins in each state are detected at cemeteries, both in Illinois and in other Midwestern states. This is not due to the Merlin's sudden preference for cemetery head stones but likely due to the presence of the large, old conifers found in many cemeteries, which they can roost in...trees which they are known to use as roosting sites (Sodhi et al. 1993). Their winter range has also generally been spreading northward the past thirty years, and their breeding range southward (Sodhi et al. 1993).

Other species which are showing changes in their wintering status within Illinois (all either beginning to overwinter, linger into winter longer, occur in winter more than formerly or increasing in population or more northerly distribution during winter) in the last few decades include Red-throated Loon, American White Pelican, Turkey Vulture, various shorebirds (especially American Woodcock), Forster's Tern, Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, Eastern Phoebe, Northern Shrike, Barn, Tree and No. Rough-winged Swallows, Hermit Thrush, American Robin, American Pipit, Yellow-rumped and Pine Warblers, Chipping, Savannah and LeConte's Sparrows, and all blackbird species. Bohlen (1989) states for Red-throated Loon, "no recent winter records and few old ones", though small numbers of these birds have either wintered or lingered into early/mid-December since at least the 2006/2007 winter season along the Lake Michigan shoreline, as well as at a few large, downstate reservoirs. All of the above species present their own interesting stories, but somewhere within that story, the warming Illinois winter temperatures play a role. These relatively recent trends can easily be noted, either by those that have been birding long and attentively enough or by those willing to scour through Illinois's ornithological history in the various Illinois ornithological journals or state and regional monographs concerned with Illinois's birds. Other interesting changes that are possibly on the horizon include: are Illinois's wintering numbers of Common Goldeneyes and Common Mergansers becoming fewer as warming temperatures allow many to winter farther north? And speaking of more northerly range changes, how much farther north and east will the Eurasian Tree Sparrow spread ...in or beyond Illinois's borders? Bohlen (1989) gives Sangamon and Christian Counties as this species easternmost range in the state, and lists Hampton as a vagrant location where today many dozens can regularly be tallied in a visit. The former northern extent was the Peoria area in the late 1980's but birds of this species can now regularly be found in numbers quite a distance north into Whiteside, Ogle, Stark, Putnam, Woodford and McLean Counties. This species has dramatically declined if anything in its former stronghold in the Greater St. Louis area, and has not expanded its range any farther south. Will Ring-necked Pheasants survive to occur in Illinois if a few more severe winter storms occur or grassland habitat loss continues? Will Turkey Vulture winter roosts spread from their mostly southern Illinois locations and begin appearing in northern Illinois as winter snows decline or change mainly to rain? Will birds as diverse as American Woodcock and Chipping Sparrow become regular Illinois winter residents throughout Illinois in the next decade? Stay tuned...




